EDUCATION FOR FOSTER AND MOBILE YOUTH POLICY

Introduction

The Governing Board of Amethod Public Schools ("AMPS" or the "Charter School") recognizes that Foster and Mobile Youth may face significant barriers to achieving academic success due to their family circumstances, disruption to their educational program, and their emotional, social, and other health needs. To enable such students to achieve state and charter school academic standards, the Charter School shall provide them with full access to the Charter School's educational program and implement strategies identified as required by law and necessary for the improvement of the academic achievement of foster youth in the Charter School's local control and accountability plan ("LCAP").

Definitions

- <u>"Foster youth</u>" means a child who has been removed from their home pursuant to California Welfare and Institutions Code section 309 and/or is the subject of a petition filed under Welfare and Institutions Code section 300 or 602. This includes children who are the subject of cases in dependency court and juvenile justice court.
- *"Former juvenile court school pupil"*, means a pupil who, upon completion of the pupil's second year of high school, transfers from a juvenile court school to the Charter School.
- *"Child of a military family"* refers to a student who resides in the household of an active duty military member.
- "Currently Migratory Child" refers to a child who, within the last 12-months, has moved with a parent, guardian, or other person having custody to the Charter School from another Local Educational Agency ("LEA"), either within California or from another state, so that the child or a member of the child's immediate family might secure temporary or seasonal employment in an agricultural or fishing activity, and whose parents or guardians have been informed of the child's eligibility for migrant education services. "Currently Migratory Child" includes a child who, without the parent/guardian, has continued to migrate annually to secure temporary or seasonal employment in an agricultural or fishing activity.
- *"Pupil participating in a newcomer program"* means a pupil who is participating in a program designed to meet the academic and transitional needs of newly arrived immigrant pupils that has as a primary objective the development of English language proficiency.
- *"Educational Rights Holder" ("ERH")* means a parent, guardian, responsible adult appointed by a court to make educational decisions for a minor pursuant to Welfare and Institutions Code sections 319, 361 or 726, or a person holding the right to make educational decisions for the pupil pursuant to Education Code section 56055.

Commented [MB2]: ONLY for purposes of computing Local Control Funding Formula, no later than 2020-21 fiscal year, the definition of "foster youth" will include A dependent child of the court of an Indian tribe, consortium of tribes, or tribal organization who is the subject of a petition filed in the tribal court pursuant to the tribal court's jurisdiction in accordance with the tribe's law, provided that the child would also meet one of the descriptions in Section 300 of the Welfare and Institutions Code describing when a child may be adjudged a dependent child of the juvenile court. (Ed. Code section 42238.01(b)(4).)

- "School of origin" means the school that the foster youth attended when permanently housed or the school in which the foster youth was last enrolled. If the school the foster youth attended when permanently housed is different from the school in which the student was last enrolled, or if there is some other school that the foster youth attended within the immediately preceding 15 months, the Charter School liaison for foster youth, in consultation with and with the agreement of the foster youth and the ERH for the youth, shall determine, in the best interests of the foster youth, the school that shall be deemed the school of origin.
- *"Best interests"* means that, in making educational and school placement decisions for a foster youth, consideration is given to, among other factors, the opportunity to be educated in the least restrictive educational program and the foster youth's access to academic resources, services, and extracurricular and enrichment activities that are available to all Charter School students.

Within this Policy, foster/juvenile court youth, former juvenile court school pupils, a child of a military family, a currently migratory child, and a pupil participating in the newcomer program will be referred to collectively as "Foster and Mobile Youth."

Foster and Mobile Youth Liaison

In order to help facilitate the enrollment, placement, and transfer of Foster and Mobile Youth to the Charter School, the Governing Board shall designate a Foster and Mobile Youth liaison. The Governing Board designates the following position as the Charter School's liaison for Foster and Mobile Youth:

The Foster and Mobile Youth Liaison shall be responsible for the following:

- 1. Ensure and facilitate the proper educational placement, enrollment in the Charter School, and checkout from the Charter School of Foster and Mobile Youth.
- 2. Ensure proper transfer of credits, records, and grades when Foster and Mobile Youth transfer to or from the Charter School.
- 3. When a foster youth is enrolling in the Charter School, the Foster and Mobile Youth Liaison shall contact the school last attended by the student within two (2) business days to obtain all academic and other records. The last school attended by the foster youth shall provide all required records to the new school regardless of any outstanding fees, fines, textbooks, or other items or moneys owed to the school last attended. When a foster youth is transferring to a new school, the Foster and Mobile Youth Liaison shall provide the student's records to the new school within two (2) business days of receiving the new school's request, regardless of any outstanding fees, fines, textbooks, or other items or moneys owed to the Charter School.
- 4. When required by law, notify the foster youth's attorney and the appropriate representative of the county child welfare agency at least ten (10) calendar days preceding the date of the following:

However, there are many rights and procedures that need to be tracked in regards to all the youth addressed in this policy, therefore we recommend including these duties in the duties of the Foster (And highly mobile) Youth liaison, as here

- a. An expulsion hearing for a discretionary act under the Charter School's charter.
- b. Any meeting to extend a suspension until an expulsion decision is rendered if the decision to recommend expulsion is a discretionary act under the Charter School's charter. The foster youth's attorney and the agency representative will be invited to participate.
- c. A manifestation determination meeting prior to a change in the foster youth's placement if the change in placement is due to an act for which the recommendation for expulsion is discretionary and the student is a student with a disability under state and federal special education laws. The foster youth's attorney and the agency representative will be invited to participate.
- 5. As needed, make appropriate referrals to ensure that students in foster care receive necessary special education services and services under Section 504 of the federal Rehabilitation Act of 1973.
- 6. As needed, ensure that students in foster care receive appropriate school-based services, such as counseling and health services, supplemental instruction, and after-school services.
- 7. Develop protocols and procedures for creating awareness for Charter School staff, including but not limited to principals, deans, and attendance clerks, of the requirements for the proper enrollment, placement, and transfer of foster youth.
- 8. Collaborate with the county placing agency, social services, probation officers, juvenile court officers, and other appropriate agencies to help coordinate services for the Charter School's foster youth.
- 9. Monitor the educational progress of foster youth and provide reports to the Chief Executive Officer or designee and the Governing Board based on indicators identified in the Charter School's local control and accountability plan.

This Policy does not grant the Foster and Mobile Youth Liaison authority that supersedes the authority granted under state and federal law to a parent or legal guardian retaining educational rights, a responsible person appointed by the court to represent the child pursuant to Welfare and Institutions Code sections 319, 361 or 726, a surrogate parent, or a foster parent exercising authority under Education Code section 56055. The role of the Foster and Mobile Youth Liaison is advisory with respect to placement options and determination of the school of origin.

School Stability and Enrollment

The Charter School will work with foster youth and their ERH to ensure that each foster youth is placed in the least restrictive educational programs and has access to the academic resources, services, and extracurricular and enrichment activities that are available to all students, including, but not limited to, interscholastic sports. All decisions regarding a foster youth's education and placement will be based on the best interest of the child and shall consider, among other factors, educational stability and the opportunity to be educated in the least restrictive educational setting necessary to achieve academic progress.

Foster youth, currently migratory children, and children of military families have the right to remain in their school of origin if it is their best interest. The Charter School will immediately enroll a foster youth, a currently migratory child, or child of a military family seeking reenrollment in the Charter School as their school of origin.

A foster youth, currently migratory child, or child of a military family who seeks to transfer to the Charter School will be immediately enrolled (subject to the Charter School's capacity, if the Charter School is not the student's school of origin, and pursuant to the procedures stated in the Charter School's charter and Board policy) even if the student has outstanding fees, fines, textbooks, or other items or monies due to the school last attended or is unable to meet normal enrollment documentation or school uniform requirements (e.g. producing medical records or academic records from a previous school).

At the initial detention or placement, or any subsequent change in placement, a foster youth may continue in their school of origin for the duration of the court's jurisdiction. A currently migratory child or child of a military family may continue in their school of origin as long as the student meets the definition of a currently migratory child or child of a military family as described above. Foster youth, currently migratory children, and children of military families have the right to remain in their school of origin following the termination of the court's jurisdiction or termination of the child's status as a currently migratory child or child of a military family, as follows:

- 1. For students in Kindergarten through eighth grade, inclusive, the student will be allowed to continue in the school of origin through the duration of the academic year in which the student's status changed.
- 2. For students enrolled in high school, the student will be allowed to continue in the school of origin through graduation.

If the foster youth, currently migratory child or child of a military family is transitioning between school grade levels, the youth shall be allowed to continue in the district of origin in the same attendance area to provide the youth the benefit of matriculating with their peers in accordance with the established feeder patterns of school districts. A student who is transitioning to a middle school or high school shall be allowed to enroll in the school designated for matriculation in another school district.

