II. Strategic Planning

A. Discussion concerning the strategic planning committee goals, and progress

- Discussed the relevance led to a committee discussion about remimagining the Teacher/Pipeline initiative with local colleges/universities.
- Also discussed the possibility of exploring and Create Opportunities for Exploratory Learning, Develop Teacher Pipeline with local colleges & universities, Evaluate feasibility of expanding seats
- Teacher Pipeline with local colleges & universities: K.S reported that the efforts have not yielded return, and new approaches were being explored.
- Evaluate feasibility of expanding seats: Original initiative to expand to middle school less attainable than originally believed (roadblocks/financing/competing priorities), and pursuing expansion to preschool believed to be a more efficient target.
 - Discussion with board about continued evaluation of feasibility of expanding seats, executing needs assessment and/or SWOT analysis
- Focus on what we have as opposed to adding a new grade; Intermediate strategic step: reallocate kindergarten to PK

- Objective 1
 - Academic achievement outcomes are not where they need to be; another year of stagnant year of academic data
 - Formulating strategies of financial planning
