Congratulations to the FRCS Class of 2021

On Friday, June 11, 2021 61 students received their high school diplomas at Foxborough Regional Charter School's 19th annual commencement.

Ms. Annie Azarloza, Interim Executive Director of Foxborough Regional Charter School addressed the Class of 2021. Azarloza applauded the students for their strength, determination, and grit throughout what has been an unusual and challenging senior year. 
"The challenge for all of us, graduates, is to free ourselves from the lust for power and prestige and




"Class of 2021, you are resilient, your voice matters, and your actions speak volumes - so continue to be purposeful, be reflective, be willing to grow." said Engle.