The Foster and Mobile Youth Liaison may, in consultation with and with the agreement of the foster youth and the ERH for the foster youth, recommend that the foster youth's right to attend the school of origin be waived and the student be enrolled in any district school that the student would otherwise be eligible to attend as a resident of the school district or in the Charter School consistent with current enrollment procedures. All decisions shall be made in accordance with the foster youth's best interests.

Prior to making any recommendation to move a foster youth from their school of origin, the Foster and Mobile Youth Liaison shall provide the foster youth and the foster youth's ERH with a written explanation of the basis for the recommendation and how the recommendation serves the foster youth's best interests.

If any dispute arises regarding a foster youth's request to remain in the Charter School as the foster youth's school of origin, the foster youth has the right to remain in the Charter School pending resolution of the dispute. The dispute shall be resolved in accordance with the existing Charter School dispute resolution process.

Commented [MB13]: Although this provision is applicable to school districts, we have left this provision in the policy because many of our charter students are transitioning between school districts and charter schools. This provision is not applicable to charter schools, but can provide guidance if a liaison has questions about whether a student has right to return to the district if that is the school of origin.

Commented [MB14]: This provision has been revised to be consistent with charter school law. Specifically, the provision applies to attendance areas for **school districts**, but if the charter school is not the school of origin and the student is accepted through the regular enrollment procedures, by extension this provision would likely still apply. Accordingly the following language has been added: "or in the Charter School consistent with current enrollment procedures."

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Transportation

The Charter School shall not be responsible for providing transportation to allow a foster youth to attend school, unless there is an agreement with a local child welfare agency that the Charter School assumes part or all of the transportation costs in accordance with Section 6312(c)(5) of Title 20 of the United States Code, or unless required by federal law. The Charter School is not prohibited from providing transportation, at its discretion, to allow a foster youth to attend school.

In accordance with Section 6312(c)(5) of Title 20 of the United States Code, the Charter School shall collaborate with local child welfare agencies to develop and implement clear written procedures to address the transportation needs of foster youth to maintain them in their school of origin, when it is in the best interest of the youth.

For any student who has an individualized education program ("IEP"), the student's IEP team will determine if the student requires special education transportation as a related service regardless of the student's status.

Effect of Absences on Grades

The grades of a foster youth shall not be lowered for any absence from the Charter School that is due to either of the following circumstances:

- a. A decision by a court or placement agency to change the student's placement, in which case the student's grades shall be calculated as of the date the student left school.
- b. A verified court appearance or related court-ordered activity.

Transfer of Coursework and Credits

The Charter School shall accept coursework satisfactorily completed by a Foster and Mobile Youth while attending another public school¹, a juvenile court school, a charter school, a school in a country other than the United States, or a nonpublic, nonsectarian school or agency even if the student did not complete the entire course and shall issue that student full or partial credit for the coursework completed.

If the Foster and Mobile Youth did not complete the entire course, the student shall be issued partial credit for the coursework completed and shall not be required to retake the portion of the course that the student completed at another school unless the Charter School, in consultation with the student's ERH, finds that the student is reasonably able to complete the requirements in time to graduate from high school. Whenever partial credit is issued to a Foster and Mobile Youth in any particular course, the student shall be enrolled in the same or equivalent course, if applicable, so that the student may continue and complete the entire course.

In no event shall the Charter School prevent a Foster and Mobile Youth from taking or retaking a course to meet the eligibility requirements for admission to the California State University or the University of California.

¹ For purposes of coursework completed by a student who is a child of a military family, "public school" includes schools operated by the United States Department of Defense.1



Applicability of Graduation Requirements

To obtain a high school diploma from the Charter School, a student must complete all courses required by the Charter School and fulfill any additional graduation requirements prescribed by the Board. However, Foster and Mobile Youth who transfer to the Charter School any time after the completion of their second year of high school, and pupils participating in a newcomer program who are in their third or fourth year of high school, shall be exempt from any of the Charter School's graduation requirements that are in excess of the California minimum graduation requirements specified in Education Code section 51225.3 ("additional graduation requirements") unless the Charter School makes a finding that the student is reasonably able to complete the Charter School's graduation requirements by the end of the student's fourth year of high school.

To determine whether a Foster and Mobile Youth is in their third or fourth year of high school, either the number of credits the student has earned to the date of transfer or the length of the student's school enrollment may be used, whichever will qualify the student for the exemption. For a pupil participating in a newcomer program, enrollment in grade 11 or 12 may be used to determine whether the student is in their third or fourth year of high school.

Within thirty (30) calendar days of the date that a student who may qualify for exemption under the above requirements transfers into the Charter School, the Charter School shall notify the student, the ERH, and where applicable, the student's social worker or probation officer, of the availability of the exemption and whether the student qualifies for the exemption. If the Charter School fails to provide timely notice of the availability of the exemption, the Foster and Mobile Youth shall be eligible for the exemption from the additional graduation requirements once notified, even if that notification occurs after the termination of the court's jurisdiction over the student, if the foster youth otherwise qualifies for the exemption.

If a student is exempted from the Charter School's additional graduation requirements pursuant to this Policy and completes the statewide coursework requirements specified in Educational Code section 51225.3 before the end of their fourth year of high school and that student would otherwise be entitled to remain in attendance at the Charter School, the Charter School shall not require or request that the student graduate before the end of their fourth year of high school.

The Chief Executive Officer or designee shall notify a Foster and Mobile Youth and their ERH if the Charter School grants an exemption from the additional graduation requirements, how any requirements that are waived will affect the student's ability to gain admission to a postsecondary educational institution, and shall provide information about transfer opportunities available through the California Community Colleges.

A Foster and Mobile Youth who would otherwise be entitled to remain in attendance at the Charter School shall not be required to accept the exemption from additional graduation requirements or be denied enrollment in, or the ability to complete, courses for which the student is otherwise eligible, including courses necessary to attend an institution of higher education, regardless of whether those courses are required for statewide graduation requirements.

If an eligible student is not exempted from additional graduation requirements or has previously declined the exemption pursuant to this Policy, the Charter School shall exempt the student at any time if an exemption is requested by the youth and the youth qualifies for the exemption. Likewise, if the youth is

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exempted, the Charter School may not revoke the exemption.

If a Foster and Mobile Youth is exempted from additional graduation requirements pursuant to this section, the exemption shall continue to apply after the termination of the court's jurisdiction over the student or after the termination of circumstances which make the Student eligible while he or she is enrolled in school or if the student transfers to another school, including a charter school, or school district.

The Charter School shall not require or request a Foster and Mobile Youth to transfer schools in order to qualify for an exemption from additional graduation requirements, and no Foster and Mobile Youth or any person acting on behalf of a Foster and Mobile Youth may request a transfer solely to qualify for an exemption from the Charter School's additional graduation requirements.

Upon making a finding that a Foster and Mobile Youth is reasonably able to complete the Charter School's graduation requirements within the student's fifth year of high school, the Chief Executive Officer or designee shall:

- 1. Inform the student and the student's ERH of the student's option to remain in school for a fifth year to complete the Charter School's graduation requirements, consistent with the laws regarding continuous enrollment and satisfactory progress for Charter School students over age 19.
- 2. Inform the student and the student's ERH how remaining in school for a fifth year will affect the student's ability to gain admission to a postsecondary educational institution.
- 3. Provide information to the student about transfer opportunities available through the California Community Colleges.
- 4. Upon agreement with the student or, if the student is under 18 years of age, the ERH, permit the student to stay in school for a fifth year to complete the Charter School's graduation requirements.

If a juvenile court youth satisfies the requirements for high school graduation while enrolled at a juvenile court school but has elected to decline the issuance of the diploma for the purpose of taking additional coursework, the Charter School will not prevent the juvenile court youth from enrolling in the Charter School and pursuing additional coursework if requested by the youth or by the youth's ERH.

Eligibility for Extracurricular Activities

A student who is in foster care whose residence changes pursuant to a court order or decision of a child welfare worker shall be immediately deemed to meet all residency requirements for participation in interscholastic sports or other extracurricular activities.

Waiver of Fees for Afterschool Programs

The Charter School shall not charge any student who the Charter School knows is currently in foster care any family fees associated with an After-School Education and Safety ("ASES") Program operated by the Charter School.

Student Records

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Commented [MB15]: This is technically not required per the language of the law, but we recommend as a best practice informing educational rights holders of such information if the student is under 18 years of age. When the Charter School receives a transfer request and/or student records request for the educational information and records of a foster youth from a new LEA, the Charter School shall provide these student records within two (2) business days. The Charter School shall compile the complete educational record of the student, including but not limited to a determination of seat time, full or partial credits earned, current classes and grades, immunization and other records, and, if applicable, a copy of the student's special education records including assessments, IEPs, and/or 504 plans. All requests for student records will be shared with the Foster and Mobile Youth Liaison, who shall be aware of the specific educational record keeping needs of Foster and Mobile Youth.

In accordance with the Charter School's Educational Records and Student Information Policy, under limited circumstances, the Charter School may disclose student records or personally identifiable information contained in those records to certain requesting parties including but not limited to a foster family agency and state and local authorities within a juvenile justice system, without parental consent.

