Now more than ever, we need your support and partnership! In October 2021, we will launch the We Are One capital campaign to establish a world-class K-12 education campus in South Madison/Monona that will enroll children residing in Wisconsin. The Pleasant T. Rowland Leadership Campus will include a fully renovated 157,000 square-foot school facility, outdoor playgrounds and recreational space and a new 165,000 square-foot athletic center that will be open to community use beyond school hours. Because of its location, the campus will primarily serve one of Wisconsin's most racially, ethnically and socio-economically diverse communities. It will offer a dynamic and transformational education program that will prepare young people to succeed in core subjects, while also engaging them in early college and career learning opportunities before they graduate from high school.

One City Schools, Inc. was established in 2014 to seed a new model of public education that ensures young children are on track to succeed in a college or career preparatory program from birth through high school graduation. Our schools have been purposely designed to ensure that our young scholars are able to (a) read and compute at grade level and overcome learning difficulties, (b) successfully complete a rigorous and inspiring education program, (c) develop healthy and life-supporting habits of character, and (d) complete significant credits, coursework and field experiences towards earning college degrees, apprenticeships and professional certifications before they graduate from high school.

One City is focused on eliminating achievement and opportunity gaps in education among children at risk of school failure, and helping all of our scholars achieve their full potential. We also want Wisconsin to become the #1 state in the nation for cultivating knowledgeable, skillful, talented and driven young people who are ready to be tomorrow's parents, leaders, teachers and innovators.

By supporting our campaign, you'll contribute to the renovation and construction of our education campus, and help us realize the totality of our vision for children. Engaged Families & Partners


We educate, engage and partner with our parents through our curricula, extended learning strategies, family programs and volunteer activities in our schools. We also connect our families to valuable community resources.



THE CHALLENGE


High-quality educational experiences are critical for lifelong success. Unfortunately, there are multiple barriers to providing children with the opportunities they need throughout their development.

OUR STRATEGIES

One City's 1707 W. Broadway school facility will be highly conducive and adaptable to learning in different programs and contexts. It will offer flexible classrooms, state of the art technology and multi-use spaces tailored to inspire learning and help our scholars thrive.

UNIQUE FEATURES OF OUR SCHOOLS

1. Year-Round School with Longer School Days

One City operates the only public school in Wisconsin with a longer school day and year. Our scholars attend school for 219 days versus 180 days in traditional public schools, and for 8.5 hours versus 6.5 hours per day. Our scholars' educational progress and outcomes show that this works.

2. Additional Instructional Support and Robust Student Support Services

One City provides two teachers in every classroom from preschool through second grade. We bulkload support in the early grades, and for scholars who are at risk of falling behind academically, so our students acquire critical early literacy, reading and social-emotional skills.

3. Project-Based Learning Elementary Program

One City Elementary School is an EL Education affiliate K-5 school that ensures scholars develop foundational knowledge, skills and abilities to solve complex problems, perform complex tasks, produce high quality work and engage in design-thinking, innovation and collaboration.

4. Early College and Career Secondary Program

One City Preparatory Academy will open in September 2022 and eventually serve grades 6-12. It will offer our project-based learning program in our upper grades, while immersing students in college credit-earning degree pathways, apprenticeships and professional licensing and certification programs beginning as early as 9th grade.

5. Extended Learning Academies

As part of our longer school day program, our scholars engage in extended learning opportunities in STEM, the arts, athletics and other fields that their parents might not be able to afford or access on their own.

6. Healthy Meals and Life-Skills Programming


One City employs a school nutrition team that prepares healthy meals daily, onsite, for our scholars and staff. Our secondary school will also ensure our scholars complete driver's education and receive a driver's license, maintain a bank account, develop financial literacy, and enter college or begin a career as self-sufficient members of their communities.

7. Grow-Our-Own Teacher Preparation Program

One City hires assistant teachers and student support specialists that are interested in becoming licensed teachers. Those who show promise in teaching are offered the opportunity to have their college tuition costs covered to earn their college degrees and certifications to teach in our schools.


8. Program Evaluation, Transparency and Accountability

Researchers at the University of Wisconsin-Madison have teamed up with One City to conduct a comprehensive longitudinal study of our schools. This study will evaluate the efficacy of our approach, report on our progress and success, identify lessons learned and disseminate research and results that will inform the fields of early childhood and K-12 education in Wisconsin and and across the nation.



One City scholars will graduate from our school but always be a part of our community. They will emerge from our program as thinkers, learners, and problem-solvers ready to tackle life's challenges and provide effective leadership in our state and globally.

WHY NOW


Prior to the COVID-19 pandemic, child care and K-12 education were fragile industries. Most working families could not afford the high cost of quality child care. Tremendous teacher shortages, along with low retention rates among educators in early childhood and K-12 education, left schools operating in a state of emergency as they worked to provide high-quality instruction and learning opportunities for their students. Likewise, persistent low rates of school achievement, attainment and opportunity gaps among Black, Latinx and Southeast Asian youth in Dane County continued to define the educational outcomes of our region's most vulnerable young people, and predicted the challenges future generations

would have in benefiting from and contributing to Greater Madison's growing economy.

Furthermore, children across Wisconsin were in need of schools that provide cutting-edge learning experiences that will prepare them to succeed and lead in the future.

Our children need transformational learning environments and experiences right now. With your support, One City scholars will become the teachers, healthcare specialists, scientists, engineers, carpenters, plumbers, mechanics, inventors, policy makers, parents and community leaders we need to keep America and the world moving forward.

One City Schools exceeded the nationwide 2020-2021 COVID-19 benchmarks based on percentage of scholars who met individual growth targets. Black scholars exceeded 2020-2021 COVID-19 benchmarks, and pre-COVID-19 benchmarks.







WHY US

In the midst of a global pandemic, One City's students exceeded 'pre-COVID' growth rates in reading among their peers nationally. We also relocated and opened our elementary school in three days (August 2020); stayed open the entire 2020-21 school year, provided \$120,000 in lost-income relief to our families; pushed our innovations forward despite the tremendous challenges we experienced; taught in a longer school day and year format; kept our learning community safe and secure with zero COVID transmissions at our schools; and recruited the most diverse staff among K-12 schools in South Central Wisconsin.

Developing great schools is not easy. Developing transformational schools is even harder. However, it can be done.
