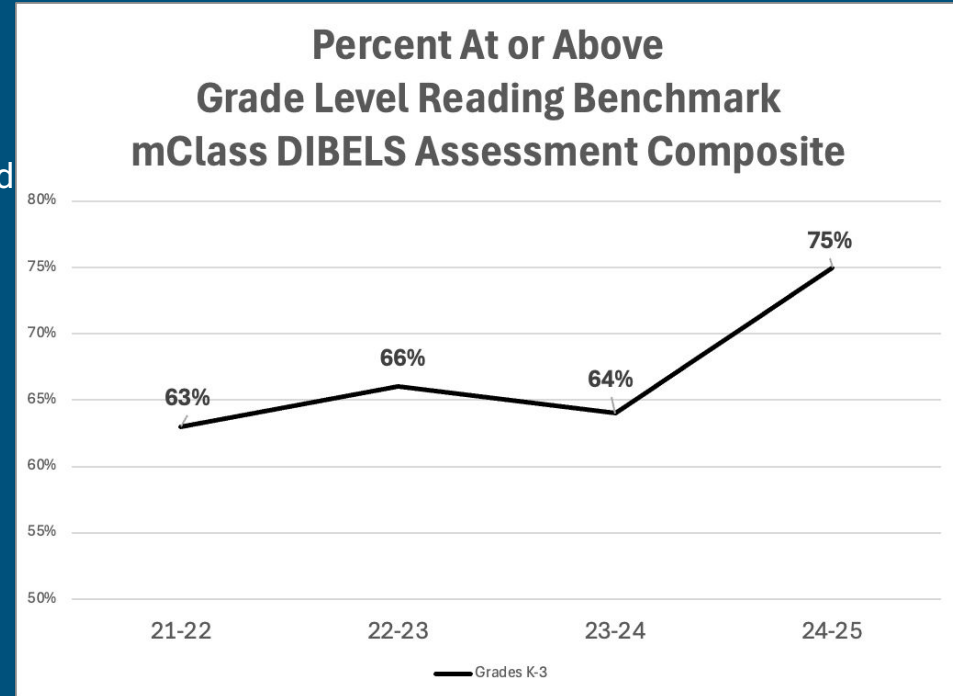

K-3 Reading - DIBELS Assessment Data

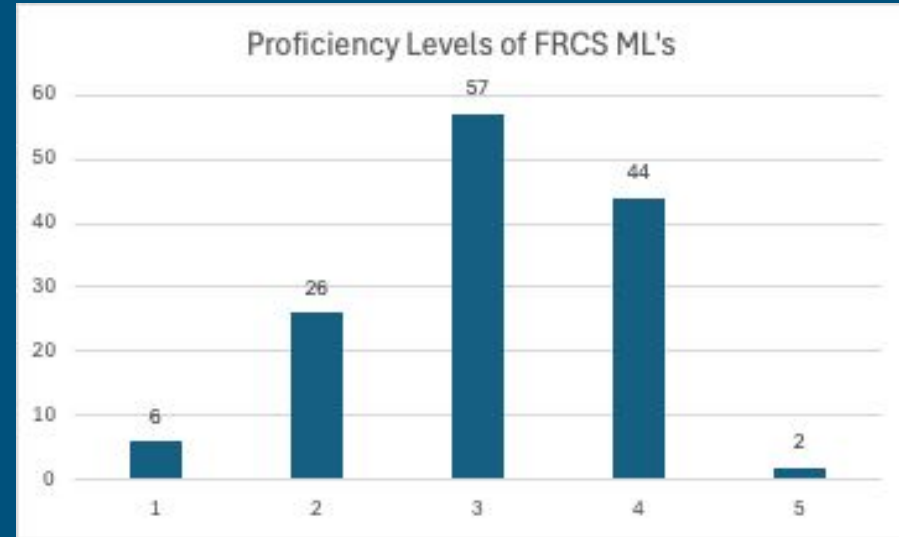
- Assessments are completed through the Amplify Online platform
- **DIBELS assessment is informative for teachers** and provides information to guide instruction, and students are given a composite rating of
 - Above Grade Level Benchmarks
 - At Grade Level Benchmarks
 - Below Grade Level Benchmarks
 - Well Below Grade Level Benchmark
- Results Summary
 - Scores increased significantly in one year, with an **11% increase from the previous spring**.
 - Increases in each grade K-3 from 5% to 22%