Complaints of Noncompliance

Complaints of noncompliance with this Policy shall be governed by the Charter School's Uniform Complaint Procedures. A copy of the Uniform Complaint Policy and Procedures is available upon request at the main office.

Education For Foster and Mobile Youth Policy

Introduction

The Governing Board of Amethod Public Schools ("AMPS" or the "Charter School") recognizes that Foster and Mobile Youth may face significant barriers to achieving academic success due to their family circumstances, disruption to their educational program, and their emotional, social, and other health needs. To enable such students to achieve state and charter school academic standards, the Charter School shall provide them with full access to the Charter School's educational program and implement strategies identified as required by law and necessary for the improvement of the academic achievement of foster youth in the Charter School's local control and accountability plan ("LCAP").

Definitions

- *"Foster youth"* means a child who has been removed from their home pursuant to California Welfare and Institutions Code section 309 and/or is the subject of a petition filed under Welfare and Institutions Code section 300 or 602. This includes children who are the subject of cases in dependency court and juvenile justice court.
- *"Former juvenile court school pupil"* means a pupil who, upon completion of the pupil's second year of high school, transfers from a juvenile court school to the Charter School.
- *"Child of a military family"* refers to a student who resides in the household of an active duty military member.
- "Currently Migratory Child" refers to a child who, within the last 12-months, has moved with a
 parent, guardian, or other person having custody to the Charter School from another Local
 Educational Agency ("LEA"), either within California or from another state, so that the child or a
 member of the child's immediate family might secure temporary or seasonal employment in an
 agricultural or fishing activity, and whose parents or guardians have been informed of the child's
 eligibility for migrant education services. "Currently Migratory Child" includes a child who, without
 the parent/guardian, has continued to migrate annually to secure temporary or seasonal
 employment in an agricultural or fishing activity.
- *"Pupil participating in a newcomer program"* means a pupil who is participating in a program designed to meet the academic and transitional needs of newly arrived immigrant pupils that has as a primary objective the development of English language proficiency.
- *"Educational Rights Holder" ("ERH")* means a parent, guardian, responsible adult appointed by a court to make educational decisions for a minor pursuant to Welfare and Institutions Code sections 319, 361 or 726, or a person holding the right to make educational decisions for the pupil pursuant to Education Code section 56055.



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- "School of origin" means the school that the foster youth attended when permanently housed or the school in which the foster youth was last enrolled. If the school the foster youth attended when permanently housed is different from the school in which the student was last enrolled, or if there is some other school that the foster youth attended within the immediately preceding 15 months, the Charter School liaison for foster youth, in consultation with and with the agreement of the foster youth and the ERH for the youth, shall determine, in the best interests of the foster youth, the school that shall be deemed the school of origin.
- *"Best interests"* means that, in making educational and school placement decisions for a foster youth, consideration is given to, among other factors, the opportunity to be educated in the least restrictive educational program and the foster youth's access to academic resources, services, and extracurricular and enrichment activities that are available to all Charter School students.

Within this Policy, foster/juvenile court youth, former juvenile court school pupils, a child of a military family, a currently migratory child, and a pupil participating in the newcomer program will be referred to collectively as "Foster and Mobile Youth."

Foster and Mobile Youth Liaison

In order to help facilitate the enrollment, placement, and transfer of Foster and Mobile Youth to the Charter School, the Governing Board shall designate a Foster and Mobile Youth liaison. The Governing Board designates the Site Director from each site as the Charter School's liaison for Foster and Mobile Youth:

The Foster and Mobile Youth Liaison shall be responsible for the following:

- 1. Ensure and facilitate the proper educational placement, enrollment in the Charter School, and checkout from the Charter School of Foster and Mobile Youth.
- 2. Ensure proper transfer of credits, records, and grades when Foster and Mobile Youth transfer to or from the Charter School.
- 3. When a foster youth is enrolling in the Charter School, the Foster and Mobile Youth Liaison shall contact the school last attended by the student within two (2) business days to obtain all academic and other records. The last school attended by the foster youth shall provide all required records to the new school regardless of any outstanding fees, fines, textbooks, or other items or moneys owed to the school last attended. When a foster youth is transferring to a new school, the Foster and Mobile Youth Liaison shall provide the student's records to the new school within two (2) business days of receiving the new school's request, regardless of any outstanding fees, fines, textbooks, or other items or moneys owed to the charter School.
- 4. When required by law, notify the foster youth's attorney and the appropriate representative of the county child welfare agency at least ten (10) calendar days preceding the date of the



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following:

- a. An expulsion hearing for a discretionary act under the Charter School's charter.
- b. Any meeting to extend a suspension until an expulsion decision is rendered if the decision to recommend expulsion is a discretionary act under the Charter School's charter. The foster youth's attorney and the agency representative will be invited to participate.
- c. A manifestation determination meeting prior to a change in the foster youth's placement if the change in placement is due to an act for which the recommendation for expulsion is discretionary and the student is a student with a disability under state and federal special education laws. The foster youth's attorney and the agency representative will be invited to participate.
- 5. As needed, make appropriate referrals to ensure that students in foster care receive necessary special education services and services under Section 504 of the federal Rehabilitation Act of 1973.
- 6. As needed, ensure that students in foster care receive appropriate school-based services, such as counseling and health services, supplemental instruction, and after-school services.
- 7. Develop protocols and procedures for creating awareness for Charter School staff, including but not limited to principals, deans, and attendance clerks, of the requirements for the proper enrollment, placement, and transfer of foster youth.
- 8. Collaborate with the county placing agency, social services, probation officers, juvenile court officers, and other appropriate agencies to help coordinate services for the Charter School's foster youth.
- 9. Monitor the educational progress of foster youth and provide reports to the Chief Executive Officer or designee and the Governing Board based on indicators identified in the Charter School's local control and accountability plan.

This Policy does not grant the Foster and Mobile Youth Liaison authority that supersedes the authority granted under state and federal law to a parent or legal guardian retaining educational rights, a responsible person appointed by the court to represent the child pursuant to Welfare and Institutions Code sections 319, 361 or 726, a surrogate parent, or a foster parent exercising authority under Education Code section 56055. The role of the Foster and Mobile Youth Liaison is advisory with respect to placement options and determination of the school of origin.

School Stability and Enrollment

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The Charter School will work with foster youth and their ERH to ensure that each foster youth is placed in the least restrictive educational programs and has access to the academic resources, services, and extracurricular and enrichment activities that are available to all students, including, but not limited to, interscholastic sports. All decisions regarding a foster youth's education and placement will be based on the best interest of the child and shall consider, among other factors, educational stability and the opportunity to be educated in the least restrictive educational setting necessary to achieve academic progress.

Foster youth, currently migratory children, and children of military families have the right to remain in their school of origin if it is their best interest. The Charter School will immediately enroll a foster youth, a currently migratory child, or child of a military family seeking reenrollment in the Charter School as their school of origin.

A foster youth, currently migratory child, or child of a military family who seeks to transfer to the Charter School will be immediately enrolled (subject to the Charter School's capacity, if the Charter School is not the student's school of origin, and pursuant to the procedures stated in the Charter School's charter and Board policy) even if the student has outstanding fees, fines, textbooks, or other items or monies due to the school last attended or is unable to meet normal enrollment documentation or school uniform requirements (e.g. producing medical records or academic records from a previous school).

At the initial detention or placement, or any subsequent change in placement, a foster youth may continue in their school of origin for the duration of the court's jurisdiction. A currently migratory child or child of a military family may continue in their school of origin as long as the student meets the definition of a currently migratory child or child of a military family as described above. Foster youth, currently migratory children, and children of military families have the right to remain in their school of origin following the termination of the court's jurisdiction or termination of the child's status as a currently migratory child or child of a military family, as follows:

- 1. For students in Kindergarten through eighth grade, inclusive, the student will be allowed to continue in the school of origin through the duration of the academic year in which the student's status changed.
- 2. For students enrolled in high school, the student will be allowed to continue in the school of origin through graduation.

If the foster youth, currently migratory child or child of a military family is transitioning between school grade levels, the youth shall be allowed to continue in the district of origin in the same attendance area to provide the youth the benefit of matriculating with their peers in accordance with the established feeder patterns of school districts. A student who is transitioning to a middle school or high school shall be allowed to enroll in the school designated for matriculation in another school district.

The Foster and Mobile Youth Liaison may, in consultation with and with the agreement of the foster youth and the ERH for the foster youth, recommend that the foster youth's right to attend the school of origin be waived and the student be enrolled in any district school that the student would otherwise be eligible to attend as a resident of the school district or in the Charter School consistent with current enrollment procedures. All decisions shall be made in accordance with the foster youth's best interests.



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Prior to making any recommendation to move a foster youth from their school of origin, the Foster and Mobile Youth Liaison shall provide the foster youth and the foster youth's ERH with a written explanation of the basis for the recommendation and how the recommendation serves the foster youth's best interests.

