Welcome Back, Students!

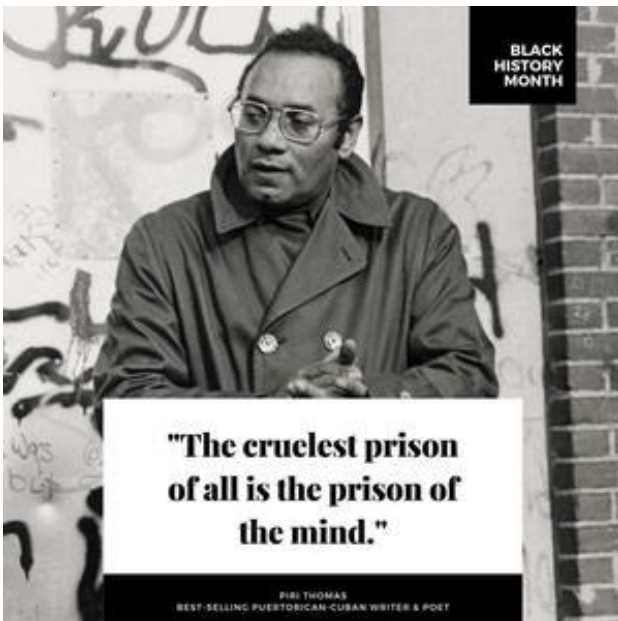

High School Student Groups Honor Black Heroes and Black-Owned Businesses

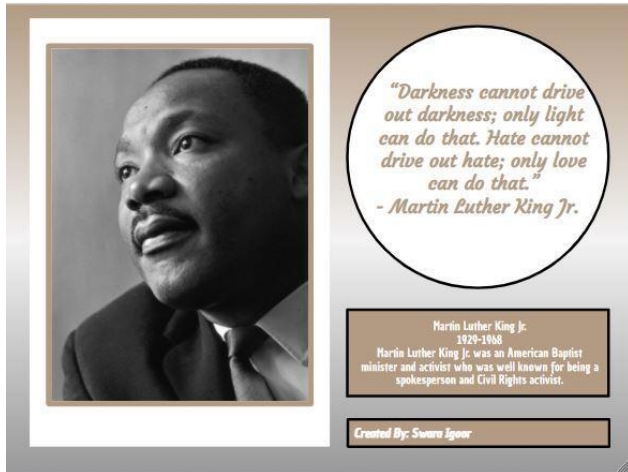


In honor of Black History Month, several student groups in the High School have been putting together some posts on social media about lesser-known Black Heroes and Black-Owned Businesses to share with our community.

