



Discipline Trends

As we increase Restorative Practices school-wide. Students are starting to understand that it is ok to make mistakes. Students are learning from their mistakes and making positive decisions each day. Teachers focus on meeting each student where they are and ensuring that they feel loved, cared for, and valued.