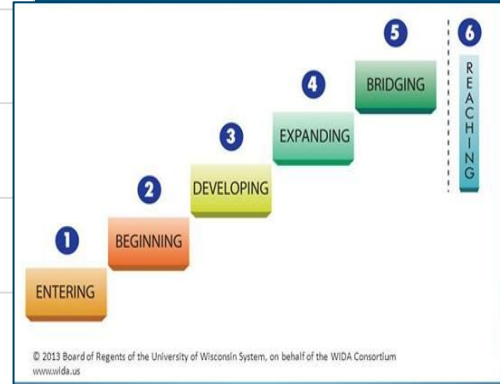
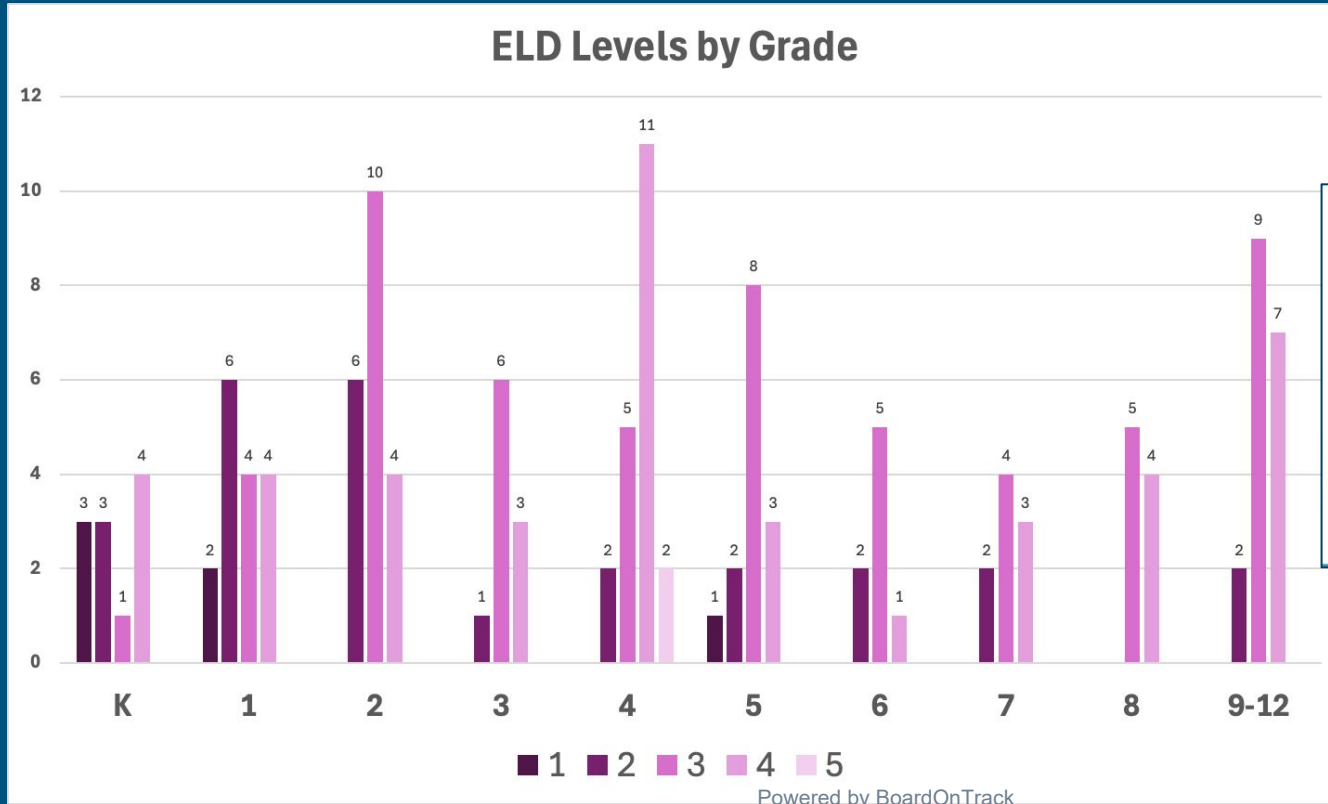
Language Acquisition - ACCESS

English Language Acquisition Data - ACCESS

- **English Language proficiency** levels assess students language development for **multilingual learners (ML's)**.
- 135 FRCS students (~9%) identified as ML's based on home language survey and teacher assessment.
- ML's assessed by the **Massachusetts ACCESS assessment**, given January-February.

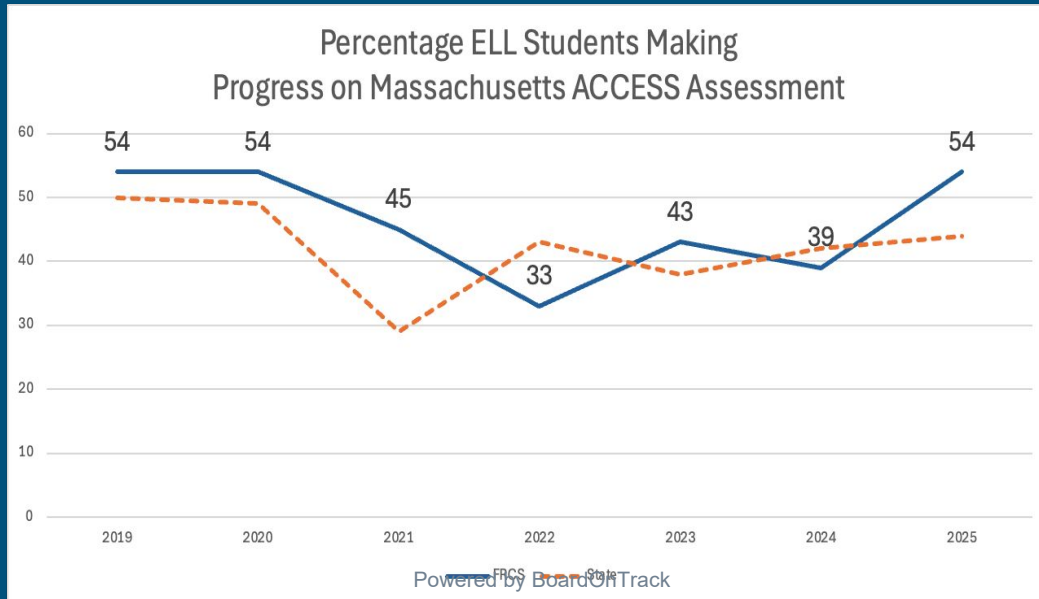


English Language Acquisition Data - ELD Level by Grade



English Language Acquisition Data - ACCESS

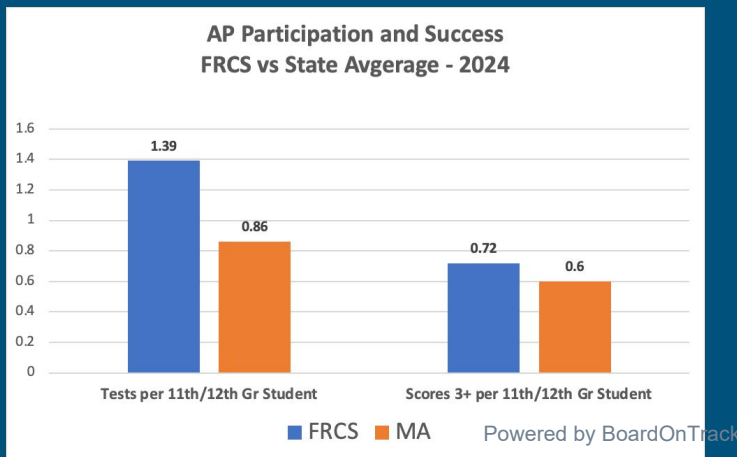
- **Highest percentage of students “making progress”** on ACCESS assessment in past 5 years.
- FRCS ML’s exceeding state average by 10%.
- “Making progress” means that a student is **on track to attain English proficiency within six years** of entering.

