I. Opening Items

A. Call the Meeting to Order

D. Gonzalez called a meeting of the Community and Parent Engagement Committee of Magnolia Public Schools to order on Thursday Dec 14, 2017 at 5:30 PM.

B. Record Attendance and Guests

H. Beliak joined the meeting at 5:48 p.m.

C. Pledge of Allegiance

T. Velazquez, Communications Associate led the Pledge of Allegiance.

D. Public Comments

G. Mullen, MSA-Santa Ana Teacher spoke on his excitement and anticipation for the change to Standards Based Grading and Proficiency Based Assessments. No other public comments were made.

E. Approval of Agenda

II. Discussion Items

A. Enrollment Update as of December 5, 2017

- I. Soto, Interim Chief External Officer, presented the enrollment update and explained how enrollment numbers are tracked. He presented the new system with a three tier approach 1) Electronic Enrollment, 2) Staples Marketing, and 3) Social Media Campaigns. He recommended that MPS move towards an online and mobile enrollment for all schools. Through analysis, parents are using their phones as their primary source of communication whether that is through email, text, calls, and social media. With the online enrollment it will save time for parents and office staff.
- S. Covarrubias, MPS Committee Member, asked for a test trial with parents and wanted to know if this mobile enrollment process is considered safe. I. Soto, Interim Chief External Officer, explained that this would be run through an external company server who has security measures set in place. Also, C. Young, Chief Executive Officer and Superintendent, spoke on the importance of having the mobile enrollment site be FERPA compliant. This was a discussion item, no actions were taken.

B. Home Visit Update for all Magnolia Science Academies

- I. Soto, Interim Chief External Officer, spoke on the transferring of SIS systems and how that will affect the receiving of up to date home visit numbers for each school site. D. Yilmaz, Chief Accountability Officer, stated that we have a Home Visit Policy put in place to help foster home visits. He also mentioned that they are actively trying to find more ways to motivate teachers to participate in home visits. S. Covarrubias, MPS Committee Member, asked whether teachers have been directly asked about what would make them inclined to participate in the home visit program. C. Young, Chief Executive Officer and Superintendent, addressed S. Covarrubias, MPS Committee Member, by explaining the process of pairing teachers who have done home visits with teachers that haven't to improve their experience that way they won't feel like they are going alone. By pairing teachers this will increase the likelihood of having newer teachers participate in the program.
- S. Covarrubias commented on the home visits program and how valuable it is when building relationships with students and the parents and stressed that if we can find a way to motivate teachers to do it. G. Mullen, MSA-Santa Ana Teacher stated that teachers who actively participate in the home visit program are encouraging other teachers to join. He also echoed the fact that home visits are important and how it makes a difference with the students. This was a discussion item. no actions were taken.

H. Beliak arrived at 5:48 p.m.

Volunteer Policy - Conditions for Classroom and School Volunteer, Visitation, Shadowing, and Removal

D. Yilmaz, Chief Accountability Officer, explained the need for a visitor policy. In collaboration with legal council MPS created a policy that will address all types of volunteers at the school sites, whether they are parents who are visiting for one day or actively helping out the school. The policy includes guidelines for each type of volunteer and what items are needed in order to be a volunteer. The policy outlines the volunteer expectations, rules, and guidelines with an application form. This was a discussion item, no actions were taken.

D. Policy Update

I. Soto, Interim Chief External Officer, presented the Capitol Update that was released that explained a potential change in the assembly committee that could impact local charter schools. C. Young, Chief Executive Officer and Superintendent, elaborated on this item and the repercussions of this bill passing.

This was an informative piece to keep board members updated on this bill that the Home Office team is currently monitoring. This was a discussion item, no actions were taken.

III. Closing Items

A. Adjourn Meeting

There being no further business to be transacted, and upon motion duly made, seconded and approved, the meeting was adjourned at 6:09 PM.

Background

Panorama Education - Family Survey Results

Stakeholder voices, i.e., voices of our students, families, staff, and other school community members, play a powerful role in helping us learn how to improve our teaching, leadership, and other school practices. Surveys have been the primary means of collecting student, family, and staff voices about what we are doing great and should keep doing, and what are areas for improvement, so we can continue to provide our students with the best quality education. MPS uses an online platform to provide students, families, and staff with groups of questions that measure their perceptions of teaching and learning, as well as their perceptions of school climate and students' own strengths and weaknesses. This feedback instrument provides teachers and school leaders with valuable data about how students see their classes, how much parents are involved, how supported staff feel and how to facilitate improvement.


Background on Panorama Education: Panorama is an education technology company that has developed a cloud-based platform-as-a-service that enables school districts and state departments of educations to design and implement survey programs for students, staff

and parents.

Below you will find the survey participation rate for Magnolia families 2016-17 vs. 2017-18. The table below demonstrates the following:

- MSA-1: 3.5% Increase
- MSA-2: 9.1% Increase
- MSA-3: 42.4% Increase
- MSA-4: 11.6% Increase
- MSA-5: 33.1% Increase
- MSA-6: 29.5% Increase
- MSA-7: 31.2% Increase
- MSA-8: 0% Increase (100% participation)
- MSA-SD: 19.6% Increase


The AVERAGE increase across all Magnolia school sites is 13.5%.




Below you will find the survey participation rate for Magnolia families which includes LCAP goals and the change from 2016-17 to 2017-18. For MSA-4, although they did not reach their LCAP target for families 2017-18, they increased by 11.6%. For MSA-San Diego, although they did not reach their LCAP target for families 2017-18, they increased 19.6%. For MSA-SA, they did not reach their LCAP target for families 2017-18 of 85.0%, they reached 70.7%










Knowledge and Fairness of Discipline, Rules and Norms