If any dispute arises regarding a foster youth's request to remain in the Charter School as the foster youth's school of origin, the foster youth has the right to remain in the Charter School pending resolution of the dispute. The dispute shall be resolved in accordance with the existing Charter School dispute resolution process.

Transportation

The Charter School shall not be responsible for providing transportation to allow a foster youth to attend school, unless there is an agreement with a local child welfare agency that the Charter School assumes part or all of the transportation costs in accordance with Section 6312(c)(5) of Title 20 of the United States Code, or unless required by federal law. The Charter School is not prohibited from providing transportation, at its discretion, to allow a foster youth to attend school.

In accordance with Section 6312(c)(5) of Title 20 of the United States Code, the Charter School shall collaborate with local child welfare agencies to develop and implement clear written procedures to address the transportation needs of foster youth to maintain them in their school of origin, when it is in the best interest of the youth.

For any student who has an individualized education program ("IEP"), the student's IEP team will determine if the student requires special education transportation as a related service regardless of the student's status.

Effect of Absences on Grades

The grades of a foster youth shall not be lowered for any absence from the Charter School that is due to either of the following circumstances:

- a. A decision by a court or placement agency to change the student's placement, in which case the student's grades shall be calculated as of the date the student left school.
- b. A verified court appearance or related court-ordered activity.

Transfer of Coursework and Credits

The Charter School shall accept coursework satisfactorily completed by a Foster and Mobile Youth while attending another public school¹, a juvenile court school, a charter school, a school in a country

¹ For purposes of coursework completed by a student who is a child of a military family, "public school" includes schools operated by the United States Department of Defense.

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other than the United States, or a nonpublic, nonsectarian school or agency even if the student did not complete the entire course and shall issue that student full or partial credit for the coursework completed.

If the Foster and Mobile Youth did not complete the entire course, the student shall be issued partial credit for the coursework completed and shall not be required to retake the portion of the course that the student completed at another school unless the Charter School, in consultation with the student's ERH, finds that the student is reasonably able to complete the requirements in time to graduate from high school. Whenever partial credit is issued to a Foster and Mobile Youth in any particular course, the student shall be enrolled in the same or equivalent course, if applicable, so that the student may continue and complete the entire course.

In no event shall the Charter School prevent a Foster and Mobile Youth from taking or retaking a course to meet the eligibility requirements for admission to the California State University or the University of California.

Applicability of Graduation Requirements

To obtain a high school diploma from the Charter School, a student must complete all courses required by the Charter School and fulfill any additional graduation requirements prescribed by the Board. However, Foster and Mobile Youth who transfer to the Charter School any time after the completion of their second year of high school, and pupils participating in a newcomer program who are in their third or fourth year of high school, shall be exempt from any of the Charter School's graduation requirements that are in excess of the California minimum graduation requirements specified in Education Code section 51225.3 ("additional graduation requirements") unless the Charter School makes a finding that the student is reasonably able to complete the Charter School's graduation requirements by the end of the student's fourth year of high school.

To determine whether a Foster and Mobile Youth is in their third or fourth year of high school, either the number of credits the student has earned to the date of transfer or the length of the student's school enrollment may be used, whichever will qualify the student for the exemption. For a pupil participating in a newcomer program, enrollment in grade 11 or 12 may be used to determine whether the student is in their third or fourth year of high school.

Within thirty (30) calendar days of the date that a student who may qualify for exemption under the above requirements transfers into the Charter School, the Charter School shall notify the student, the ERH, and where applicable, the student's social worker or probation officer, of the availability of the exemption and whether the student qualifies for the exemption. If the Charter School fails to provide timely notice of the availability of the exemption, the Foster and Mobile Youth shall be eligible for the exemption from the additional graduation requirements once notified, even if that notification occurs after the termination of the court's jurisdiction over the student, if the foster youth otherwise qualifies for the exemption.

If a student is exempted from the Charter School's additional graduation requirements pursuant to this Policy and completes the statewide coursework requirements specified in Educational Code section



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51225.3 before the end of their fourth year of high school and that student would otherwise be entitled to remain in attendance at the Charter School, the Charter School shall not require or request that the student graduate before the end of their fourth year of high school.

The Chief Executive Officer or designee shall notify a Foster and Mobile Youth and their ERH if the Charter School grants an exemption from the additional graduation requirements, how any requirements that are waived will affect the student's ability to gain admission to a postsecondary educational institution, and shall provide information about transfer opportunities available through the California Community Colleges.

A Foster and Mobile Youth who would otherwise be entitled to remain in attendance at the Charter School shall not be required to accept the exemption from additional graduation requirements or be denied enrollment in, or the ability to complete, courses for which the student is otherwise eligible, including courses necessary to attend an institution of higher education, regardless of whether those courses are required for statewide graduation requirements.

If an eligible student is not exempted from additional graduation requirements or has previously declined the exemption pursuant to this Policy, the Charter School shall exempt the student at any time if an exemption is requested by the youth and the youth qualifies for the exemption. Likewise, if the youth is exempted, the Charter School may not revoke the exemption.

If a Foster and Mobile Youth is exempted from additional graduation requirements pursuant to this section, the exemption shall continue to apply after the termination of the court's jurisdiction over the student or after the termination of circumstances which make the Student eligible while he or she is enrolled in school or if the student transfers to another school, including a charter school, or school district.

The Charter School shall not require or request a Foster and Mobile Youth to transfer schools in order to qualify for an exemption from additional graduation requirements, and no Foster and Mobile Youth or any person acting on behalf of a Foster and Mobile Youth may request a transfer solely to qualify for an exemption from the Charter School's additional graduation requirements.

Upon making a finding that a Foster and Mobile Youth is reasonably able to complete the Charter School's graduation requirements within the student's fifth year of high school, the Chief Executive Officer or designee shall:

VISITATION AND VOLUNTEER POLICY

While Amethod Public School ("AMPS" or the "Charter School") encourages parents/guardians and interested members of the community to visit the Charter School and view the educational program, AMPS also endeavors to create a safe environment for students and staff. Additionally, parents volunteering in the classroom can be extremely helpful to our teachers and valuable to our students. We thank all parents for their willingness to volunteer in this manner.

Nevertheless, to ensure the safety of students and staff as well as to minimize interruption of the instructional program, the AMPS Board of Directors has established the following procedures, to facilitate volunteering and visitations during regular school days:

Definitions

- A "*visitor*" is defined as any person seeking to enter the school building who is not an employee of the Charter School or a student currently enrolled in that building. All visitors who are not parents or guardians of a student must have a specific and educationally relevant purpose for their visit.
- A "*volunteer*" is defined as any person who voluntarily offers and provides a service to the Charter School with Charter School approval without receiving compensation.

Volunteering

Parents or guardians who are interested in volunteering in the classroom must adhere to the following guidelines:

- Volunteers who will volunteer outside of the direct supervision of a credentialed employee shall be (1) fingerprinted and (2) receive background clearance prior to volunteering without the direct supervision of a credentialed employee.
- 2. A volunteer shall also have on file with AMPS a certificate showing that, upon initial volunteer assignment, the person submitted to a tuberculosis risk assessment and, if tuberculosis risk factors were identified, was examined and found to be free of infectious tuberculosis. If no risk factors are identified, an examination is not required. At the discretion of the AMPS Board of Directors, this paragraph shall not apply to a volunteer whose functions do not require frequent or prolonged contact with pupils.
- 3. Volunteering must be arranged with the classroom teacher and Chief Executive Officer or designee, at least forty-eight (48) hours in advance.
- 4. A volunteer may not volunteer in the classroom for more than three (3) hours per month.
- 5. Prior to volunteering in the classroom, the volunteer should communicate with the teacher to discuss the expectations for volunteering needs. Classroom volunteers are there to benefit the entire class and are not in class solely for the benefit of their own child. Classroom volunteers must follow the instructions provided by the classroom teacher or aide. Classroom rules also apply to volunteers to ensure minimal distraction to the teacher. If a volunteer is uncomfortable

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following the direction of the teacher or aide the volunteer may leave their volunteer position for that day.

- 6. Information gained by volunteers regarding students (e.g. academic performance or behavior) is to be maintained in strict confidentiality. Volunteers must sign in agreement that they have read and understand and agree to follow the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act ("FERPA") Policy.
- 7. Volunteers shall follow and be governed by all other guidelines indicated elsewhere in this Policy. This includes, but is not limited to, the process of registering and signing out of the campus at the main office as indicated below.
- 8. Volunteerism by parents is encouraged but not mandatory. Any volunteer hours are tracked for purposes of maintaining data on the parent participation at the School.
- 9. This Policy does not authorize AMPS to permit a parent/guardian to volunteer or visit the campus if doing so conflicts with a valid restraining order, protective order, or order for custody or visitation issued by a court of competent jurisdiction.