College Course Data - AP Program

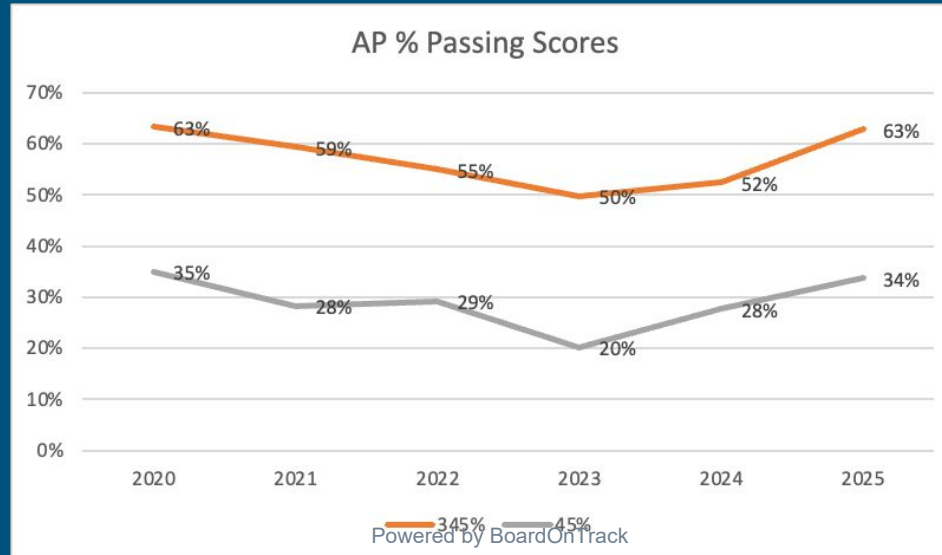
- FRCS students took **202 AP tests** in 23 subjects.
- AP Tests are **scored from 1 to 5**. Scores of 3 or higher are eligible for college credit or placement out of entry-level college courses.
- Research shows **participation in AP courses improves college course success** rates for all students.
- FRCS has **high AP participation and success rates compared to state and sending district averages.**

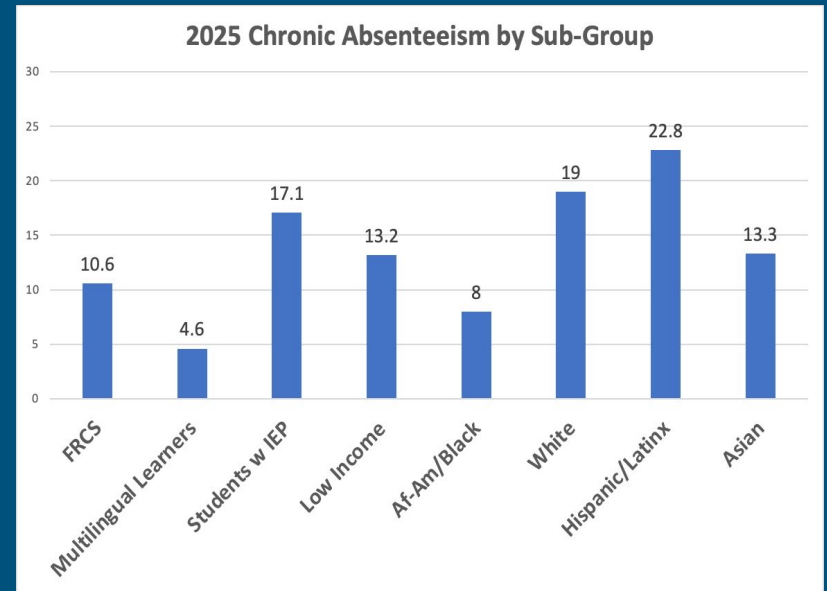
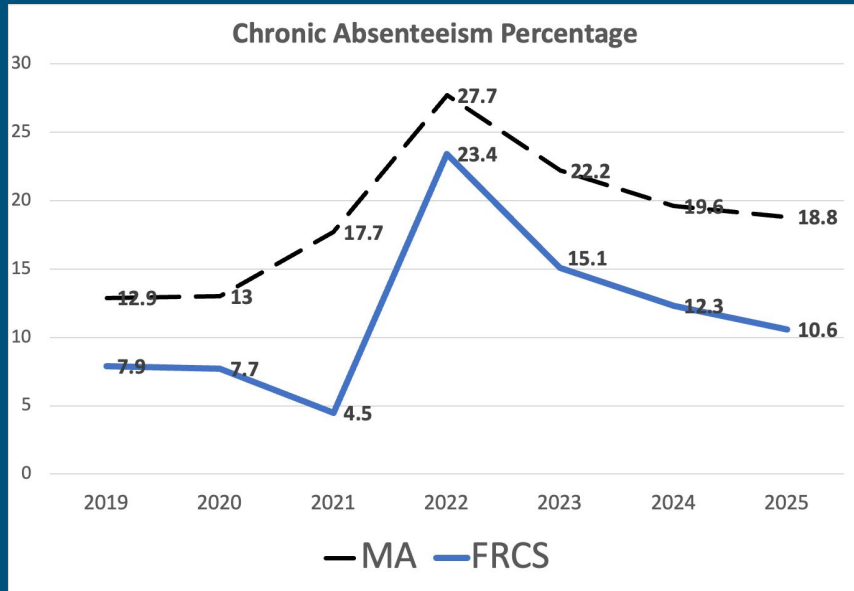
College Course Data - AP Program

- On the 2025 AP, FRCS students had the **highest success rate on AP exams in the last 5 years.** (Success rates can vary inversely with participation rates.)
- The total numbers of students receiving successful scores remained stable, and the **number receiving the highest scores of 4 or 5 increased.**



