

Re: State Relations Update

Thank you for your volunteer service on the Reach Cyber Charter School Board. Here is a short update on current state relations activities in Pennsylvania.

Two bills Connections has been following in 2016 had some activity during the October session:

HB530: Although there was strong interest in moving the bill forward in October, ultimately there were not enough votes to bring the bill back up. It is effectively dead.

HB1907: The Assembly passed and the Governor has signed a comprehensive truancy reform bill. This bill will allow charter schools (including cybers) to create their own definition of an unexcused absence. Additionally, it clarifies where truancy petitions must be filed (the district of student residence) and also clarifies reporting requirements.

The Board had requested that State Relations research possible organizations Reach Cyber Charter School might be interested in joining in addition to the Pennsylvania Coalition of Public Charter Schools. While there are additional charter school and general school choice groups in Pennsylvania, these offer limited opportunities for membership.

Keystone Alliance for Public Charter Schools restricts membership to brick and mortar charter schools.

Reach Alliance/Foundation, a comprehensive school choice advocacy group, provides a membership option for foundations providing EITC scholarships. However, they do advocate on behalf of cyber charters. Amanda Jay, Connections' State Relations representative for Pennsylvania, has met with Reach's executive director, Otto Banks. He was very enthusiastic about Reach Cyber Charter School's model and it could be beneficial for board members to develop an informal relationship with the organization.
