In order to allow for a more applicable comparison of 2021 CCMR with previous years, the CCMR scores reported in this row have been adjusted by subtracting the percentage of students who met CCMR based on military enlistment or based on the 1/2 point credit for coherent sequence CTE from the CCMR scores reported for 2018, 2019 and 2020.

Written notice of award mailed or otherwise furnished to the successful respondent results in a binding contract without further action by either party.
- SUPPLEMENTAL INFORMATION: All supplemental information required by the proposal documents must be included with the response. Failure to provide complete and accurate information may disqualify a vendor from consideration.
- PROPOSAL ERRORS: Proposals will represent a true and correct statement and shall contain no cause for claim of omission or error. Request for withdrawal of proposal is allowed based on proof of mechanical error; however, a vendor may be removed from approved vendor list.

 - i. Dante audio flows sent to both the USB A/V bridge for room's client-based video teleconferencing as well as central studio.
- e. Content feed from A/V inputs listed above.











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2. Outputs:

Lighting control provided by a Chauvet Chamsys MagicQ MQ50 lighting and scene control interface, which also has a PC-based software piece for offline learning/configuration, as well as extensive online training. Lighting consists of 2 FloLight BladeLight 36" Green LED Strips, 2 FloLight BladeLight 36" LED Strips, 1 Dracast LED2000 Kala Bi-Color LED 3-Light Kit, and 1 Dracast LED1000 X Series RGB and Bi-Color LED 3 Light Kit. Ceiling and wall-mounted DMX network connections will be provided for control interface for the luminaires and fixtures. Camera control achieved through the built-in camera controller on the TriCaster control panel. A/V content and other control achieved via a 7" tabletop control panel for content and alternative audio signal routing from central A/V system. Additional video monitoring for the production system delivered by 2 55" NEC professional displays, wall-mounted at production console wall. Within the studio itself, 3 custom wall plates provide SDI and audio inputs to production studio system, with a 55" wallmounted NEC professional-grade display providing video reinforcement. 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Items altered/removed from scope for the studio:

- Camera needs specified as under consideration; however, Pref-Tech can source and
 provide the cameras and camera accessories required for the studio space when finalized.
 The requested LED track lighting to be treated as construction-scope, as these would be
 electrician installed. The requested ceiling tile and grid needs to be treated as
 construction-scope and managed by the general contractor for the project.
- 2. The requested 55" broadcast displays are cost-prohibitive (\$7,500 each), and professional NEC M551 displays are quoted in their place.
- 3. The additional cable runs and specialty cable bundles aren't included per discussion with customer in August.
- 4. The AJA KUMO 64x64, with all requested accessories isn't included as it's redundant given that all conference room inputs are operable over NDI networking, and the included NewTek Tricaster Elite 2 offers 32 channels of NDI inputs, with 8 hardwired SDI inputs (can be expanded another 8 or 16 if need be).
- 5. A dedicated camera controller isn't included, as the NewTek Tricaster includes camera controls, per the NDI request within the specifications document.
- 6. The studio cyclorama, NAS media server, and soft drape background aren't included as they're construction provided, under evaluation, and should be interior designer provided, respectively.

- a. Remove small meeting/conference rooms from quote
- b. Add expulsion room as a large conference room with dual displays.
- c. Move room scheduling panels from option into main room builds for quote.