Visitation

- 1. Visits during school hours should first be arranged with the teacher and Chief Executive Officer or designee, at least forty-eight (48) hours in advance. If a conference is desired, an appointment should be set with the teacher during non-instructional time, at least forty-eight (48) hours in advance. Parents/guardians seeking to visit a classroom during school hours must first obtain the approval of the classroom teacher and the Chief Executive Officer or designee.
- 2. All visitors (including volunteers) shall register in the Visitors Log Book and complete a Visitor's Permit in the main office immediately upon entering any school building or grounds when during regular school hours. When registering, the visitor is required to provide his/her name, address, age (if under 21), his/her purpose for entering school grounds, and proof of identity.
- 3. All visitors are asked to comply with current mandated and recommended health and safety protocols. Visitors (including volunteers) who demonstrate signs of a contagious disease (e.g. fever, coughing) may be denied registration. When recommended or requested by the Department of Public Health, visitors will be required to wear personal protective equipment, such as masks, and practice social distancing. AMPS reserves the right to implement additional measures for the protection of its school community, such as requiring forehead temperature checks before entry to the same extent being utilized for students and employees.
- 4. If the visitor is a government officer/official (including but not limited to local law enforcement officers, immigration enforcement officers, social workers, district attorneys, or U.S. attorneys) the officer/official will also be asked to produce any documentation that authorizes school access. AMPS shall make reasonable efforts to notify parents or guardians prior to permitting a student to be interviewed or searched, consistent with the law and/or any court order, warrant or instructions from the officer/official. A copy of the documentation provided by the officer and notes from the encounter may be maintained by AMPS, consistent with the law. The AMPS Board of Directors and Bureau of Children's Justice in the California Department of Justice, at BCJ@doj.ca.gov, will be timely informed regarding any attempt by a law-enforcement officer to access a school site or a student for immigration-enforcement purposes, as recommended by the Attorney General.

- 10. The Chief Executive Officer may direct a visitor without lawful business on campus to leave campus when the visitor's presence or acts interfere with the peaceful conduct of the activities of the school or disrupt the school or its pupils or school activities. Any visitor who is directed to leave by the Chief Executive Officer or designee will not be permitted to return to the Charter School campus for at least seven (7) days.
- 11. The Chief Executive Officer or designee may withdraw consent to be on campus for up to fourteen (14) days even if the visitor has a right to be on campus whenever there is reason to believe that the person has willfully disrupted or is likely to disrupt AMPS's orderly operation. Consent shall be reinstated whenever the Chief Executive Officer has reason to believe that the presence of the person will not constitute a substantial and material thereat to the orderly operation of the School campus. The person from whom consent has been withdrawn may submit a written request for a hearing on the withdrawal within the two-week period. The written request shall state the address to which notice of hearing is to be sent. The Executive Director shall grant such a hearing not later than seven (7) days from the date of receipt of the request and shall immediately mail a written notice of the time, place, and date of such hearing to such person.
- 12. The Chief Executive Officer or designee may request that a visitor who has failed to register, or whose registration privileges have been denied or withdrawn, promptly leave school grounds. When a visitor is directed to leave, the Chief Executive Officer or designee shall inform the visitor that if the visitor reenters the school without following the posted requirements the visitor will be guilty of a misdemeanor.
- 13. At each entrance to the campus, signs shall be posted specifying the hours during which registration is required, stating where the office of the Chief Executive Officer or designee is located, and what route to take to that office, and setting forth the penalties for violation of this Policy.
- 14. The Chief Executive Officer or designee may seek the assistance of the police in managing or reporting any visitor in violation of this Policy.

Penalties

Commented [10]: Cal Ed Code 49091.10 allows the governing board of school districts to set procedures for school visits, including limiting the duration of the visit. Some schools limit visits to as short as 20 minutes.

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- 1. Pursuant to the California Penal Code, if a visitor does not leave after being asked or if the visitor returns without following the posted requirements after being directed to leave, the visitor will be guilty of a misdemeanor, which is punishable by a fine of up to \$500.00 (five hundred dollars) or imprisonment in the County jail for a period of up to six (6) months or both.
- 2. Under California Education Code section 44811, any parent, guardian, or other person whose conduct materially disrupts classwork or extracurricular activities or involves substantial disorder is guilty of a misdemeanor and is punishable, upon the first conviction, by a fine of no less than \$500.00 (five hundred dollars) and no more than \$1,000.00 (one thousand dollars) or by imprisonment in a County jail for no more than one (1) year, or both, the fine and imprisonment.
- 3. Disruptive conduct may lead to AMPS's pursuit of a restraining order against a visitor, which would prohibit him/her from coming onto school grounds or attending school activities for any purpose for a period of up to three (3) years.



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Visitation_and Volunteer Policy

While Amethod Public School ("AMPS" or the "Charter School") encourages parents/guardians and interested members of the community to visit the Charter School and view the educational program, AMPS also endeavors to create a safe environment for students and staff. Additionally, parents volunteering in the classroom can be extremely helpful to our teachers and valuable to our students. We thank all parents for their willingness to volunteer in this manner.

Nevertheless, to ensure the safety of students and staff as well as to minimize interruption of the instructional program, the AMPS Board of Directors has established the following procedures, to facilitate volunteering and visitations during regular school days:

Definitions

- A "*visitor*" is defined as any person seeking to enter the school building who is not an employee of the Charter School or a student currently enrolled in that building. All visitors who are not parents or guardians of a student must have a specific and educationally relevant purpose for their visit.
- A "*volunteer*" is defined as any person who voluntarily offers and provides a service to the Charter School with Charter School approval without receiving compensation.

Volunteering

Parents or guardians who are interested in volunteering in the classroom must adhere to the following guidelines:

- 1. Volunteers who will volunteer outside of the direct supervision of a credentialed employee shall be (1) fingerprinted and (2) receive background clearance prior to volunteering without the direct supervision of a credentialed employee.
- 2. A volunteer shall also have on file with AMPS a certificate showing that, upon initial volunteer assignment, the person submitted to a tuberculosis risk assessment and, if tuberculosis risk factors were identified, was examined and found to be free of infectious tuberculosis. If no risk factors are identified, an examination is not required. At the discretion of the AMPS Board of Directors, this paragraph shall not apply to a volunteer whose functions do not require frequent or prolonged contact with pupils.
- 3. Volunteering must be arranged with the classroom teacher and Site Director or designee, at least forty-eight (48) hours in advance.
- 4. A volunteer may not volunteer in the classroom for more than three (3) hours per month.

- 5. Prior to volunteering in the classroom, the volunteer should communicate with the teacher to discuss the expectations for volunteering needs. Classroom volunteers are there to benefit the entire class and are not in class solely for the benefit of their own child. Classroom volunteers must follow the instructions provided by the classroom teacher or aide. Classroom rules also apply to volunteers to ensure minimal distraction to the teacher. If a volunteer is uncomfortable following the direction of the teacher or aide the volunteer may leave their volunteer position for that day.
- 6. Information gained by volunteers regarding students (e.g. academic performance or behavior) is to be maintained in strict confidentiality. Volunteers must sign in agreement that they have read and understand and agree to follow the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act ("FERPA") Policy.
- 7. Volunteers shall follow and be governed by all other guidelines indicated elsewhere in this Policy. This includes, but is not limited to, the process of registering and signing out of the campus at the main office as indicated below.
- 8. Volunteerism by parents is encouraged but not mandatory. Any volunteer hours are tracked for purposes of maintaining data on the parent participation at the School.
- 9. This Policy does not authorize AMPS to permit a parent/guardian to volunteer or visit the campus if doing so conflicts with a valid restraining order, protective order, or order for custody or visitation issued by a court of competent jurisdiction.

Visitation

- 1. Visits during school hours should first be arranged with the teacher and Site Director or designee, at least forty-eight (48) hours in advance. If a conference is desired, an appointment should be set with the teacher during non-instructional time, at least forty-eight (48) hours in advance. Parents/guardians seeking to visit a classroom during school hours must first obtain the approval of the classroom teacher and the Site Director or designee.
- 2. All visitors (including volunteers) shall register in the Visitors Log Book and complete a Visitor's Permit in the main office immediately upon entering any school building or grounds when during regular school hours. When registering, the visitor is required to provide his/her name, address, age (if under 21), his/her purpose for entering school grounds, and proof of identity.
- 3. All visitors are asked to comply with current mandated and recommended health and safety protocols. Visitors (including volunteers) who demonstrate signs of a contagious disease (e.g. fever, coughing) may be denied registration. When recommended or requested by the Department of Public Health, visitors will be required to wear personal protective equipment, such as masks, and practice social distancing. AMPS reserves the right to implement additional measures for the protection of its school community, such as requiring forehead temperature checks before entry to the same extent being utilized for students and employees.