Chronic Absenteeism Data

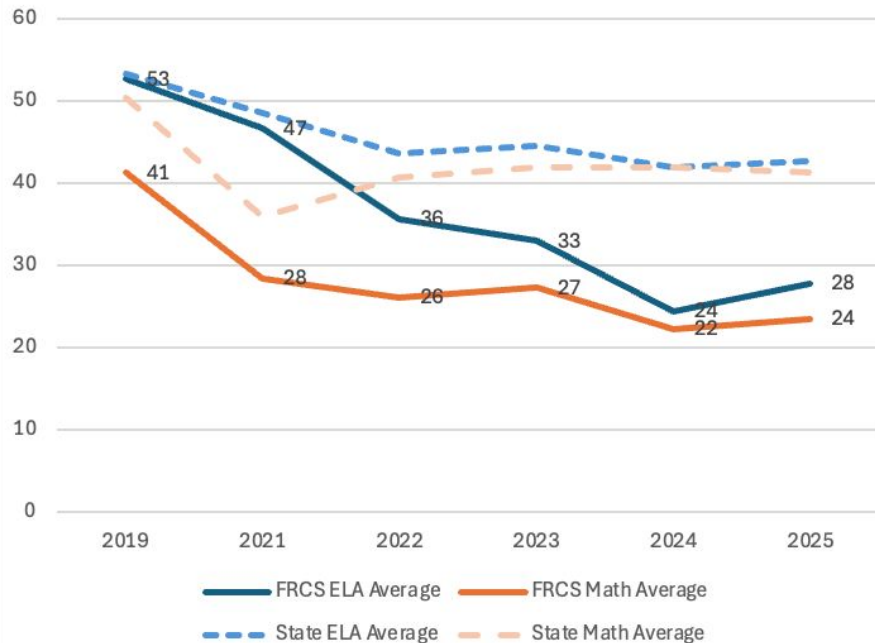

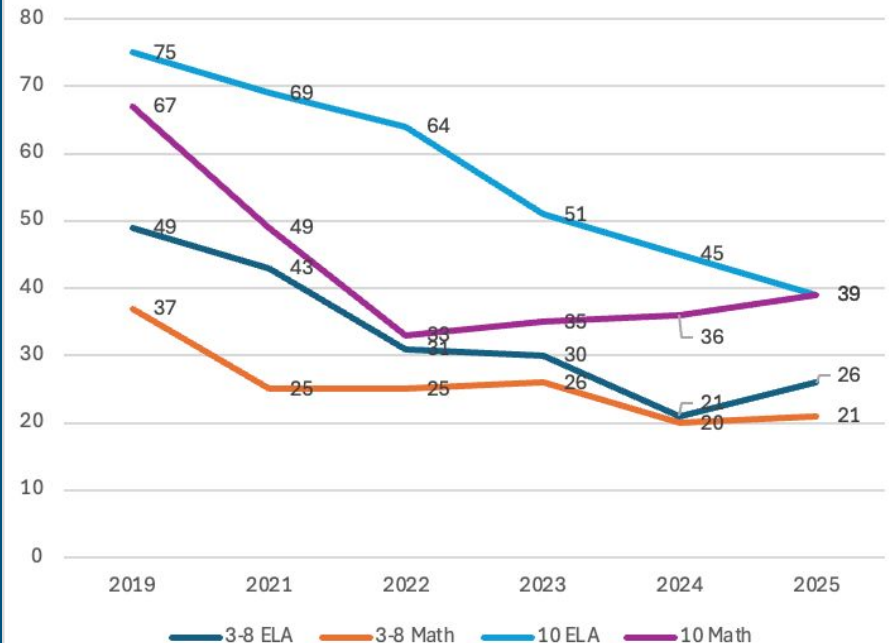

MCAS ELA & Math Proficiency Overall

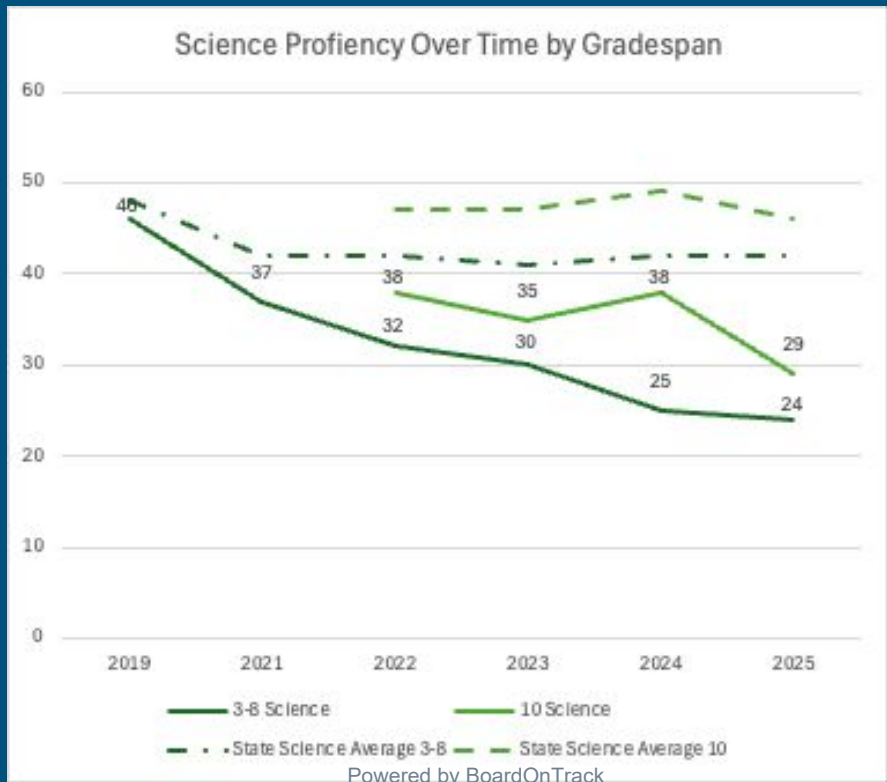
Average Proficiency Over Time



Proficiency Over Time by Gradespan

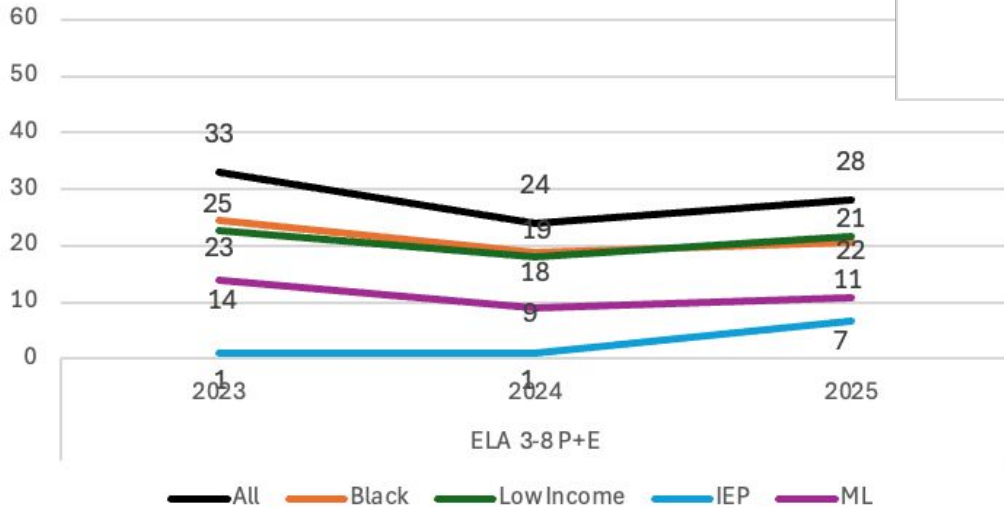


MCAS Science Proficiency Overall

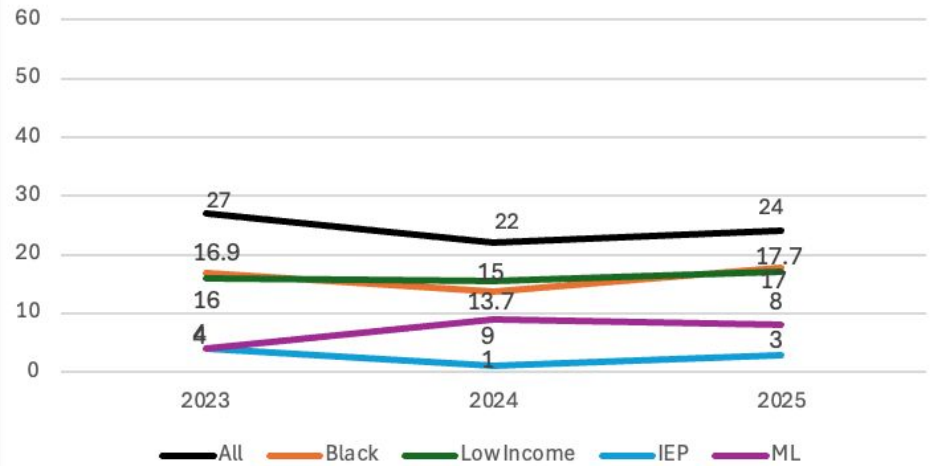


MCAS Proficiency by Sub-Group Over Time

