Student Success Committee Purpose:

The Responsibility of a charter school is to address the academic learning needs of all students particularly those who have historically been underserved. As a charter school, we are given freedom from some of the regulations that non-charter schools must address with the understanding that we will increase student achievement and close the achievement gap. As a charter school, we are obligated to provide a program that delivers academic excellence by meeting the learning needs of all students.
