# Continue Meeting Virtually per Report of Findings Regarding AB 361

#### BACKGROUND:

AB 361 provides that if a state of emergency remains in place, a local agency must make the following findings by majority vote every 30 days, in order to continue using the bill's exemption to the Brown Act teleconferencing rules:

(A) The legislative body has reconsidered the circumstances of the emergency; and

(B) Either of the following circumstances exists:

- 1. the state of emergency continues to directly impact the ability of board members to meet safely in person, or
- 2. State or local officials continue to impose or recommend social distancing measures.

Charter school boards are required to vote every 30 days to make the required findings regarding the continuing emergency and vote to continue using the law's exemptions.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

The School Board has met the finding that a state of emergency continues to directly impact the ability of the members to meet safely in person. Motion to continue the School Board meetings virtually pursuant to AB 361.

## **Evaluation Policy**

Lake View Charter School is committed to providing evaluation and assessment of all staff members on a continuing basis.

The purpose of the Lake View Charter School Governing Board approving this Evaluation Policy is to accomplish the following:

- 1. Outline the Purpose of the Evaluation
- 2. Establish the Frequency of Evaluations and the Evaluation Timeline
- 3. Establish Who Conducts the Employee Evaluations
- 4. Outline the Evaluation Sequence of Events
- 5. Outline Opportunities for Professional Growth
- 6. Outline the Record Keeping Process for All Evaluations
- **1. Purpose of Evaluations:** The purpose of a staff evaluation is to safeguard and improve the quality of educational support and service received by students and families by the Charter School Employees and to provide staff with important feedback to improve their practice and identify options for professional growth and development.
- **2. Frequency of Evaluations and Evaluation Timeline:** Every staff member will be evaluated annually or biennially per administrator discretion. Evaluations will be conducted in the spring of each school year and will be completed no later than thirty (30) calendar days before the end of the employee's scheduled work year.
- **3. Who Conducts the Employee Evaluations:** The employee's immediate supervisors will be responsible for evaluating the employees. The supervisor may delegate portions of the evaluation process to a designee, but the supervisor shall retain overall responsibility.

### 4. Sequence of Events:

- Self-Assessment and Form 700: the employee will complete their self-assessment of the evaluation and their Form 700 prior to their meeting with their supervisors.
- Meeting with Supervisor: the employee and the employee's supervisor or designee will meet to review the employee's performance and discuss the written evaluation.
- Employee's Time to Respond: the employee will be given the opportunity to respond to their supervisor's evaluation.
- Final Evaluation Report and Summary Conference: the evaluator shall prepare, complete and issue the Final Evaluation Report and give a copy to the employee.
- 5. Opportunities for Professional Growth: The employee's supervisor may identify

opportunities for professional growth. It is not a right of any employee to be provided a performance plan.

**6. Record Keeping:** A signed copy of the Final Evaluation and any supporting documents shall be kept on file with the HR Director.

## **Residency Policy**

California law requires that certain residency requirements are established in order for a student to be enrolled in an independent study charter school for which average daily attendance may be claimed. California law requires that a student be a California resident and requires that the student is a resident of the county in which the apportionment claim is reported or of a county immediately adjacent to the county in which the apportionment claim is reported. [EC §§ 47612(b), 51747.3]

The purpose of the Lake View Charter School Governing Board approving this Residency Policy is to accomplish the following:

- 1. Define Residency
- 2. Outline Residency for a Student on an Extended Vacation
- 3. Establish the Location Materials Will Be Mailed To
- 4. Outline the Procedures When a Student's Residency is in Question
- 5. Establish Process of Proof of Residency if Document or Affidavit Not Provided at Beginning of the School Year
- 6. Outline the Parent/Guardian/Education Rights Holder's Right Regarding Determination of Non Residency
- 7. Outline the Procedures for Military, Homeless, Foster Youth, and Migratory students.
- 1. Definition of Residency: A student has residency in the state and county of the residence of the parent/guardian with whom that student maintains his or her place of abode. Residence denotes any factual place of abode of some permanency that is more than a mere temporary sojourn. Owning a home in California or in a particular county does not qualify a student to attend Lake View Charter School, unless it can be shown that the student is also living in the home at least three days per week during the school year.
- 2. Residency for a Student on an Extended Vacation: A student who maintains residence in a county served by Lake View Charter, but is on an extended vacation not lasting longer than 20 school days, will not be deemed to have lost California residency. During this travel, the student will meet virtually with the teacher and complete assigned work. The family is responsible for notifying their HST (if applicable, Education Specialist and any other staff who participate in the education of the student) for the first and last day of the Extended Vacation. If a student has the need for an extension of the 20 school days, approval of the school's Executive Director or designee is required in a written communication.
- **3.** The Location Material(s) Will Be Mailed To: All materials will be mailed to the address identified in the student's records in his/her proof of residence documentation.
- 4. Student's Residency is in Question: If there is reason to believe that a student's residency is in question, Lake View Charter School may investigate in order to determine the authenticity of the home address. When it is determined that a student lives outside of