Math MCAS Proficiency Over Time by Group



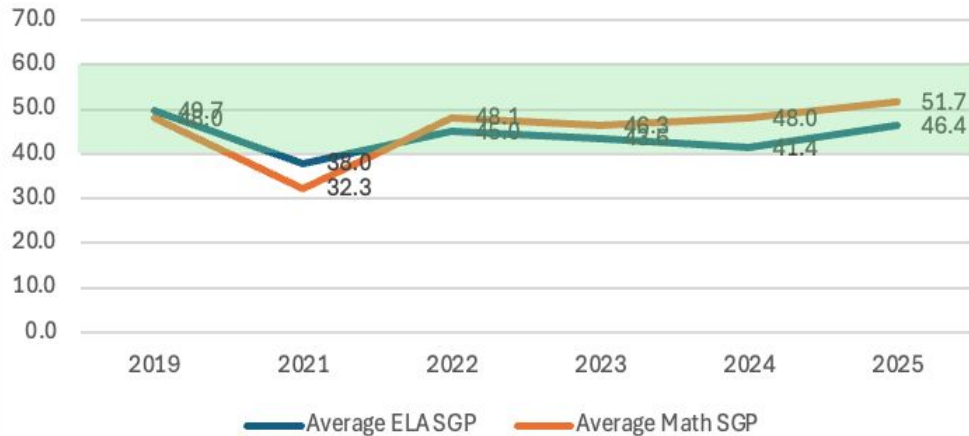

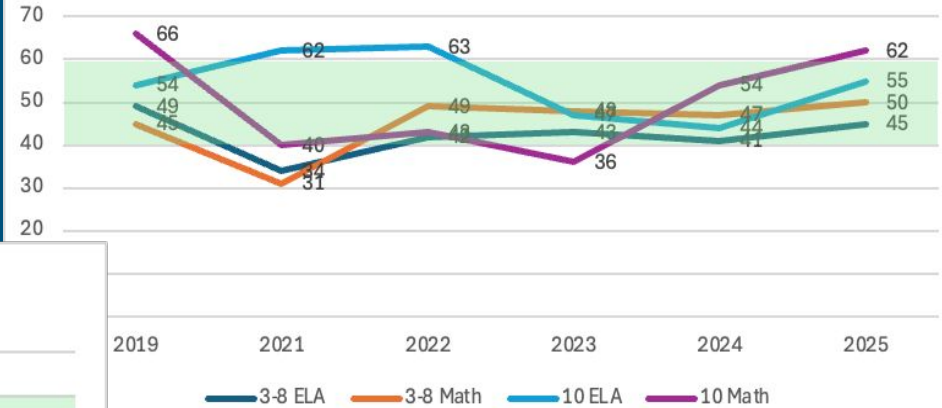

SGP by Grade Span and Subject Over Time

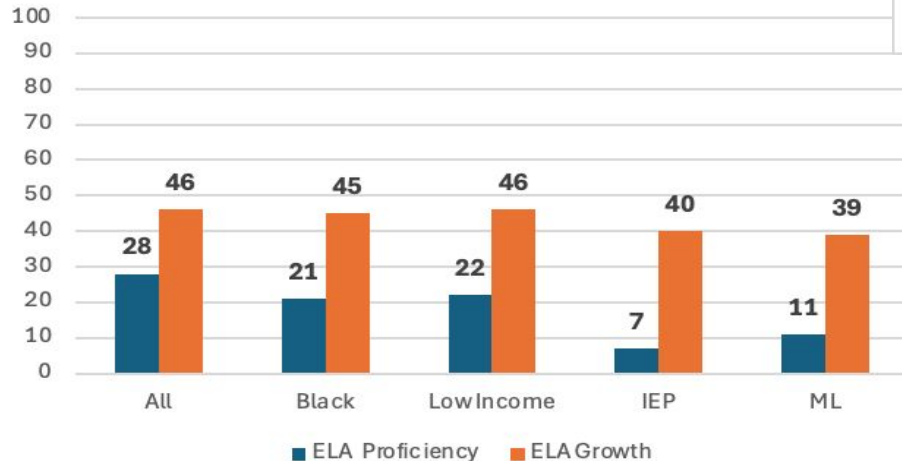


MCAS Proficiency and Growth by Sub-Group

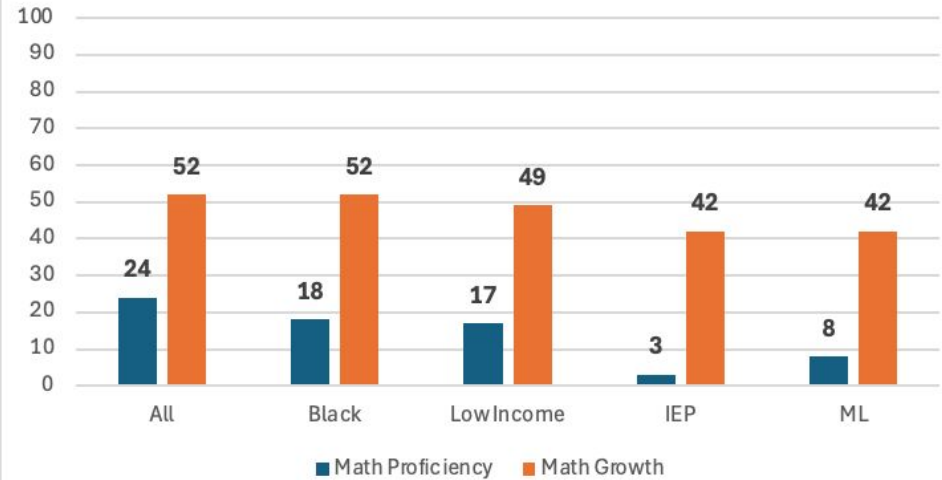
Growth Percentiles Stable by Subgroup

MCAS Math Growth and Proficiency by Group

