UNIQUE FEATURES OF ONE CITY SCHOOLS:

- One City operates the only longer school day and longer school year public elementary and secondary schools in Wisconsin. Students attend from 8:00am to 4:30pm from September 1 through July.
- Two-Generational Family Engagement Program (FAST)
- The only PreK-12 schools in Wisconsin undergoing a comprehensive 20-year longitudinal independent evaluation, conducted by the University of Wisconsin, of all key aspects of its schools.
- OCP is a 5-star rated preschool by the state, and OCES/OCPA are public schools chartered by the University of Wisconsin System.
- Scholars Academy: Intensive, specialized support for scholars behind or ahead grade level in reading, math, and/or school-appropriate behaviors
 - Healthy Meals Program

NEED FOR ONE CITY'S MODEL OF EDUCATION:

In 2019, only 10% of Madison's Black students, third through eighth grade, were reading proficiently (199 of 1,912 children), compared to 16% of Hispanic, 35% of Asian and 57% of their white classmates. Of the 5,265 children identified as economically disadvantaged, only 13.6% (767 students) were reading proficiently compared to 57.65% of their non-economically disadvantaged peers.

While racial and econimic disparities in reading rates are significant, reading rates are low for all children across Dane County. One City will ensure children have access to and are enrolled in high quality schools starting in preschool. One City's strategies set students up for future success and will eliminate the disparities we see today.

EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM:

One City uses curricula focused on deep, student-driven learning that is project-based, inspiring and challenging. The AnjiPlay curriculum is the core of One City's preschool program and EL Education is the foundation for grades K-8.

GROWTH STRATEGY:

One City is focused on expanding to serve 1,000 preschool-aged children by 2026 and growing its public charter school to education 614 scholars by 2025. We currently operate three schools: One City Preschool (ages 3m-3yrs), One City Elementary School (4K-grade 5), and One City Preparatory Academy, which will ultimately serve students in grades 6-12.