HONOR HARD WORK

- 4. If the visitor is a government officer/official (including but not limited to local law enforcement officers, immigration enforcement officers, social workers, district attorneys, or U.S. attorneys) the officer/official will also be asked to produce any documentation that authorizes school access. AMPS shall make reasonable efforts to notify parents or guardians prior to permitting a student to be interviewed or searched, consistent with the law and/or any court order, warrant or instructions from the officer/official. A copy of the documentation provided by the officer and notes from the encounter may be maintained by AMPS, consistent with the law. The AMPS Board of Directors and Bureau of Children's Justice in the California Department of Justice, at BCJ@doj.ca.gov, will be timely informed regarding any attempt by a law-enforcement officer to access a school site or a student for immigration-enforcement purposes, as recommended by the Attorney General.
- 5. For purposes of school safety and security, the Site Director or designee may design a visible means of identification for visitors while on school premises.

CharterSAFE's mission is to provide our charter school members with a strong understanding of school hazards and approach to risk management. As a result, we believe that a safe and secure learning environment allows member schools to focus on and dedicate its resources toward empowering students through education. We serve leaders of the charter community who are in need of a comprehensive insurance program and hands-on proactive risk and claim management services to help keep their schools safe.

We are a nonprofit Joint Powers Authority (JPA) solely dedicated to protecting independent charter schools in California by providing expertise in group insurance, safety, risk management, and human resource consulting. Owned by our members, CharterSAFE is led by a staff of experts and overseen by a board of directors made up of school leaders.

Many of our dedicated team members have worked for CharterSAFE and our members for over 10 years, some since our founding in 2004. In addition, over the past two years, CharterSAFE has strategically enhanced its team with industry experts to serve its members better. We excitedly announced the addition of Dennis Monahan, Managing Director, Claims, and Karen Bianchini, Managing Director, Risk Management just over one year ago. More recently, Bettina Hooper as Managing Director, Member Services and Operations joined our executive team.

We are well-positioned to address the challenges facing our members. For example, at the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic, CharterSAFE was there with education and recommendations to mitigate risks throughout the process helping our members to prepare for returning to the classroom.

INSURANCE.

At the heart of what we do, CharterSAFE is a Joint Power Authority (JPA) that brings together charter schools to pool their similar risks and exposures to self-insure as a group. We are financial stewards of the JPA's joint funds used to pay for lower-cost claims, which our members own. Excess and reinsurance are procured to assure coverage in the event of high exposure claims. Considering the underlying relationship between insurance companies and customers, JPAs are not an insurance carrier and without question the most effective way to obtain traditional insurance for charter schools. Customers pay a premium to an insurance company, from which the insurance company takes a profit and uses the rest to pay for claims from customers. An insurance company will have many different types of customers, some much riskier than others. *That means that in traditional insurance, despite the façade of a separate standalone policy, all customers share in the risk of one another in addition to paying for the profits of the insurance company. Conversely, a JPA only allows membership for similar risks (e.g., a JPA for charter schools only).*



By limiting the risk to similarly operated entities, members are protected because losses are more predictable. CharterSAFE can help our members focus on effective feasible risk management and safety techniques specific to charter schools to reduce the chance and cost of loss. Additionally, in the event you have a loss, traditional insurance companies will focus on their profitability with their own interests as a priority. Insurance companies and their adjusters will not have any relationship with your school; at CharterSAFE, you have the same claims personnel working on all claims. That means they know our members and follow CharterSAFE's values in protecting the membership in claims management. As a member of CharterSAFE, the JPA's members are the number one priority; we focus on what is best for the member.

Today's Insurance Market

Today's difficult insurance market continues to harden rapidly; that means premiums are increasing and the capacity to find insurance coverages decrease. In California, numerous insurance carriers have left or are planning to exit the state. A JPA offers buying power through scale that would not be feasible independently. CharterSAFE's goal is to procure the proper coverages with limits that will protect and keep your schools safe.

A gap in coverage or too low a limit may expose a school to financial instability at best, or worst – closure. A gap of coverage occurs when you have a primary limit in coverage, then an uncovered layer before any excess insurance kicks in. These gaps can reach millions of dollars of exposure and put a school at risk. Other gaps may occur in a policy with "exclusions" limiting coverage. We have seen many insurance quotes and policies with both of these types of gaps in coverage.

CharterSAFE's insurance structure includes a retention layer of self-insurance; this means the JPA pays for smaller cost claims within this first layer of coverage. This provides the JPA with the ability to advocate for its members and resolve claims faster and more cost-effectively. Our claims team has a strong influence over the majority of claims that fall within this layer of coverage. Should claims cost go higher than this first layer of self-insurance, then excess and reinsurance are triggered. CharterSAFE negotiates the best rates possible for all members with a variety of excess carriers and reinsurance carriers. In today's litigious environment with jury verdicts and settlements at all-time highs and the risk of property losses such as we experienced with the CA wildfires, having insurance limits and proper coverage for these crises are critical.

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Competition

We heard a lot this year from various competitors; many speaking against the benefits of a JPA. As we look at the competitive landscape in the hard insurance market, membership in a JPA is more secure than ever. JPAs bring buying power through scale with excess and reinsurance carriers. Insurers are not in a capacity to offer all the variety of coverages necessary to appropriately protect your school's assets, leaving you with the burden of shopping multiple products. At CharterSAFE, we provide a complete package of insurance coverages. Also, the limits and broad coverage provided are critical to protecting your school assets in the event of a severe claim. **CharterSAFE has developed crucial questions to ask to guide our members through this competitive market:**

- 1. Type of Coverage: What coverage exists for my board of directors, staff, students, and financial assets? Some policies only cover the board; board members can be brought into suits as individuals and coverage should be extended to them.
- Coverage Limits and Deductibles: are the limits at least authorizer compliant? Are they enough to cover common types of claims for schools? Each authorizer will have required minimum limits; many insurance companies may not meet these minimum requirements.
- 3. Terms, Conditions, and Exclusions: What isn't included, and how does that impact how your school is protected?
- **4.** Stability and Track Record of Insurer: How long has the insurer been writing charter school-specific insurance? Do they insure other charter schools?
- **5.** Included Services: What are the risk management, human resources, claim advocacy, or claims management and loss control services offered? What are the cost implications of any additional services offered?

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
CHARTER SCHOOL RISK TRENDS AND MITIGATION.

Liability and Property–Frequency


CharterSAFE's deep understanding of the risk trends for charter schools is unsurpassed. In analyzing trends, we look at both frequency and severity.

- **Frequency** is claims that happen often and are quite common. Claims of frequency are generally less in value and resolve more quickly. By identifying these claims, CharterSAFE can recommend proactive and realistic strategies to reduce the number of claims that happen at your school.
- **Severity** is those claims that happen less frequently but can be very costly. Generally speaking, 20% of claims will cost 80% of your cost dollars. For these claims, CharterSAFE develops mitigation techniques for schools to reduce the chance of it happening. But also, these mitigation techniques will help reduce the cost of these claims.

The charts below illustrate ChartersSAFE's claims frequency and severity over the past 10 years for Liability and Property and 5 years for Workers' Compensation.

Risk Trends

Childhood Sexual Assault

CharterSAFE has reported sexual assault as a risk trend in the last 2 years. Rightly so! While they are infrequent, they account *for 29% of our loss dollars*. It is a fact that sexual assault is a pandemic deserving our full attention. Since 2010, CharterSAFE and its reinsurers have paid or reserved over \$26,000,000 for claims involving staff-student molestation. Not only are the cost of these claims skyrocketing, but so is the exposure. On January 1, 2020, AB 218 went into effect, extending the time for bringing forth a civil claim for sexual assault. This means more claims will be brought forward long after the alleged events took place. Claims which are presented long after the actual event are much more complicated to investigate. Finding witnesses or records to determine liability is a challenge as more time elapses. In addition to extending the time limits, AB218 also allows for more severe damages, which many insurance carriers refuse to cover.

CharterSAFE wants to help you prevent childhood sexual assault from happening at your school. We provide a mandatory Childhood Sexual Assault Prevention Training program for the staff of our members. This proactive risk management technique encourages a zero-tolerance culture within our schools and gives language, awareness, and confidence to speak up in suspicious situations. CharterSAFE is committed to assist our members in mitigating this exposure and recommend the following actions:

- If you haven't already done so, adopt a robust and detailed Student/Staff Interaction Policy (we have a Boundaries Policy template available), train your staff, and vigorously enforce it.
- Comply with Ed Code 44050, which requires schools to provide parents with a copy of the boundaries policy (it can be included in the parent handbook) and on your website if you have one. Parents are often the first line of defense, especially when they check their child's social media or phone activity. The boundaries policy offers them tools to identify grooming behaviors and other "red flag" indicators.
- Add the mandatory Childhoods Sexual Assault prevention training (Boundaries) module to your annual staff training (offered at no cost by CharterSAFE through SafeSchools.com or the CharterSAFE Learning Center).
- Access the voluntary Boundaries training for parents and guardians. Reach out to CharterSAFE for your specific URL and password that your charter school can provide to parents and guardians.
- Take advantage of the STOPit Anonymous Reporting System (offered at no cost by CharterSAFE).

