# **Updates on Goals/Issues for Discussion**

**School Improvement Plan (SIP) Progress:** <u>Linked here</u> is the 2022-2023 Board approved School Improvement Plan. The Kaizen Team is still in the process of creating progress indicators and inputting them into the NCStar platform. In the interim:

# <u>Target Area #1 Student Support Alignment Progress</u>:

- Our counseling and student support team arranged 2 Family Connections Night for elementary (Jan. 31st) and middle school (Feb. 15th) parents on the topic of Raising Resilient Children in conjunction with Project Enlightenment and Wake County Public Schools. The informational flier from the program is attached in the Board packet.
- Ryan Boney, our Middle School Counselor, is now delivering social-emotional curriculum lessons to all middle schoolers every Wednesday through the new Seminar class.

# Target Area #2 Instructional Alignment Progress:

- Staff well-being and retention continue to be a top concern and are the subject of conversation at nearly each leadership meeting. We have several staff members with ongoing health issues and have had vacancies that have put continued stress on staff, especially in EC. We have offers in process for all open positions at this time.
- Our MTSS team meets every 2 weeks with each grade-level team and will use this time to review the results of winter benchmarks and current needs and progress in interventions.
- Winter Portfolios were mostly completed on Friday, Feb. 17th with some still being scheduled throughout this next week. Families had the option of in-person or virtual sessions to hear their scholars describe their goals, work progress and evidence, and skills mastery.
- The leadership team completed part 2 of their Crucial Conversations training with Michelle Parkerson on Wed. Feb. 8th. The goal of this training is to increase the skill set for effective and proactive constructive feedback in our work.
- Michelle Parkerson will be transitioning to more of a contracted role as a school improvement coach, and we will be transitioning Leah Ruto (currently in 5th grade) into the role of school instructional coach.
- Ethan, Jen (K), Martha (1st) and Shawna (2nd) are participating in LETRS early literacy training through the Office of Charter Schools. LETRS is a 2-year professional learning course of study based in the science of reading for elementary educators.

# Target Area #3 Community Engagement Progress:

- Our lottery closed on Feb. 3rd after a robust tour and information season. The Lottery runs on <u>Friday, March 3, 2023</u>, and families have to accept/decline by: 7-day window through June 1, 2023 (must accept within 7 days of the offer.)
- We want to especially acknowledge the work of Annah Riedel and Mary McWay in preparing and coaching our student ambassadors, who lead all our tours! Prospective families often tell us that meeting our scholars and hearing them speak eloquently and passionately about our core values and our programs are a big part of what draws them to apply for a seat at Exploris.
- On February 7th, the 3rd and 5th graders visited NC State University to see the Grammy Award winning Alphabet Rockers perform at Stewart Theater. 4th Grade also visited the NC State BioEngineering Lab as a Kickoff for their Engineering Design Process Unit.
- On February 9th, local EMS technicians brought an ambulance on campus at the elementary school had met with students as part of an on-going Community Connections unit.
- On Wednesday, Feb. 15th, the 3rd graders spent the day at UNC-Chapel and visited the Morehead Planetarium as part of their study of the earth, moon and sun.
- On Thursday, Feb. 16th, the 7th grade spent the day at the NC State Farmers' Market as part of their "Inheritance" Expedition. They had the opportunity to speak with and interview African American farmers and learn first hand about agriculture in our state
- On Thursday, Feb. 16th, Mrs. Karen held the first after school practice for the Exploris Elementary Chorus!

- On Thurs. Feb. 16th the 8th grade, along with many of our 8th grade families, traveled to Wilmington to participate in a Humanities field experience for their latest novel, *Crow*, by Barbara Wright. Students took a walking tour to learn about the successful African-American community that thrived in Wilmington after the Civil War and to retrace the path of the 1898 Wilmington Race Massacre that tried to end that success-the only successful coup d'etat in American history. This event re-established white supremacy in the city. The purpose of this experience was for students to teach adults about this history.
- Coming up on March 9th-20th is a return of an Exploris tradition: the Japanese exchange with our sister school in Shinonome. Exploris teachers and students will travel to Japan, stay with host families, attend classes, and experience many cultural aspects of daily life in Japan! (Later this summer our exchange trip to Germany will take place.)
- Deb Brown and Michelle Parkerson designed and led the state Charter Schools Connections Conference through NCCAT. This multi-day seminar connected public charter school educators from all across the state. The agenda from the week is attached in the Board packet.
- Our Boosterthon fun run and color run to raise money for scholarships for assorted field experiences, from smaller trips that require minor fees to major activities like Outward Bound will happen next week!
- Dan the Animal Man visited the ES on 2/16 and will visit the MS on 2/27 for a special presentation that ties into our curriculum and core value of connections to nature.
