Title	INSPECTION OF STUDENT LOCKERS, DESKS AND STUDENT VEHICLES PARKED ON SCHOOL PROPERTY

It is the obligation of the Board to provide lockers, desks and other storage areas on school property for student use in storing supplies and personal items necessary for use at school. The temporary assignment of storage areas to students does not diminish the school's ownership or control of such property.

When economically and logistically feasible, it is the desire of the Board to provide parking facilities on school premises for enrolled students. Students desiring to use school parking facilities must register their vehicle with the school principal.

It shall be the policy of the Board that any locker, desk, any other storage area assigned to a student for school purposes, or vehicle parked on Board property shall not be used to store any item which falls into any of the following categories.

A. Any item forbidden by State law, Board policy, and/or administrative regulation.

- B. Any item deemed to be a health hazard to others.
- C. Any item which will cause or can reasonably be foreseen to cause an interference with school purposes or an educational function.

Principals, as representatives of the Board, have the authority and responsibility to inspect storage areas assigned to students for school purposes whenever it is deemed necessary to ensure that storage areas are not being use for purposes in violation of this policy.

When a principal has reasonable grounds to suspect that a student's vehicle, parked on school property. is being used for purposes in violation of this policy, and the student refuses to consent to a reasonable inspection of the vehicle, the principal shall have the authority and the responsibility to revoke the student's parking privilege, or have the vehicle removed from Board property if the student has not been granted parking privileges.

The Executive Director, CEO shall issue the necessary regulations and guidelines to give principals direction in implementing this policy.
