Reading: Tutor Program

Our tutoring program supplements classroom learning by delivering high-dose, one-on-one instruction on a continuum of intensity and frequency based on student needs in literacy and math, by a trained tutor. Our priority is that students read at grade level by the end of grade 3, but we continue to teach and support reading growth in grades 4-8 based on students' needs and tutors' availability and expertise.

Organized Athletics

Participating in organized sports develops our Scholars' character, persistence, physical fitness and dedication to community and teamwork. One City competitive teams include volleyball, flag football, dance, basketball and track θ field. We also offer intramural teams for soccer, volleyball, track θ field, baseball and softball. Scholars have the opportunity to build friendships and stay healthy year-round.

Scholars Academy and Prep Year

No two students are the same. Instead of socially promoting Scholars from one grade level to the

next, when they are not ready to succeed, we meet our Scholars where they are, academically and behaviorally. Our Scholars Academy (grades K-4) and Prep Year programs (grades 5-8) provide more individualized instruction and social-emotional interventions, in smaller classroom settings, for students who need such support to grow and thrive in their learning in school. We have seen significant success with both programs.

Healthy Meals Program

Our dedicated school nutrition team continues to prepare healthy meals for our Scholars each day. This includes breakfast, lunch and an afternoon snack. We also encourage socializing and relationship-building by situating our students family-style for each meal.

Music Class



One City welcomes Scholars from more than 12 neighboring communities, both inside and outside Dane County.


Enrollment Comparison
