

Instructional Rounds Updates

Instructional Rounds are day-Long visits to schools conducted by the Academic Team **four times a year**. A schedule is created for each visit that includes a morning leadership meeting, observation of classes, time for document review, and a debrief that highlights glows and grow trends for the school and next steps.

Purpose & Scope

- **September**: Baseline observations used to gather data around instructional practices for the year.
- **November/December**: Check-in #1 to observe, provide feedback around instructional practices goals, and support schools with initial preparation for authorizer visits.
- **January/February**: Check-in #2 to observe, provide feedback around instructional practices goals, and support schools with preparation for authorizer visits. (replaces mock visits for LAUSD schools & adds an additional visit for other schools)
- April: Summative observations for the year regarding instructional practices goals. Final feedback loop for the school with recommendations to consider when planning for next school year.

Highlights

- All 10 schools have been visited for rounds 1 and 2, round 3 is currently in process
- 421 classrooms have been observed with coaching feedback given to school leaders
- All school leaders have taken part in instructional rounds
- Action plans have been developed and implemented based on feedback and plans are consistently being monitored.

College: Courses, Applications and Coaches

Dual Enrollment - snapshot data

- Los Angeles Valley College and Santa Ana College are our partners for facilitated courses
- Dual Enrollment has increased 31% since 21-22
- Current students have earned 2825 College Credits since Fall 2021 and
 627 credits in Fall 2022
 - 65% of students have a DE grade from Fall 2022 (data is still be entered)
- 36% of HS students enrolled in a Dual Enrollment Course this academic year
- Spring 2023 update: 443 seats of Dual Enrollment across 15 courses including:
 - Anthropology, Sociology, Digital Media, Real Estate, Broadcasting, Psychology, Ethnic Studies

Broadcasting, Psychology, Ethnic Studies College Applications & Financial Aid (~260 seniors)

- I,43 I + College Applications Submitted with the help of College Counselors
- 96 students have completed the FAFSA/CADAA

- Planning and hosting 7 monthly math department meetings (PLCs)

Math Curriculum Adoption Project

- Held intensive materials investigation in June 2022
 - Committee narrowed the curricula to 2
- Conducted lesson studies of the potential curricula with math teachers during Oct, Nov, and Dec PLCs
 - Publishers presented to all elementary and math teachers during November PLC
- Teachers overwhelmly (66.7%) voted for Houghton Mifflin Harcourt (HMH) Into Math as their choice of new math materials

- 8/10 MPS Schools exceeded the state levels on the Dashboard EL Performance Indicator (ELPI)
- Summative ELPAC testing began February 1, 2023. MPS has 661 enrolled EL students as of February 2, 2023, all of whom will be tested.

Supporting ELA Teachers

- Continued onboarding and support of 15 new ELA teachers (43% of our department)
- Hosted 5 ELA department org-wide PLC meetings, with 2 more scheduled this Spring
- Preparing to kick-off the Second Annual ELA essay contest in alignment with the STEAM EXPO

- Along with Traci Lewin, provided professional development on Collaborative Learning Strategies at MSA-3 and MSA-SA, and scheduled for MSA-8 and MSA-2

- Along with MSA Santa Ana Secondary administration, provided support in applying for the ASSETS/21st Century grant


- Monthly administrative meetings with Think Together regional leadership where they provide updates to attendance, staff personnel, and challenges and highlights
