D. Chad Ripke, High School Assistant Principal-Athletic Director

Overview

- Fall sports are going very well. Regular season league play wraps up at the end of the month.
- Soccer is currently 11-2 and ranked #3 in the RPI and take on NWC, who is ranked #2 and our only loss on year. Lost 2 games with other teams this year, one a forfeit by Chesterton Academy. Rylee Ripke became all time leading scorer for our school!

- Football is currently 5-2, ranked #6 in the RPI and sit in 2nd place in league currently.
- Volleyball is currently 18-5 overall, ranked #9 in the RPI and sit in 1st place in league and have yet to drop a set in league play. Senior night tomorrow, 10/23. If we win tomorrow, we host 11/4.
- Cross Country team is having a great season! Right now in the coaches poll for 2B, the boys are ranked #1 and the girls are ranked #6.
- Cheer team is doing a great job of supporting our athletic teams and cheering at FB, VB, and soccer games.

Areas of Focus

- · Homecoming week was a big success.
- New video board in the blue gym is incredible. Big shout out to Kristal Hayek for all the time she has put in making new graphics to be displayed at home games.
- Football play clocks were used at our last two home football games and we have received great feedback from players, coaches and officials.
- Girls wrestling we will have our first girl on the wresting team in quite some time. She will have similar duals, but often at different locations, so we are hiring an additional coach.
- Chewelah is forfeiting to us in football on 10/24, so we are looking for a football game, but have not had success.
- Soccer losing 2 games in forfeit, so we have been looking for at least one game, but no luck yet.
- Winter sports start practice on November 17th.
- First round of playoffs for fall sports will lead us to having games nearly every night the first week of November. Go Dawgs!

E. Mike Allen, K-8 Principal Assistant-Athletic Director

 - We had All-League Placers and individual records set (JC set a school record of 8:37 for the mile and a half); several other student placements

VII. Department Reports

A. Kent Bevers, Nutrition Services Director

Overview

Freeman SD Nutrition Services supports the philosophy of the National School Lunch and Breakfast Programs and will provide wholesome and nutritious meals for our students.

Areas of Focus

- 1. Met with K8 ASB students Sept. 24.
 - 1. Presented them with an opportunity to plan one lunch menu per month.
 - 2. Utilizing a School Lunch Celebration Calendar provided by School Nutrition Organization.
 - 3. Allowing students to select one day per month to help plan a menu based on events taken from the Celebrations Calendar.
 - 4. For example: Nov. 3 is National Sandwich Day. I've provided the ASB students with school lunch sandwich recipe resources they can use to try and identify a new sandwich they might want to plan for that day. Rocking Shredded Chicken BBQ Sandwich for 11/3.

- 5. This will allow them more opportunities for organization and planning, as I publish/submit menus for the following month two weeks in advance.
- 6. May do some of this for new breakfast items as well.
- 7. Also offered to class reps to help them report this to their classmates in the classroom.
- 8. Idea of student choice recipe for the menu.
- 2. K8 Hobart Dish Machine needs replacing. Working with Dr. Russell and various vendors to identify best price. Initial estimate around \$7,000. Hobart has an annual maintenance contract we can sign for \$5,000, which includes the motor replacement and additional repairs. This will save us overall in cost.

B. Everett Combs, Transportation Supervisor

Overview

 "The students of Freeman are the heart of our community and the reason we serve. The Freeman School District Transportation Department is dedicated to providing safe, reliable, and respectful transportation for all TK-12 students. We are committed to connecting home, school, and community, ensuring every student arrives ready to learn and thrive."

Areas of Focus

- We are requesting the approval of the purchase of a new bus for a 2026-27 school year (delivery from RWC) in keeping with our bus replacement schedule. RWC submitted the lowest state bid to OSPI for the category of type C (conventional) with a 72-77 passenger capacity.
- Our last bus we got for the 2025-26 school year cost about \$179,000. This one will be almost \$208,000. The reason for the big increase is:
 - The cost of buses has increased.
 - In the quote I'm requesting full a/c. As we get more into the hot months, especially as we look down the road (so to speak) at a midwinter break, there is a need for full a/c I believe because it definitely is hotter on a full metal bus than what the outside temps say. This is a \$12,000-\$13,000 option. Also, there is an increase in cost with the components to run the a/c, such as a larger capacity alternator and 3 batteries instead of 2.
 - Another cost increase is with the use of integrated seats, meaning that the
 5-point harness is built into the seats in the first two rows to accommodate the smaller TK students.
 - o I've also specked out underneath storage compartments only on the passenger side. I've not had these installed in the last 6 or so buses but we have found out that students on route buses or players on sport buses have larger equipment that when stored in the passenger area takes seats away from the students.

- Right now, we have \$277,300 in our depreciation account for the 2026-27 school year. This will increase by a few thousand once we receive the new little bus that you just approved and get it on the depreciation schedule. District options are coded to transportation instead of using our depreciation money.

C. Kirk Lally, Maintenance-Grounds Director

Todd Reed presented in Kirk Lally's absence.

D. Stacey Rawson, Interim Director of Student Services

Areas of Focus and Enrollment

Special Education

- Working on updating many of the department processes.
 - Aligning goals and service minutes on IEPs to ensure consistency for families
 - Making IEP meetings more family centered by having a clear agenda, including pictures and easy-to-understand language about their child's progress and data.

- Collaborating with the Special Education Team to make needed changes within our software IOL.
- 114 Students

Multilingual Learners (MLL)

- Initial Screenings complete for new high school students who qualify as MLL.
- On-demand translation service in place now to help communicate with families in their home language to support meaningful family engagement.

 We continue to add and change groups as student needs change throughout the year.

