We look forward to even more students receiving this award at the conclusion of trimester 2! Congratulations to all our Outstanding

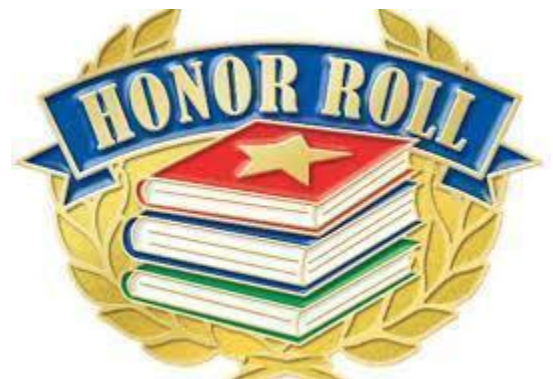

In celebration of Earth Day 2021, members of our National Green Schools Society, along with some of our High School staff, have done some planting right outside of Door A at the High School!

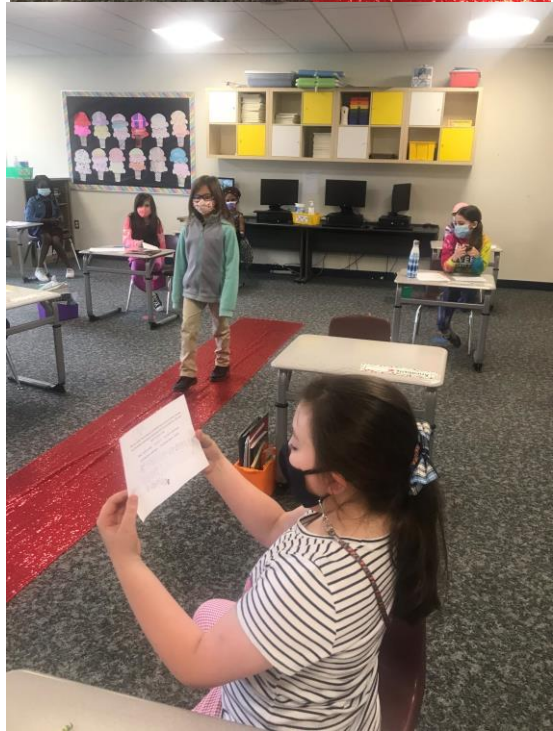
Soon, these new plants will be in bloom for all to enjoy!

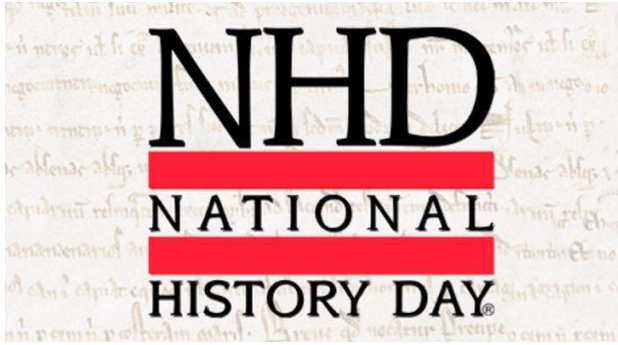
History's Mysteries!

FRCS 9th Graders Impress at National History Day State Competition



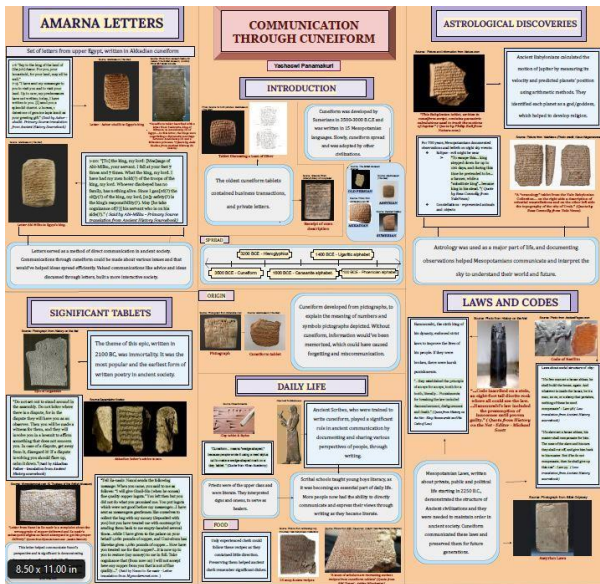
Over the past month, eight Foxborough Regional Charter School high school students participated in the National History Day State competition. Two of our students walked away with special prizes!
