Recommended that this year we focus on the current model (Career Safari and Keynotes) until we have the DB Coordinator/College and Career Counselor role in place.

This approach allows students to:

- Explore diverse career paths before narrowing their focus, helping them make more informed decisions about college and career options.
- Develop transferable skills through hands-on activities in multiple industries, rather than being limited to one internship experience.
- Build a strong professional network by interacting with industry leaders and potential mentors in multiple fields.
- Align their education with workforce demands by seeing firsthand what skills and certifications are most valued in high-demand careers.
- Increase their adaptability and career readiness, making them more competitive for future internships, jobs, and entrepreneurial opportunities.

By integrating a Career Safari, Seacoast Collegiate High School can provide high-impact career exploration aligned with industry certifications and workforce development—giving students a competitive advantage in an ever-evolving job market.
