II. Academic Excellence

A. Dashboard Planning

Shared MAP Assessment for Reading/Language Arts: 86/93 students; school wide 48% with K 54%, 1st 23%, and 2nd 29%. For Math 78/93, school wide 42% with K 64%, 1st 29%, 2nd 28%

Noted that MAP scores are a national indicator and best test to capture student's skills.

B. Leadership Team's Corner

FTE total 94- K 48, 1st 30, 2nd 16

Consistent attendance 89.57%

Six suspensions-2 K, 4 1st or 2nd; 6 physical assault incidents with one student(staff called police about threat)

13 with special student services

MTSS- 6 in process; 12 identified for academic and 1 behavior

Academics-cutoff MAP score of <15% in either Reading or Math as identifiable