Employee Embezzlement (and Theft by Vendors)

Embezzlement is a troubling trend felt though out many industries. These exposures may hurt a charter school not only financially but its reputation as well. Often, the fraud takes place over a period of years and involves long-time respected employees or advisors. Proper checks and balances, audit procedures, and security of equipment may help avoid these exposures. Therefore, we highly recommend that internal controls to ensure continuous accountability and reliability of all financial transactions, such as multiple signatures on checks, be established and regularly reviewed to ensure effectiveness. In addition, securing valuable equipment such as locking laptop carts and keeping them away from view will help prevent theft.

Employment-Related Claims Including Wage & Hour Violations

Most liability for a school arises out of the mishandling of an employment-related situation. Qualified human resource expertise is an absolute necessity for guidance. CharterSAFE offers no-cost advisory services through our dedicated HR consulting team to help your organization shore up its personnel management structure. Allegations of employment discrimination, wrongful termination, retaliation, and wage and hour violations continue to vex charter schools. As you can see from the charts above, claims arising from negligent employment practices account for over 11% of all payments that CharterSAFE made over the last ten (10) years, and the trend is rising.

Like several other lines of insurance, this is another area of coverage in which the insurance marketplace has dwindled and become more restrictive. These claims are exceptionally costly when they involve back wages, unpaid meal and rest breaks, or payroll processing violations. While the coverage is designed to offer defense coverage, it does not pay for fines, penalties, and back wages. Employment practice violations that go undetected for an extended period of time, can cost your school millions. The related fines, penalties, and back wages are uninsurable, and deductibles can be substantial, which can adversely affect your budget.

Cyber

Breaches to computer networks and the ramifications of unauthorized access to sensitive data are the key elements of cyber risk. Ransomware is malicious software that invades a computer system, then holds the data hostage until a large sum of money is paid; this is very common for schools and many other sectors. Unfortunately, without proper protection, victims often have no choice but to pay the ransom and try to figure out what data is compromised. The very real and growing concern has caused insurance carriers to require certain precautions be put in place before they will even consider applying coverage, including a basic requirement of the following being implemented:

- Multi-factor Authentication
- Secure off-site backup of data
- Data Breach Recovery Plan

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FINANCIAL POSITION.

CharterSAFE continues to be in a strong financial position. Member contributions in the 2020-2021 fiscal year are on track for a total \$35.6 million. We maintain operational and financial transparency and do our part to ensure as much of your funds go towards the classroom. Our operating costs average 16%; this year, it is 12% of member contributions, while the cost of insurance coverage and paying claims accounts for 88%. Below is a chart showing CharterSAFE's five-year financial summary.

Member Contribution

Member contributions are determined by various factors, including but not limited to each member's size, property, owned autos, staff, exposures, loss history, and the members' ability to implement safety precautions. These factors are all considered in arriving at the members' contribution for the self-insured layer of coverages. CharterSAFE procures excess insurance coverage that provides its members with appropriate limits for charter school risks. Thuy Wong, President and CEO, and John Chino, Gallagher, our insurance broker, negotiate these rates, for the best possible rates while maintaining protective coverage. In summary, member contributions are made up of the self-insured layer rate that is actuarially determined and factor in member information, the excess rates from insurance carriers negotiated for all members, and operating cost. There is no commission, consulting fees, or profit margin.

Assessments

An assessment is a security measure triggered when a JPA or the mutual insurance company does not have sufficient reserves to pay for claims. In our 16 year history, CharterSAFE has never had an assessment! Even so, there our opportunistic insurance agents who try and use an assessment as a fair tactic to try and gain our membership. Within our JPA structure, the possibility of an assessment impacting membership is extremely remote. To minimize any likelihood of an assessment, we proactively put two important protections in place:

- Security for "severity" risk CharterSAFE has a protected excess and reinsurance structure to hedge risk through use of multiple highly-rated insurers. This layer of coverage provides the JPA with protection in the event of significant loss exposure.
- 2. Security for "frequency" risk The JPA's funding strategy includes a well-funded loss reserve to absorb claims for each annual period, as well as on an aggregated basis over a period of years for open claims. This strategy is designed to provide protection in the event of a large number of small or medium-sized claims impacting the pooled retention.

Reserves

The recommended funding level for CharterSAFE's loss reserve is reliably calculated by AON Actuarial Services each year using CharterSAFE's comprehensive 16-year historical record. It is compiled and analyzed to ensure adequate funding for the loss experience predicted for the upcoming policy period. This is the same methodology used by insurance companies in the traditional marketplace without the addition of profit, commission, or broker fees.

Serving as a steadfast financial steward on our members' behalf, CharterSAFE uses the recommended actuarial rate at a 75% confidence level (i.e., the rate that actuary is 75% sure will be able to fund all claims that year) for our pooled retention layer. This is known as funding for the present (short-term claims) and future (claims incurred but not reported. This stewardship of funds allows us to ensure CharterSAFE members are protected against the possibility of assessments.

Finally, we calculate losses for all years beginning with the first policy period of the JPA (2004-2005) through present day, funding for past liabilities that will come due. This provides a second look whereby the open claims are revalued to a 90% confidence factor. This is just shy of 2 standard deviations, a very secure range.

Through our 16 years of operation, CharterSAFE has accrued \$8.4M in member equity after paying current claims at the 90% confidence factor funding requirement as of 6/30/2020.

- Work is to be conducted during "normal business hours" meaning, no after-hours work or double shifts.
- There will be no delays of the start date of our installation, nor the times of day that we will be permitted to work.
- Rooms will be available for our work without them being in use for other purposes, and without our team being obstructed by other trades.
- Work that must be completed by other trades (e.g. network turn-up, final furniture installation, ceiling, dry-walling, flooring, electrical, cable pulls and testing/certification, millwork, painting, etc.) must be finished on schedule and prior to the work that we must perform as part of our scope.
- Our teams must be allowed to perform contiguous installation, meaning we expect that we will be able to complete the contracted work in large blocks of time rather than having to do piece-meal work with multiple extra visits.
- Owner-furnished equipment (OFE), if any, must be present when work commences and is assumed to be in good working order, unless testing of the OFE has been contracted to us as part of our scope of work.
- Work-site will be in a tidy state, meaning no pre-installation clean-up will be required by our teams.
- "Substantial completion" of our scope is defined as "systems have been delivered and are installed and working. Punch-list items may remain but the systems are effectively 'useable' by end-users."

- In-wall backing for support of heavy equipment on wall.
- Fire wall, ceiling, roof and floor penetration.
- Necessary sheet rock replacement and or repair.
- Necessary ceiling tile or T-bar modifications, replacement and/or repair. Any and all millwork (moldings, trim, etc.).
- Painting and patching.
- Permits (unless specifically provided for elsewhere in the contract).
- HVAC and plumbing relocation.

POTENTIAL UPCHARGES

Assumptions and Exclusions

Unless otherwise specified, the following standard assumptions are the basis for the price and completion date of our work:

- Work is to be conducted during "normal business hours" meaning, no after-hours work or double shifts.
- There will be no delays of the start date of our installation, nor the times of day that we will be permitted to work.
- Rooms will be available for our work without them being in use for other purposes, and without our team being obstructed by other trades.
- Work that must be completed by other trades (e.g. network turn-up, final furniture installation, ceiling, dry-walling, flooring, electrical, cable pulls and testing/certification, millwork, painting, etc.) must be finished on schedule and prior to the work that we must perform as part of our scope.
- Our teams must be allowed to perform contiguous installation, meaning we expect that we will be able to complete the contracted work in large blocks of time rather than having to do piece-meal work with multiple extra visits.
- Owner-furnished equipment (OFE), if any, must be present when work commences and is assumed to be in good working order, unless testing of the OFE has been contracted to us as part of our scope of work.
- Work-site will be in a tidy state, meaning no pre-installation clean-up will be required by our teams.
- "Substantial completion" of our scope is defined as "systems have been delivered and are installed and working. Punch-list items may remain but the systems are effectively 'useable' by end-users."
- "Beneficial use" is defined as your "productive use of some or all of the installed system to conduct the primary function for which is was purchased." For example, if a teacher is able to use a new system to teach students, even if the system is not 100% complete, such use will be deemed to be "beneficial use."

This project is also subject to the following assumptions:

• Any additional person-hours required by LightWerks to complete work due to a shift in our agreed upon schedule by others, or due to room readiness issues caused by others, will be billed out at a minimum of the following T&M rates:

The following multipliers affect work done outside of normal business hours:

The following multipliers affect work done by technical personnel beyond an ordinary 8-hour work-day:

- 8 hours to 11 hours and 59 minutes, 1.5x the quoted hourly rate.
- 12+ hours, 2x the quoted hourly rate.

Unless otherwise specified, the following work is not included in our scope of work:

- ANY customer-side network troubleshooting or PC configuration.
- Cutting into or configuring/assembling furniture or cabinetry.
- All conduit, high voltage wiring, breakers, relays, boxes, receptacles, etc.
- Concrete saw cutting and / or core drilling.
- In-wall backing for support of heavy equipment on wall.
- Fire wall, ceiling, roof and floor penetration.
- Necessary sheet rock replacement and or repair.
- Necessary ceiling tile or T-bar modifications, replacement and/or repair. Any and all millwork (moldings, trim, etc.).
- Painting and patching.
- Permits (unless specifically provided for elsewhere in the contract).
- HVAC and plumbing relocation.

