Grievance Procedures:

- 1. If you believe that you or your child's rights under one of the above categories has been violated, you should submit the grievance in writing (letter or email) to the Coordinator listed above.
- 2. The Coordinator will review the claim and conduct a prompt, thorough, and impartial investigation.
- 3. The Coordinator will respond to the claim in writing within 10 business days of receipt of the grievance. The response will include the outcome of the investigation and corrective and/or preventative actions if necessary.
- 4. If the complainant is not satisfied with the response/outcome of the Coordinator's investigation, he/she may appeal the decision to the Governing Board following the procedures outlined in section D2: Formal Appeals, Complaints, or Petitions of the Pataula Charter Academy, Inc. Public Participation at Governing Board or Committee Meetings Policy.
- 5. If the complainant is not satisfied with the decision of the Governing Board, he/she may contact the US Department of Education, Office of Civil Rights, at (800) 421-3481 or <u>ocr@ed.gov</u>.

Retaliation against a person making a report of a violation to this policy or participating in an investigation is prohibited. Confidentiality of the person making the report or a person participating in an investigation will be protected to the greatest possible extent.