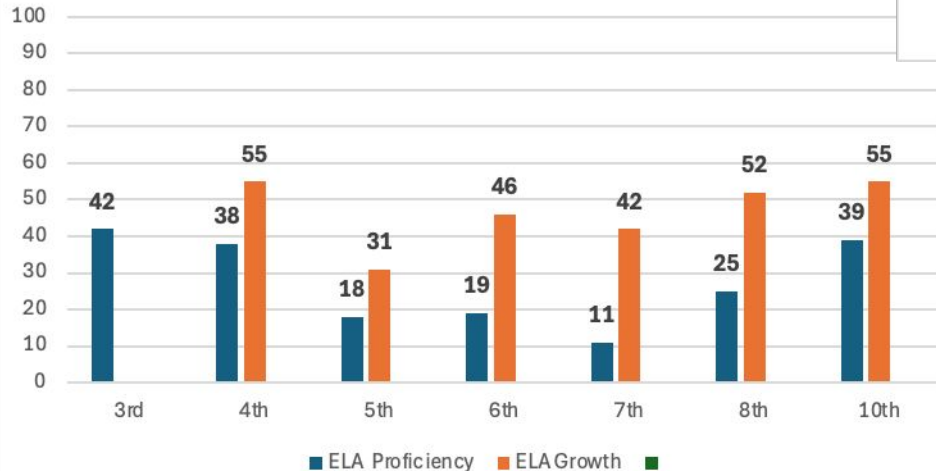


MCAS Proficiency and Growth by Grade

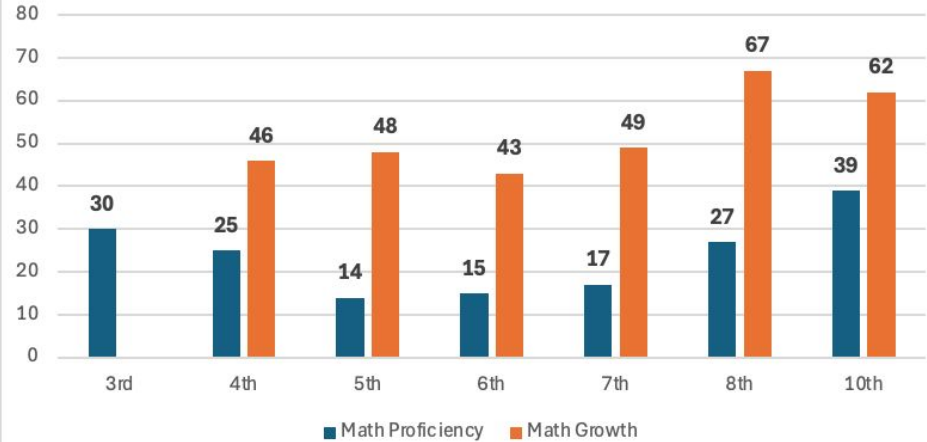

MCAS ELA Growth and Proficiency by Grade



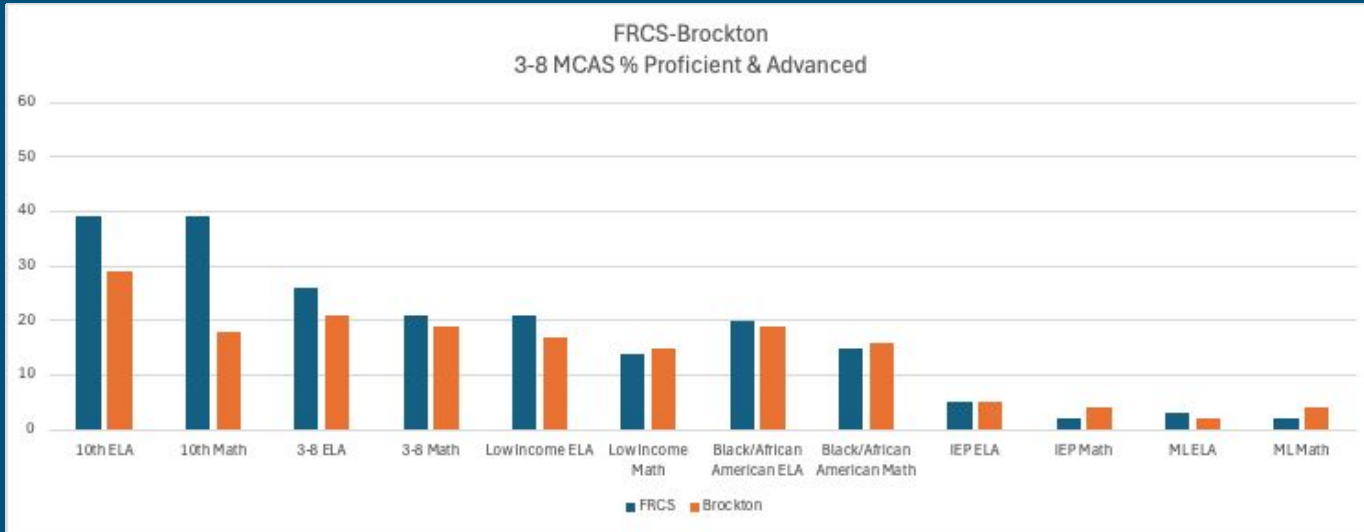
MCAS Math Growth and Proficiency by Grade

- Strongest Results with our **Academic Growth** and **English Learner** proficiency
- Strong High School **Extended Graduation Rates, Attendance Data, and Advanced Coursework**
