# Proposed Board Recommendation

I move that the board direct staff to provide a Letter of Interest/Program Synopsis responding to the Palm Lane parent community's request for high quality schools interested in serving their students.

# Background

In California, parents of students in chronically under-performing schools have the right to petition for the power to select changes to the governance and program of their children's school. With a majority of signatures from parents with children attending the school, the parents even may choose a charter school to take over the operations of a neighborhood school. This law is commonly known as the "parent trigger law" because parents get to trigger major changes.

Palm Lane Elementary School (see attached information) in Anaheim, California, serves 745 students, a majority of who are English Learners. The school has been chronically underperforming, leading to profound frustration in the part of the parents. Therefore, over the last year, the parents used this law to gain the right to select a charter to replace the district staff, management and governance of their school. The judges ruled that the parents used this process appropriately and now have the right to move forward with their selection.


While it has not yet been decided whether the transition will take place for this fall or the fall of 2016, the parents of Palm Lane have requested Letters of Interests from high performing charter schools. If Magnolia were to take this on, it would require diverting a portion of existing resources to plan and staff the school. While we have not yet fully assessed the level of effort required to successfully carry this out, the Letter of Intent does not bind us to propose. If we were to move forward, the school would be immediately a financially stable model.

### **Budget Implications**


The Broad Foundation is underwriting all legal matters related to this effort. Other expenses are related to the use of staff time.



After steadily increasing for more than 15 years, enrollment in California schools is leveling off and even declining in some areas.

The percentage of Hispanic students continues to grow while the percentages of African-American and white students have declined. Remaining fairly constant is the percentage of students of Asian, Pacific Islander, and Philippine descent. Ed-Data has developed an Ethnic Diversity Index that reflects the degree of variety within a school or district.



Students are identified as English learners until they achieve district-specified scores on state achievement tests and meet other academic criteria. At that point, the district labels the student as RFEP. The FEP category includes both RFEP students and students whose primary language is not English but who scored high enough on a state test of English proficiency to be considered "initially fluent English proficient" (IFEP).
