- Non-exempt employees no longer receive three days up front sick days, but accrue 1 hour for every 20 hours beginning on their first day of employment

#### **CERTIFICATED ASSIGNMENT AUTHORIZATION**

When deemed necessary, EC 44256(b) and 44258.2 allow, by a vote of the governing board, the holder of a Multiple Subject Teaching Credential or Single Subject Teaching Credential to teach, with his or her consent, any subject in departmentalized classes below grade 9 if the

In accordance with Section 11701 of Title 5 of the California Code of Regulations, setting policy pursuant to Education Code section 51747, the Board shall consider, in a public hearing, the scope of its existing or prospective use of independent study as an instructional strategy, its purposes in authorizing independent study, and factors bearing specifically on the maximum realistic lengths of assignments and acceptable number of missed assignments for specific populations of pupils or adult education students. This policy shall reflect an awareness that excessive leniency in its terms can result in pupils falling behind their age peers as to increase, rather than decrease, the risk of their dropping out of school.