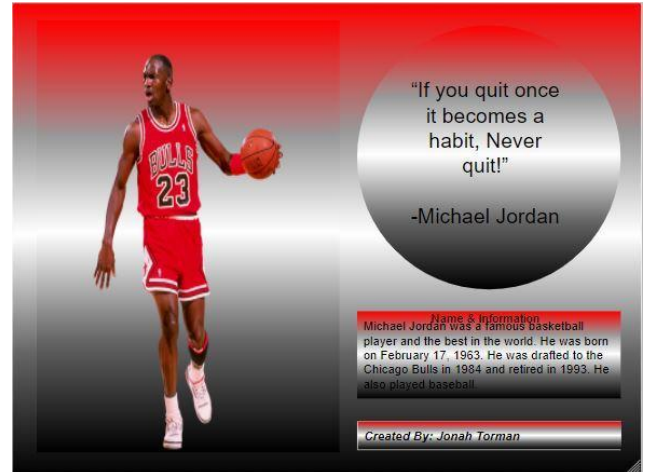

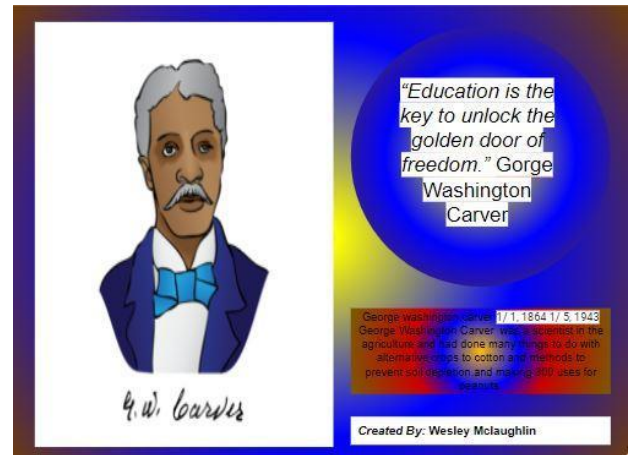

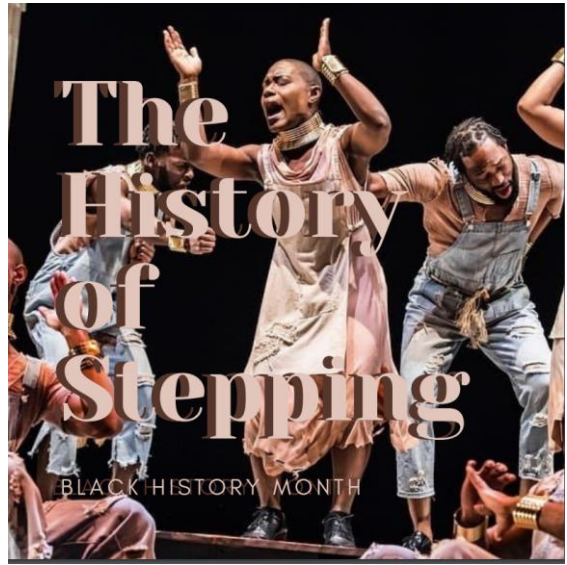

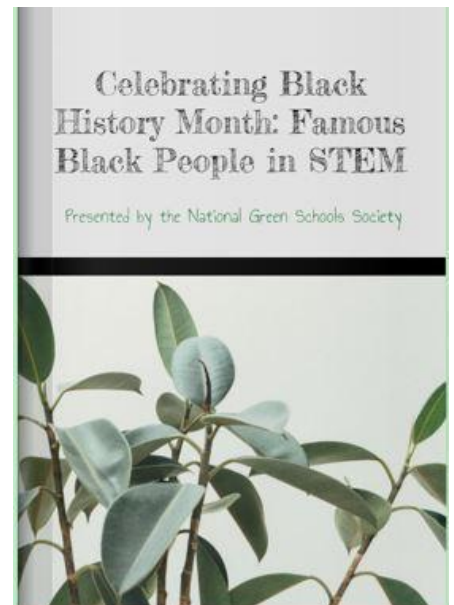

Some of the great history makers featured include the creator of the dry cleaner process, the inventor of the first home security system, and the first African American President of the United States.

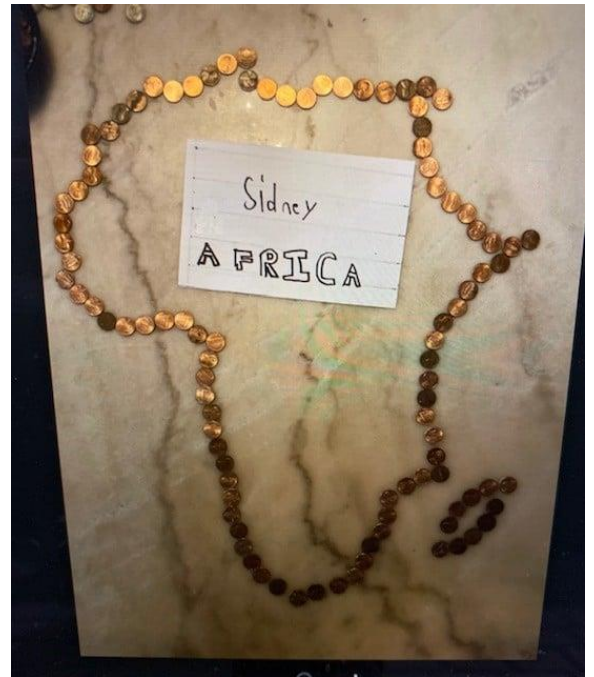

Celebrating 100 Days

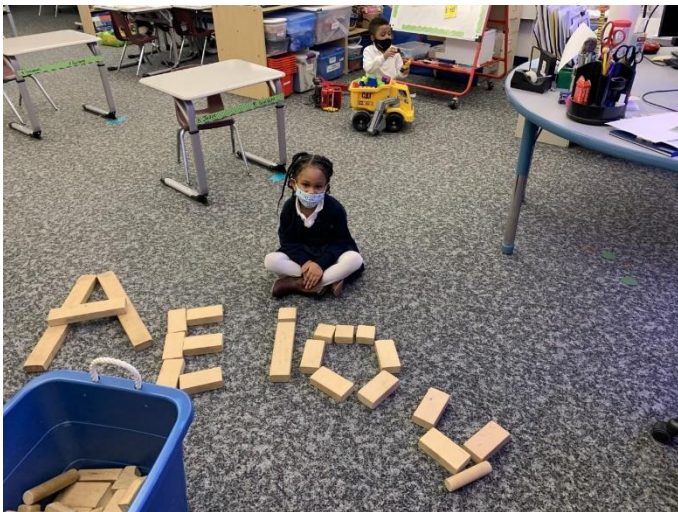
In the Elementary School, students celebrate the 100th day of class. Each classroom does something a little different to celebrate.
