RE: Removal of an Existing Director and Appointment of a New Director to the

Magnolia Properties Management, Inc. Board of Directors

I. Proposed Motion/Recommendation(s)

Staff recommends and moves that the MPS Board of Directors (the "MPS Board") remove Director Haim Beliak from the Board of Directors of Magnolia Properties Management, Inc. and replace him with Dr. Salih Dikbas, Ph.D.

II. Background

Magnolia Educational & Research Foundation dba Magnolia Public Schools ("<u>MPS</u>") is a California nonprofit public benefit corporation and a tax exempt organization under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 ("<u>IRC</u>"). Magnolia Properties Management, Inc. is a California nonprofit public benefit corporation ("<u>MPM</u>") and a tax exempt organization under Section 501(c)(3) of the IRC and was formed and is operated exclusively to support MPS. MPS is MPM's sponsor.

Section 2 of Article III of MPM's Bylaws provides as follows: "[t]he authorized number of Directors shall be not less than 3 nor more than 7, until changed by amendment to these Bylaws. The exact number of authorized Directors shall be fixed within these limits from time to time by Magnolia Educational & Research Foundation, a California nonprofit public benefit corporation (the "Sponsor")." Section 3 of Article III of MPM's Bylaws provides as follows: "[MPS, the Sponsor], acting through its Board of Directors, shall designate the Directors of the corporation. Each Director designated by the [MPS] shall serve for such term of office as is designated by the [MPS]." Further, Section 5 of Article III of MPM's Bylaws provides as follows: "[An MPM] Director may be removed at any time for any reason by the Sponsor."

III. Conclusion / Budget Impact
