Education and Childcare Sector Vaccinations Are Available March 1

We are still trying to figure out what this will look like based on the message we received today from the LA County Superintendent of Schools below.

A Message from LA County Superintendent of Schools about Vaccinations

Dear Charter School Colleagues,

As of Monday, March 1, individuals in Tier 1B (agriculture and food; education and childcare; emergency services) will be eligible to receive COVID-19 vaccinations. All education staff who live or work in Los Angeles County will have access to vaccination appointments through county-run vaccination sites and health care providers. Educators are encouraged to register with [MyTurn](#) to be notified when appointments become available at the many community vaccination sites across the county.

Additionally, a percentage of the county's weekly doses will be set aside for the education sector and distributed to school districts and their charter schools via their identified vaccination partner. To address persistent inequities and COVID-19's disproportionate impact, the LA County Department of Public Health and the Los Angeles County Office of Education have identified a process to distribute a proportional number of those doses to each school district and their charters weekly. All school districts and charter schools in LA County will receive weekly allocations of vaccines with quantities determined by consideration of equity, weighing COVID-19 community impact and staff risk exposure due to in-person instruction and school-based services.

A percentage of each school district's weekly vaccine allocation will be distributed to charter schools, determined by overall student enrollment in charter programs (i.e., if 9 percent of students in a district attend a charter school, 9 percent of weekly doses would be allocated). Private schools will receive allocations through restricted educator appointments each Tuesday at county-run vaccination sites.

Each school will determine, at their discretion, the weekly staff vaccine appointment list. Schools are advised to prioritize staff with the highest risk exposure due to in-person services currently offered at school sites.

Most school districts have created vaccination partnerships with health care facilities that will receive and administer vaccines to school staff. Districts, charters, and vaccination partners will receive weekly communications from LACDPH with the allocation amount.
