CEO Update

Desegregation Lawsuit (7:11 p.m.)

• There's been <u>a ruling</u> on a court case that affects Kairos. SLPS is suing to recoup desegregation funding that has gone to charter schools. MCPSA's summary of the ruling is below. **Upshot:** Good for charter schools.

On November 24th Judge Autrey entered the attached memorandum opinion and order in the Liddell case (St. Louis Charter Schools Desegregation Sales Tax Lawsuit) granting in part and denying in part the Plaintiff's motion to enforce the settlement agreement. This means that although there is good news there is still reason to be concerned that the per pupil funding your students rely on for their education may still be subject to reductions which must be addressed.

The good news for now at least is the class plaintiffs' request for an award of \$90+ million in monies allegedly appropriated improperly has been denied. These are the monies that if ordered to pay the State would likely recoup from the charter schools.

The area of great concern is this order also requires charter schools to use the portion of the state aid that represents local sales tax monies to fund desegregation programs or to return the funds to the District for its desegregation programs. There is no detail to indicate what this would look like, how this would be implemented, etc.