- **Consistent Improvement** from 2023 to 2024 to 2025 on Accountability System target scorecard. (Increase from 40% of goals to **47% of goals**)

FRCS Areas for Growth

- Overall **Performance in English, Math and Science** still far from targets
- Decrease in **Graduation Rate** in 2024, small number of students decreases rate to 94%

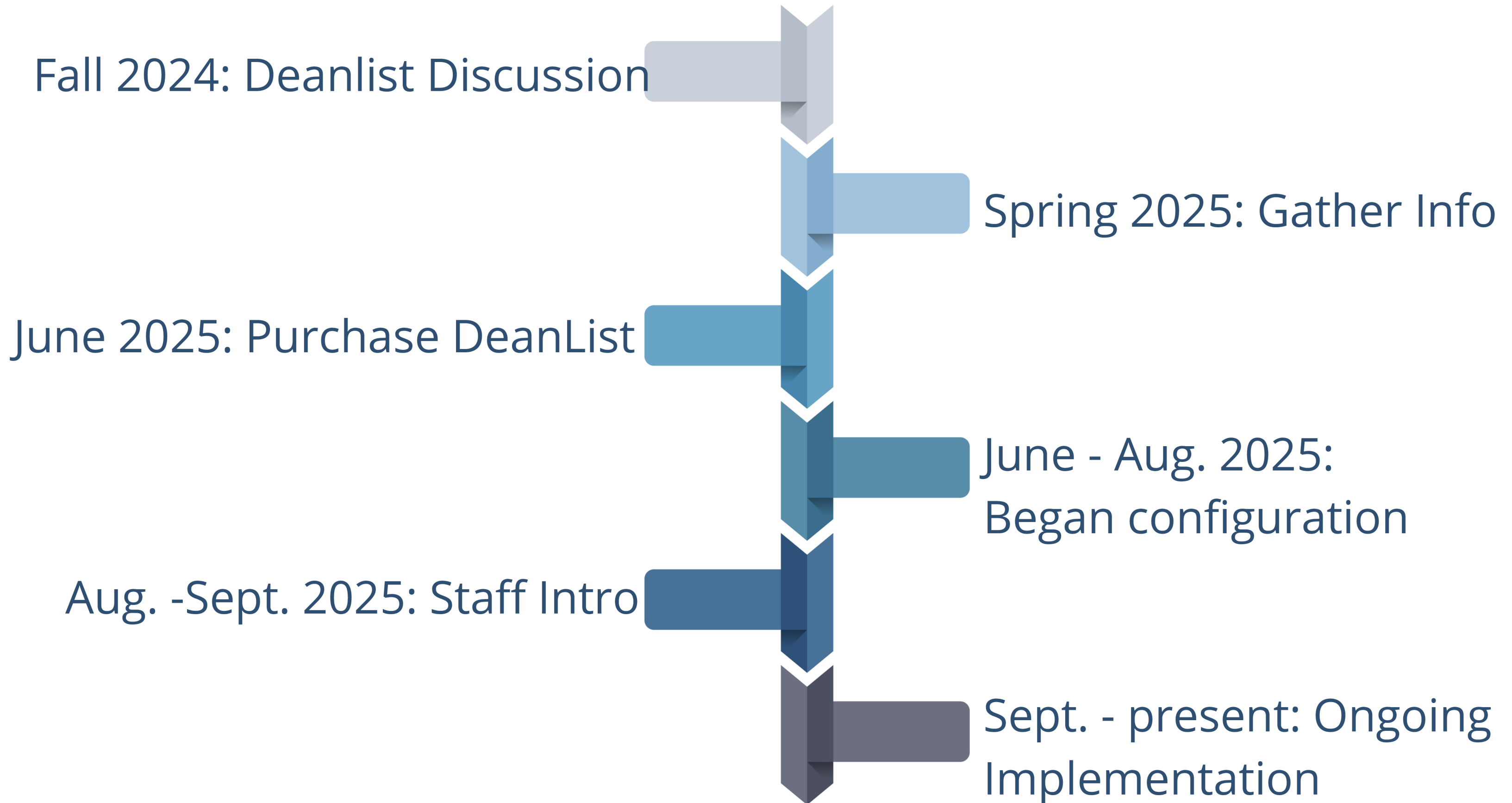

WHY DEANLIST? WHY NOW?

