    - Advance Geometry Problem sets Gone
    - Electron Scanning Microscope Unused
    - AP Computer Science Level Lowered
  - How do we hold ourselves accountable? Do we hold the line intrinsically?
  - We can use the information Lisa presented as baseline and hold ourselves to always wanting to improve
  - ${\scriptstyle \circ}$  AMSA is above most public schools when it come to MCAST scopes
  - Do we hold the line on courses?

## **B.** Courses Unique to AMSA

• Greg presented slides that show comparisons to other high-schools

- Focused on AP courses
- Compared graduation requirements
- Takeaways:
  - AMSA is less flexible then other sending districts (more mandatory classes)
    - Student members feel they still have choices/options for offered classes; but find it hard to fit all courses they want to take into their schedules.
  - Need to do a better job of communicating the available courses to students
    - Maybe give a guide to parents to help students with course selection (create a template for parents and students)
    - Also think about students the do not have English as a first language
    - Discuss course selection at future education committee meetings
  - AMSA requires students to take more Science & computer classes

- Broadly, AMSA's graduation requirements are in line with sending towns
- Conversation will continue at future meetings