Lake View Charter School - Regular Scheduled Board Meeting - Agenda - Wednesday March 16, 2022 at 4:30 PM California and/or an authorized county, Lake View Charter School will provide written notice of the determination of nonresidency within five days of Lake View Charter School's intention to disenroll the student.

- 5. Proof of Residency Document/Affidavit Not Provided by Beginning of School Year: A student that has not provided an updated Proof of Residency or affidavit by the start of his or her enrollment for each school year, will have 5 school days to provide the Proof of Residency or affidavit. If the student has still not provided the Proof of Residency or affidavit by the fifth day of enrollment, the School will provide written notice of the School's intention to disenroll the student effective five school days later.
- 6. Parent/Guardian/Education Rights Holder's Right Regarding Determination of Nonresidency: The notice shall contain an explanation of the parent/guardian/education rights holder's right to request a hearing adjudicated by a neutral officer within 5 school days at which the pupil has a fair opportunity to present testimony, evidence, and witnesses and confront and cross-examine witnesses and at which the pupil has the right to bring legal counsel or an advocate to dispute the finding of nonresidency. If the parent/guardian/educational rights holder does not request a hearing within five days of receipt of the notice, the right to a hearing is waived and the student will be immediately disenrolled. If the student's parent, guardian or educational rights holder initiates the hearing, the student shall remain enrolled and shall not be disenrolled until Lake View Charter School issues a final decision.
- 7. Children of Military Families: Lake View Charter School will serve children of military families, as defined by Education Code section 49701, as follows:
  - 1. Allow the student to continue his or her education in Lake View Charter School, regardless of change of residence of the military family during that school year, for the duration of the student's status as a child of a military family; or
  - 2. For a student whose status changes due to the end of military service of his or her parent during a school year, comply with either of the following, as applicable:
    - a. If the student is enrolled in TK through 8th grade, allow the student to continue his or her education in Lake View Charter School through the duration of that academic school year;
    - b. If the child is enrolled in high school, allow the student to continue his or her education in Lake View Charter School through graduation.

Once Lake View Charter School is notified that a student is identified as a child of a military family, Lake View Charter School will require the parent/guardian to submit the following documentation:

- 1. Written proof of the transfer, including the time period for the transfer and location of the transfer.
- 2. A signed affidavit that states that the student is only enrolled in Lake View Charter Schooland not in any other full-day educational program and that the student qualifies as a child of a military family as defined in Education Code section 49701.

For high school students, the aforementioned documentation will need to be resubmitted on an annual basis. Lake View Charter School reserves the right to re-verify all of the above at any time throughout the school year.

- 8. Homeless Youth: Lake View Charter School will be considered to be a pupil's school of origin for a homeless youth when the child attended Lake View Charter School when permanently housed or was last enrolled in Lake View Charter School before becoming homeless. Lake View Charter School will serve homeless youth, as defined below, whose residency has changed as follows:
  - 1. Allow the student to continue his or her education in Lake View Charter School for the duration of homelessness.
  - 2. If the pupil is no longer homeless before the end of the academic year, either of the following apply:
    - a. If the homeless youth is in high school, the Lake View Charter School shall allow the formerly homeless child to continue his or her education in the Lake View Charter School through graduation.
    - b. If the homeless youth is in TK through 8th grade, the Lake View Charter School shall allow the formerly homeless youth to continue his or her education in Lake View Charter School through the duration of the academic year.

b. individually or in conjunction with any other person, firm, agency, company, client, business, or corporation, employ or cause to be employed any confidential information in any manner whatsoever, except in furtherance of the business of Employer;

c. without the written consent of Employer, publish, deliver, or commit to being published or delivered, any copies, abstracts, or summaries of any files, records, documents, drawings, specifications, lists, equipment and similar items relating to the business of Employer, except to the extent required in the ordinary course of Employee's duties;

Upon termination of employment, Employee is required to immediately return to Employer all property of Employer including, but not limited to, all files, records, documents, curriculum, equipment and supplies,

promotional materials, and similar items relating to the business of Employer.