- Multiple systems across buildings previously tracking information related to student behavior (positive and negative), family communication, academic progress, and attendance.
- These systems vary by building and often operated independently, creating inconsistencies and inefficiencies.
- DeansList serves as a centralized, one stop platform that streamlines all of these functions, bringing behavior, communication, academic, and attendance data together in a single platform used by families and staff.

DEANSLIST ONBOARDING & IMPLEMENTATION PLAN

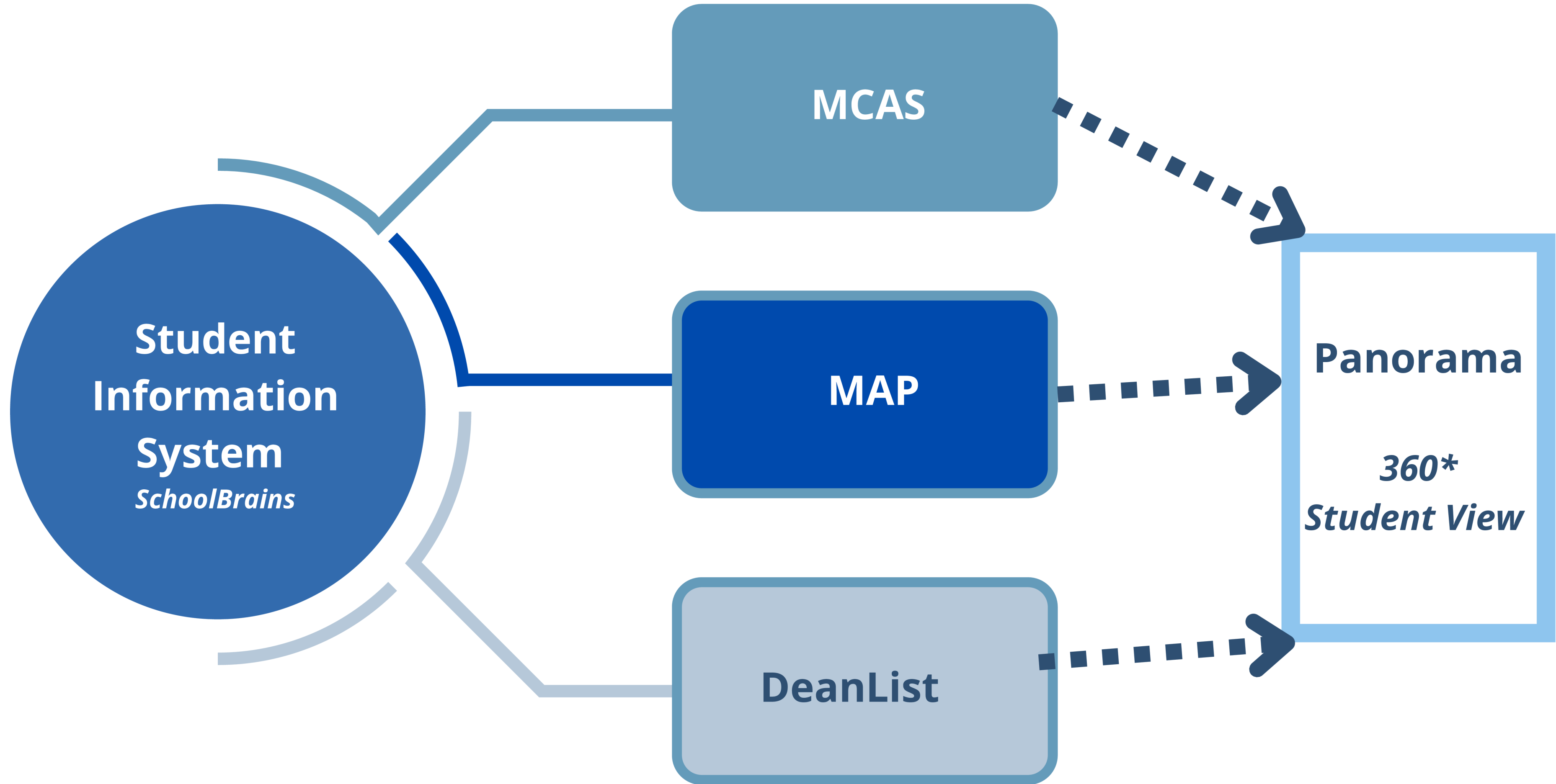


OVERVIEW

DeansList is our **district-wide** data and communication platform designed to track, analyze, and communicate about the following:

- Student behavior, both positive and areas for growth
- Student attendance - both daily and period
- Student academic progress
- Family engagement

OVERVIEW



KEY FEATURES

Behavior & Culture Tracking

- **Positive and corrective behavior logging:** Teachers can record merits, demerits, shout-outs
- **Customizable behavior categories:** Each of our schools set their own expectations, and point systems geared to their students
- **Automatic totals and summaries:** Weekly or daily reports show behavior points by student, class, or grade.

Attendance Tracking

- Attendance is synced right from School Brains
- Schools **set parameters** to flag:
 - In accordance with our attendance process schools set thresholds to flag attendance issues.
 - School can send automated notifications to families.
 - The system tracks intervention notes for students with chronic absenteeism.

KEY FEATURES

Family Communication

- Staff can message families directly, with all communication automatically logged to the student record.
- Automatic translation supports communication in multiple languages.
- Announcements can be sent to selected groups.
- Families can view real time updates on points, attendance, and notes when fully up and running.
