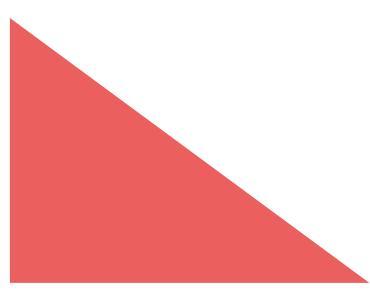

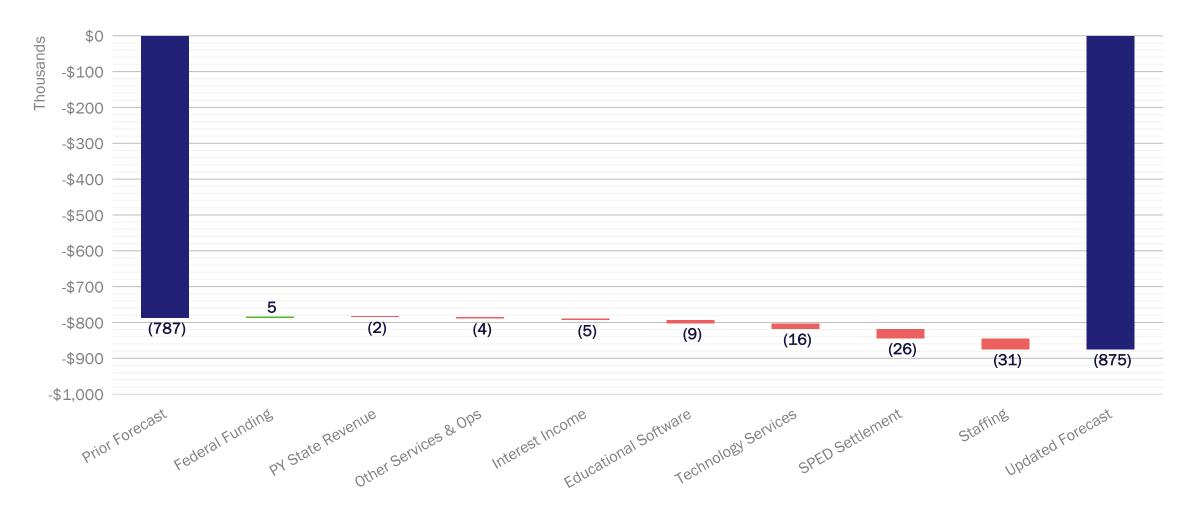




2024-25 Forecast Update



Projected year-end operating deficit increases by \$88K, over 30% due to timing

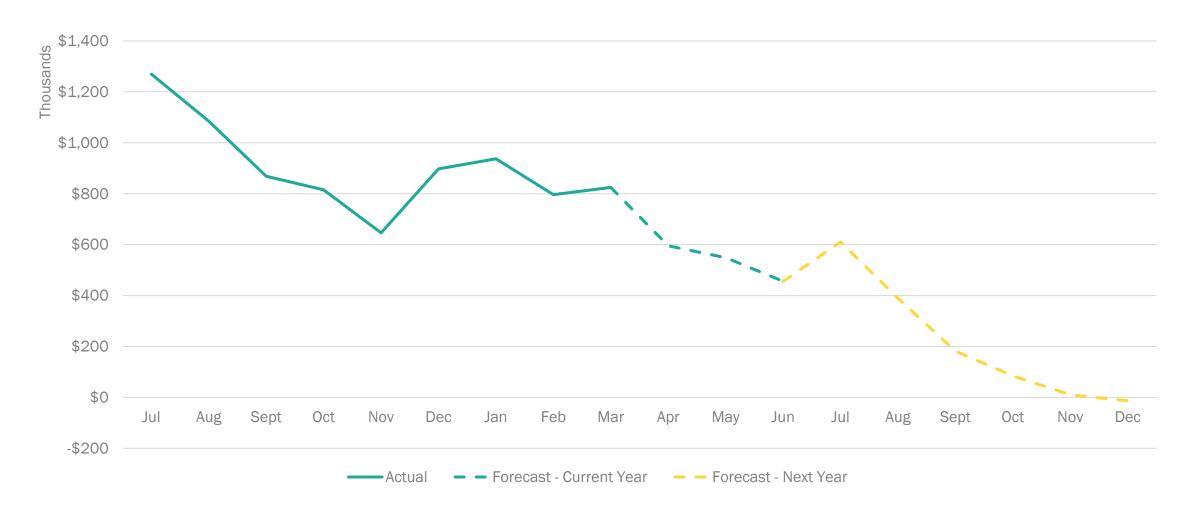


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Multi-Year Monthly Cash Balance

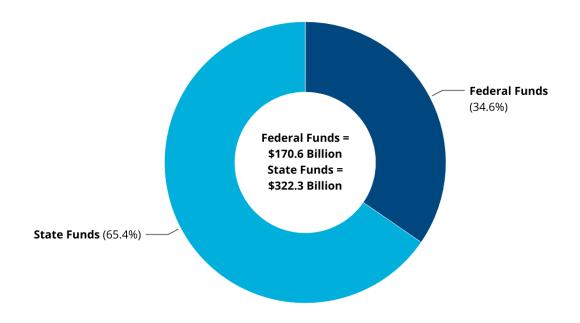
Federal Funds in the State Budget

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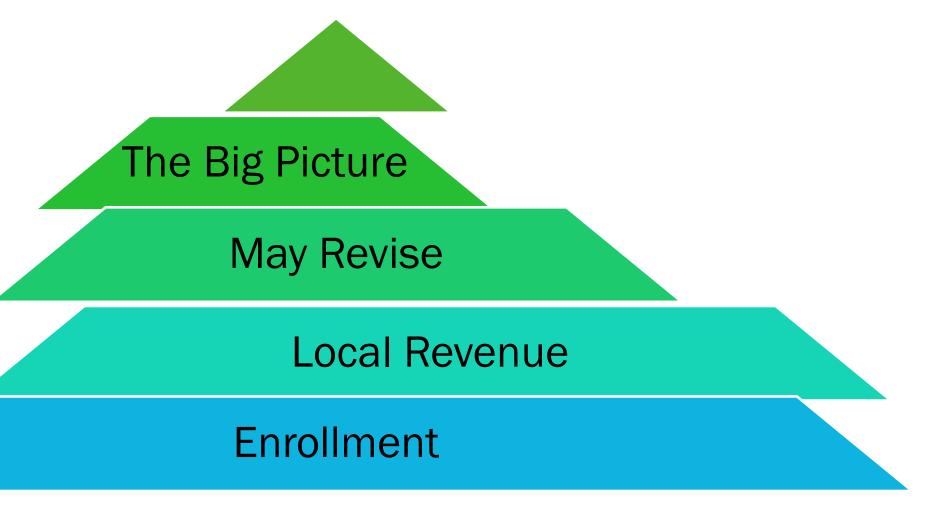