### C. <u>TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT</u>

This Agreement may be terminated by any of the following:

- 1. <u>Early Termination with/without Cause</u>: The School Administration may unilaterally, and with or without cause or advance notice, terminate this Agreement. In consideration of the right to terminate this Agreement without cause, the School shall pay to Employee ten business days of his/her salary after termination occurs based on receipt of a release of claims agreement and the return of items identified in B.12.c. If the employee refuses to sign a release of claims the employee will be paid for one day of employment following termination.
- 2. <u>Revocation/Nonrenewal of Charter</u>: In the event that Lake View Charter School is either revoked or non-renewed, this Agreement shall terminate immediately upon the effective date of the revocation/nonrenewal of the charter, and without the need for the process outlined in Section C.1. above.
- 3. <u>Death or Incapacitation of Employee</u>: The death of Employee shall terminate this Agreement and all rights provided under this Agreement. In the event that Employee becomes incapacitated to the extent that, in the judgment of the Board, Employee may no longer perform the essential functions of his/her job with or without reasonable accommodation, as set forth in the job specifications, the Board may terminate this Agreement.
- 4. <u>Decline or Loss of Enrollment</u>: In the event of a cap placed on enrollment numbers or a decline in enrollment, the School may immediately terminate this agreement. (see C.1)
- D. <u>Non-Renewal/Expiration of Term</u>. The School may elect not to offer future employment agreements to Employee at its sole discretion, without cause, and this Agreement will lapse by its own terms.

- E. <u>GENERAL PROVISIONS</u>
  - 1. <u>Waiver of Breach</u>

The waiver by either party, or the failure of either party to claim a breach of any provision of this Agreement, will not operate or be construed as a waiver of any subsequent breach.

2. <u>Assignment</u>

The rights and obligations of the respective parties under the Agreement will inure to the benefit of and will be binding upon the heirs, legal representatives, successors and assigns of the parties hereto; provided, however, that this Agreement will not be assignable by either party without prior written consent of the other party.

#### 3. Governing Law

This Agreement will be governed by, construed, and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of California.

#### 4. Partial Invalidity

If any provision of this Agreement is found to be invalid or unenforceable by any court, the remaining provisions herein will remain in effect unless such partial invalidity or unenforceability would defeat an essential business purpose of the Agreement.

#### F. ACCEPTANCE OF EMPLOYMENT

By signing below, the Employee declares as follows:

- 1. I have read this Agreement and accept employment with Lake View Charter School on the terms specified herein.
- 2. All information I have provided to Lake View Charter School related to my employment is true and accurate.
- 3. This is the entire agreement between myself and Lake View Charter School regarding the terms and conditions of my employment. This is a final and complete agreement and there are no other agreements, oral or written, express or implied, concerning the subject matter of this Agreement. It also supersedes any and all other agreements or contracts, either oral or written, between the Parties with respect to the subject matter hereof.

## **Base Grants**

Every student generates a base grant which funds basic educational costs, such as: employee salaries, building costs, and instructional materials.

## Supplemental Grants

Low income, English learners, and foster youth/homeless, generate more funding above the base grant (20%). Funding is to increase and improve services for the specified groups above to improve achievement.

## **Concentration Grants**

Districts with more than 55% low income, English learners, or foster youth/homeless receive an additional 50% of the base grant.

## The "WHY" for UPK

• Research demonstrates that an early and strong foundation of learning opportunities before kindergarten, give our children an advantage in school and in life.

• Children who attend quality preschool programs are more prepared for school in terms of their early literacy, language and math skills, their executive function, and social emotional development.

• Some preschool participants are less likely to be identified for special education services or to be held back in elementary school.

• California is poised to realize universal prekindergarten for all four year old children and to expand services for three year old children through unprecedented investments through the Budget Act of 2021.
