II. Academic Excellence

A. Middle School Updates (Vote on Dr. Seuss Books)

Kim Mixon:

PM2 data: saw growth in all areas. Made some adjustments to tier 2 and tier 3 interventions. Collaboration in history and ELA with 7/8th as well; Excerpts from Best Texts; Common Lit is our Tier 2 intervention, but will probably use Lexia next year.

Summer Reading also uses Best Texts. Regarding Growth: St of FL standard tests PM 1 2 3 (ELA & Math) - SNS goes one step further with Seaside Writes - based on FL standards for the writing section - still being piloted and is not part of their grade. But we get the date from their write score. Tracking our PM3 scores year to year (where the students end the year score-wise) - we do look at last year's PM3 scores but there are a lot of variables.

Student Voice Action Steps: Safety: working on: At lunch they feel too close to the visitors - so they've moved the students in closer to the lyceum; new locks on all the classroom doors and will install peep holes on all the doors; working on Parents on Patrol program; added retractable barricades; more stronger individual voices and individual time with Mrs. Ashely and the counselors; Student Experience: adding an Art Club, adding guest speakers in areas of interest. Teacher Support/Student Wellness: build in some intervention time, time to help some students who need support and do enrichment for accelerated students. How can AEC help with these things?

Student Voice: action steps have been submitted; done roundtables with 11/12 graders re: what they would like to see/could be done better; leading a safety initiative (students and crosswalks; teachers being at their doors between classes); getting feedback on their homework quicker; consistency on policing the dress code.

New Hires: need Art Teacher needed (cert), and social studies teachers.

ELA Performance Report: 2024-2025 School Year

Grades 5-10 — Three Testing Periods (PM1, PM2, PM3)

Executive Summary

Our ELA data from three testing periods shows consistent growth in student proficiency and advanced achievement levels across grades 5 through 10. Notably, grades 7 and 8 made the most significant strides in proficiency percentages and mean scores, while all grades demonstrated increases in the percentage of students performing at Levels 4 and 5. These results reflect effective instructional strategies and targeted interventions implemented throughout the year.

Grade 5

• **% Proficient:** Improved from 75% (PM1) to 88% (PM3)

- **% Level 3-5 growth:** From 75% → 83% → 88%
- Level 4 & 5 combined increased: Level 4 rose from 31% (PM1) to 42% (PM3),
 Level 5 from 13% to 19%
- **Insight:** Strong upward trend in proficiency and advanced levels, with more students reaching levels 4 and 5 by year-end.

Grade 6

- % Proficient: Slight dip from 91% (PM2) to 87% (PM3), but overall higher than PM1's 81%
- Level 4 & 5 combined: Stable, with slight decreases at PM3 (38% + 17%) vs PM2 (45% + 15%)
- Insight: High proficiency maintained; slight fluctuation at PM3 suggests targeted intervention might help sustain peak performance.

Grade 7

- % Proficient: Marked improvement from 67% (PM1) to 90% (PM3)
- Level 5 percentage nearly doubled from 18% (PM1) to 37% (PM3)
- Insight: Very strong gains in proficiency and advanced mastery, indicating effective growth strategies in place this year.

Grade 8

- **% Proficient:** Increased steadily from 61% (PM1) to 76% (PM3)
- Level 4 and 5 percentages doubled between PM1 and PM3 (from 17% + 11% to 24% + 24%)
- **Insight:** Solid upward trend; room to boost overall proficiency beyond 76% next year.

Grade 9

- % Proficient: Stable around mid to high 70s (74%-78%) across all tests
- Level 5 percentage increased significantly from 18% (PM1) to 35% (PM3)
- **Insight:** While overall proficiency is steady, increased advanced level achievement is promising.

Grade 10

- % Proficient: Improved from 81% (PM1) to 89% (PM3)
- Level 4 and 5 percentages: Remained relatively stable, with a slight increase in Level 5 from 26% to 28%
- **Insight:** Consistent proficiency with a slight upward trend in advanced mastery.

Summary Recommendations:

- **Positive growth** is evident across all grades, with the most significant gains in Grades 7 and 8.
- **Grades 6 and 9** show high proficiency but slight fluctuations, suggesting opportunities for targeted support to maintain peak results.
- Focus on increasing Level 4 and 5 students, especially in 5th and 8th grades where there's room for growth.
- Continue effective strategies used in Grades 7 and 10 to maintain momentum.