POTENTIAL UPCHARGES

Per the discussion above, following are issues that sometimes occur, and the up-charges the project will incur if we are not able to do our work for you at our scheduled times:

- Delays to Start of Installation: Delays caused by no fault of LightWerks (e.g. customer representative is late meeting our personnel to provide access to the job-site, etc.) will be billed at \$150 per person-hour and will be calculated in ½ hour increments.
- Installation Cancellation/Rescheduling: Cancellation or rescheduling of installations will be subject to the following charges (all cancellations/rescheduling must be submitted in WRITING):
 - Less than 72 hours notice: \$500
 - Less than 48 hours notice: \$1,000
- Room Availability: The Room(s) where the install(s) is(are) to occur MUST be made available to LightWerks for the duration of the pre-scheduled installation and testing period. This means that no other events or meetings can be scheduled in the room(s) while LightWerks is working on-site. Any deviation from this condition may result in installation completion delay and will incur T&M rate (\$150 per person-hour) billing for crew downtime.
- Construction Schedule Delays/Changes/Additions: Delays to the start or completion of a technical installation that are beyond the control of LightWerks, WILL result in delay of technical installation completion. If, however, the customer still requires LightWerks to meet the original completion date in the event of such a delay, the customer agrees to pay extra labor costs and expenses necessary for LightWerks to expedite installation. Extra billing (change orders) must be agreed to in writing in advance of expedited installation.
- Contiguous Installation: Unless otherwise negotiated, jobs are quoted with the expectation of

contiguous installation, meaning we expect that we will be able to complete the contracted work in large blocks of time rather than having to do piece-meal work with multiple extra visits. In the event that it becomes necessary for LightWerks to add additional site visits and/or additional equipment rental to accommodate for equipment delivery issues, construction schedules, or major changes in customer's installation requirements, customer will be billed \$150 per additional person-hour, to be calculated in ½ hour increments, including drive-time.

- Owner-Furnished Equipment (OFE): OFE is OFTEN the cause of unexpected problems, delays, and additional charges on an installation. LightWerks does not install any wiring or equipment that does not meet State or other regulations. Any customer requiring LightWerks to work with old OFE agrees to pay for any extra labor expended due to problems or failures experienced with old wiring or equipment. This labor will be billed at T&M rates. Any equipment provided to LightWerks will not be deemed as "working" until it functions within the LightWerksprovided system. LightWerks will not be held liable for any OFE that is not, or cannot be demonstrated to be functional prior to our installation. Also, LightWerks shall not be held liable for unsafe conditions that existed prior to our work on any job-site (e.g. faulty mounting of pre-existing equipment,etc.).
- Site Conditions and Client-Provided Information: LightWerks will make every effort to work with your site conditions as they actually exist. However, should the site circumstances prove to be substantially different than those originally assumed, easily observed, and/or agreed upon by LightWerks (e.g. unusable conduits, lack of access to ceilings or equipment closets, etc.), there will likely be additional time and associated charges required to overcome previously undisclosed or unknown challenges.

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Assumptions and Exclusions

Unless otherwise specified, the following standard assumptions are the basis for the price and completion date of our work:

- Work is to be conducted during "normal business hours" meaning, no after-hours work or double shifts.
- There will be no delays of the start date of our installation, nor the times of day that we will be permitted to work.
- Rooms will be available for our work without them being in use for other purposes, and without our team being obstructed by other trades.
- Work that must be completed by other trades (e.g. network turn-up, final furniture installation, ceiling, dry-walling, flooring, electrical, cable pulls and testing/certification, millwork, painting, etc.) must be finished on schedule and prior to the work that we must perform as part of our scope.
- Our teams must be allowed to perform contiguous installation, meaning we expect that we will be able to complete the contracted work in large blocks of time rather than having to do piece-meal work with multiple extra visits.
- Owner-furnished equipment (OFE), if any, must be present when work commences and is assumed to be in good working order, unless testing of the OFE has been contracted to us as part of our scope of work.
- Work-site will be in a tidy state, meaning no pre-installation clean-up will be required by our teams.
- "Substantial completion" of our scope is defined as "systems have been delivered and are installed and working. Punch-list items may remain but the systems are effectively 'useable' by end-users."
- "Beneficial use" is defined as your "productive use of some or all of the installed system to conduct the primary function for which is was purchased." For example, if a teacher is able to use a new system to teach students, even if the system is not 100% complete, such use will be deemed to be "beneficial use."

This project is also subject to the following assumptions:

• Any additional person-hours required by LightWerks to complete work due to a shift in our agreed upon schedule by others, or due to room readiness issues caused by others, will be billed out at a minimum of the following T&M rates:

Unless otherwise specified, the following work is not included in our scope of work:

- ANY customer-side network troubleshooting or PC configuration.
- Cutting into or configuring/assembling furniture or cabinetry.
- All conduit, high voltage wiring, breakers, relays, boxes, receptacles, etc.
- Concrete saw cutting and / or core drilling.
- In-wall backing for support of heavy equipment on wall.
- Fire wall, ceiling, roof and floor penetration.
- Necessary sheet rock replacement and or repair.
- Necessary ceiling tile or T-bar modifications, replacement and/or repair. Any and all millwork (moldings, trim, etc.).
- Painting and patching.
- Permits (unless specifically provided for elsewhere in the contract).
- HVAC and plumbing relocation.

POTENTIAL UPCHARGES

Per the discussion above, following are issues that sometimes occur, and the up-charges the project will incur if we are not able to do our work for you at our scheduled times:

- Delays to Start of Installation: Delays caused by no fault of LightWerks (e.g. customer representative is late meeting our personnel to provide access to the job-site, etc.) will be billed at \$150 per person-hour and will be calculated in ½ hour increments.

Any deviation from this condition may result in installation completion delay and will incur T&M rate (\$150 per person-hour) billing for crew downtime.
- Construction Schedule Delays/Changes/Additions: Delays to the start or completion of a technical installation that are beyond the control of LightWerks, WILL result in delay of technical installation completion. If, however, the customer still requires LightWerks to meet the original completion date in the event of such a delay, the customer agrees to pay extra labor costs and expenses necessary for LightWerks to expedite installation. Extra billing (change orders) must be agreed to in writing in advance of expedited installation.
- Contiguous Installation: Unless otherwise negotiated, jobs are quoted with the expectation of

In the event that it becomes necessary for LightWerks to add additional site visits and/or additional equipment rental to accommodate for equipment delivery issues, construction schedules, or major changes in customer's installation requirements, customer will be billed \$150 per additional person-hour, to be calculated in ½ hour increments, including drive-time.

- Owner-Furnished Equipment (OFE): OFE is OFTEN the cause of unexpected problems, delays, and additional charges on an installation. LightWerks does not install any wiring or equipment that does not meet State or other regulations. Any customer requiring LightWerks to work with old OFE agrees to pay for any extra labor expended due to problems or failures experienced with old wiring or equipment. This labor will be billed at T&M rates. Any equipment provided to LightWerks will not be deemed as "working" until it functions within the LightWerksprovided system. LightWerks will not be held liable for any OFE that is not, or cannot be demonstrated to be functional prior to our installation. Also, LightWerks shall not be held liable for unsafe conditions that existed prior to our work on any job-site (e.g. faulty mounting of pre-existing equipment,etc.).
- Site Conditions and Client-Provided Information: LightWerks will make every effort to work with your site conditions as they actually exist. However, should the site circumstances prove to be substantially different than those originally assumed, easily observed, and/or agreed upon by LightWerks (e.g. unusable conduits, lack of access to ceilings or equipment closets, etc.), there will likely be additional time and associated charges required to overcome previously undisclosed or unknown challenges.
- Site Clean Up: If a site is in an untidy, dirty, or dusty state, any necessary pre-installation clean-up done by LightWerks personnel will be billed at a T&M rate and may result in a delay in the completion of the installation. At a minimum, removal of existing trash from rooms upon LightWerks arrival will be billed as follows:
 - Basic Removal (one room): \$500
 - Extended Removal (multiple rooms):\$1,000

WARRANTIES

Standard Project Workmanship Warranty

LightWerks warrants the Audiovisual System furnished to be free from defects in workmanship (i.e. cables, connections, and structures) for a period of one (1) year from the date of acceptance or first beneficial use, whichever occurs first. Warranty service for such defects will be handled in a reasonable and timely manner from the time of notification to LightWerks by the Owner or their agent. Requests for service should be made through our Service portal at www.LightWerks.com/HelpDesk. If problems are found to have been caused other than by defects of workmanship, visits to correct these problems will be chargeable at a rate of \$450 - \$550 per Technician per visit, unless the client has purchased a TLC (Technology Loving Care) maintenance agreement from LightWerks.
