Attendance

2023 - 2024 Attendance

• Schools across California have seen an increase in absenteeism over the last several years.

• Pre-Covid schools planned on 95-97% attendance rates

 This year we are averaging around 90-91% attendance for students

An increase of 1% in overall school attendance
Is equal to about \$40k!

2023 - 2024 Attendance

 School attendance is the number one correlator to long term student achievement and high school graduation rates!

• We are continuing to explore how to better engage our community around the topic of attendance!

2024 - 2025 Enrollment Season

- We are currently accepting applications for the 2024 -2025 school year!
- Oakland Enrolls reports a 12% decrease in applications across all charter schools as of today.
- Offers were made in every grade earlier this month and families have until the end of the day today to respond!

Staffing Updates

Staffing Updates!

- Reasonable Assurances or Postponements of Reasonable Assurance were received by all daytime staff on 4/19.
 - ELOP is being supported through this process by Melody including similar messaging in the coming weeks
- Postponement for reasonable assurances were sent if staff:
 - Is currently on an active Performance Improvement Plan
 - Has 15 or more absences (or prorated number based on Start Date) and are subject to an additional performance review.
 - Has received 2 or more *written* warnings in the last 24 months
 - Staff that received a postponement have had or have scheduled meetings with their supervisor and an HR representative to discuss parameters for reasonable assurance.

Staffing Updates!

- 2 Lead teachers have informed us that they will not be returning next year.
 - We are working with them around coordinating a communication plan to students/families that will best support them.

Upcoming Charter Renewal!

Charter Renewal Tracks

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California Department of Education (CDE) announced the release of the charter renewal tracks that will be used for 2024-25 renewing schools, which are based on data from the 2022 and 2023 California School Dashboards.

There are 3 possible Tracks Charters are categorized in.

Charter Renewal Tracks

- **High Track:** The authorizer "shall not deny" unless they make specific findings with 30 days' notice and provide a reasonable opportunity to cure the violation.
 - The renewal will be a 5- to 7-year term.
- **Middle Track:** This is a presumptive renewal with a 5-year term. The charter should be renewed unless the authorizer makes written findings that the school has failed to make sufficient progress and that the closure is in the best interest of pupils. Schools in the middle track may use verified data to strengthen your data story. See here for CCSA guidance on the middle track.

Charter Renewal Tracks

- **Low Track:** Falling into the low track puts charters in a very vulnerable position at renewal.
- Low track means a **presumptive non-renewal** with the allowance for a **2-year term only if**:
 - The charter school is taking meaningful steps to address the underlying cause(s) of low performance, as reflected in a written plan; AND
 - There is clear and convincing evidence of student growth or strong postsecondary outcomes, as demonstrated by verified data.

Charter Renewal Tracks - UMCS

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- UMCS was placed in the low track by the CDE, however we believe that is incorrect!
- We are working with the CDE and the county to discuss options for reviewing our data in more depth.

What can Families do to help with Renewal?

- Send your students to school!
 - Attendance is the number one indicator of student achievement and high school graduation rates
- Talk about the importance of doing your best on standardized tests
- 4-8th grade families:
 - Support your student to engage in extra math practice at home on IXL and reading every day!
- Tell your friends and family about our school! We are still accepting applications for enrollment.

- 11 Action items (9 contributing to unduplicated students) totalling \$308,000
