## MAP Growth Data - Key Take Aways

- Reading 58% of students within the low average achievement range are making progress in the > 3 RTI growth range
- Math 68% of students within the low average achievement range are making progress in the > 3 RTI growth range at 68%
- 70% of Black/African American students (n=35) in the low/low average achievement levels are showing growth in math
- As a next step, we will use this MAP data to add interventions, identify students of focus, differentiate classroom instruction, and cross-reference with Tri 1 grade data



## Intercession Updates - PD Overview

- Staff reflected on and identified themes aligned to the NEP Definition of Educational Equity to ground and center our work in supporting Black students at EBIA.
- Staff examined student data disaggregated by race and discussed "The Opportunity Myth" with the purpose of refining our equity problems of practice for 22-23.
- Shannon Wheatley led 2 afternoon PD sessions that understanding identity, focused on understanding intersectional identity, examining biases, and reflecting on the Black student experience at EBIA.
- The Curriculum Design Team led department workshops that focused on unpacking standards to improve writing across the curriculum in ELA, History Math, Science.



## Intercession Updates - Staff Experience

- All staff members rated the PD sessions with Shannon very highly and appreciated a space being created to speak about race and how impactful it is in our community.
- Staff members acknowledged and appreciated many of their colleagues who are making the effort to do the work to better serve our students.
- The vertical alignment time allowed each of the department teams time to vertically align on standards and brainstorm with peers. Staff expressed that this was incredibly useful and would like this time to continue into the spring.
- Staff members are interested in how the admin team will intentionally use the data collected during the PD sessions to intentionally move forward as an organization to support our Black students and staff.



### Intersession Updates - Student Experience

- Students enjoyed having Intersession In Person versus Online on Zoom chance to be with friends and have fun with friends
- Students enjoyed the variety of programming especially Rob Skate and Hip Hop (Lower School) and Barbering and Cooking (Upper School)
- Students would like to have more STEM options for future Intersession sessions and possibly incorporate field trip opportunities, internships, and job shadowing opportunities