Highly Capable

- Completed End-of-Year reporting for 24/25 to ensure our allocation begins in October
- Meeting with a vendor on 10-17-25 to purchase Highly Capable Screening Tool for 2nd and 3rd grade.

Working hard to make sure we are in compliance with OSPI guidelines on attendance and truancy. First letters went out and we are starting to receive responses. 89% daily attendance currently - looking to improve. A Board Member asked how that aligns across area schools, and Mrs. Rawson will research and get back to the Board.

E. Todd Reed, Technology Director

Overview

Provide the highest quality technology-based services, in the most cost-effective manner, to help facilitate the FSD mission

Areas of Focus

- We are currently transitioning our staff onboarding automation from the Identity
 Access Management (IAM) system to the new Nexgen Identity Management (NIM)
 platform to improve efficiency, consistency, and account provisioning across the
 district. Hoping to transition by end of week.
- We kicked off our Safety and Security Committee meetings to plan and prioritize improvements to district technology and safety systems. Had several important partners at the table for initial discussions.
- We are evaluating Chromebook options and pricing, along with upgrades to our server infrastructure for the district technology plan. Chrome pricing is currently down, surprisingly.
- Dr. Russell publicly thanked Todd and Kirk for coming in on Sunday to make sure we were up and running for school Monday morning after a power outage.

A. Review Board Policy No. 2005 - School Improvement Plans

Dr. Russell reviewed Board Policy No. 2005 - School Improvement Plans. We have a campus-wide plan and wanted the board to look at it again.

B. Curriculum, Instruction and Assessment

C. School Safety, Culture and Environment

- Dr. Russell gave a FSD 2026 Safety, Security and Technology Plan Update kudos to Dave Teague's participation surrounding compliance with Alyssa's Law we have a team working hard on this so we are ready for implementation in 2026.
- Dr. Russell updated the Board regarding the I Love You Guys initiative surrounding school safety and security. Dan Corder from ESD, Joanna De Peralta, Todd Reed and Kirk Lally have been reviewing the five areas of focus and are currently shifting our current procedures to align with these simplified categories. Todd and Joe will meet with staff and students over the next couple of months to see feedback. We'll have an update to the Board on 12/10, will meet with staff on PD day January 5th seeking feedback, with the goal to have a complete update by end of January, 2026. This will run in a similar timeline with our Safety, Security & Tech Plan approval. We'll continue working through sensitivities of staff to move forward and focus on simplicity.
- Dr. Russell gave a Solar Project Update letting the Board know that everything continues to stay on track and ZEN has completed the loan financing. Quick reminder this is a no cost project for us, and Inland Power is working on their items. A Board Member suggested we add a public sign near the installation site recognizing the partners that made this happen, and reminding our community that the School District and our tax payers had no financial obligation to this.

Partnering with Parents and School/Community

Dr. Russell welcomed Superintendent/Principal of the Endicott School District, Trish Jeffries who has been with us today to job shadow and visit Freeman.

Another reminder that the Freeman Focus Fall/Winter Newsletter will be hitting district mailboxes within the next week.

E. Fiscal & Legal Accountability

Cash Flow

- General Fund review we are projected to finish with a 4.68% cash balance, and will look to shift the required minimum of cash reserves from 3% to 5% with a goal of 5% to 7%. Not seeing support from a state level on several items, so the cash reserve is critical. We'll need to keep a close eye on enrollment and our ConnectEd program in particular, as well as the overall cash flow, and utilize levy funds for items needed.
- Capital Fund Cash Balance we need to pay very close attention on revenues collected and planned expenditures. We specifically looked at first collection of levy funds for April 2026. All of this money gets reinvested back to our campus, and we need to follow through on our promises from our Levy communication (for example, Traffic Flow Study included in that 2-year map of levy funds). We will be back in front of voters in February of 2027 with our EP&O, which coincides with the first payoff of our construction bond. We have a 3-year, 6-year, and 9-year plan to meet goals. We need to be thinking further ahead than we ever have with technology improvements as our technology and procedures have to align.







NOTIFICATION AND DISSEMINATION OF INFORMATION ABOUT STUDENT OFFENSES AND NOTIFICATION OF THREATS OF VIOLENCE OR HARM

The district is committed to providing a safe and secure environment for all its students and staff. All students, including those who have committed or been adjudicated for offenses, have constitutional rights to public education.

A. Notification of Student Offenses from County Sheriff's Office, Courts, Department of Social and Health Services, Department of Corrections, and Other School Districts.

The district receives notices and information about student offenders from several statutorily authorized sources, including the county sheriff's office, the courts, the department of social and health services, the department of corrections, and other school districts where the student previously enrolled. The district will take appropriate precautionary measures when it receives notices and information of student offenses from any of these sources. Student discipline, if any, will be consistent with 3241 – Student Discipline.

The superintendent, or his or her designee, and school principals play an important role in determining and implementing appropriate precautionary measures relating to notices and information about student offenses. If the superintendent, a designee of the superintendent, or a principal of a school receives student offense information under RCW 28A.225.330 (notifications from other school districts), 9A.44.138 (sheriff notifications to school districts), 13.04.155 (court notifications to school districts), 13.40.215 (department of children, youth, and families notifications to school districts), or 72.09.730 (department of corrections notifications to school districts), the following notification provisions will be followed.

- 1. Sex Offenses and Registered Sex or Kidnapping Offenders.
 - a. Superintendent or Designee. Upon receipt of information about sex offenses as defined in RCW 9.94A.030 or upon receipt of information about registered sex or kidnapping offenders pursuant to RCW 9A.44.138, the superintendent or his or her designee will provide the information to the principal of the school where the student is enrolled or will enroll—or, if not known, where the student was most recently enrolled.
 - **b. Principals.** When the principal receives the information described above, he or she must then disclose the information as follows.

If the student is classified as a risk level II or III, the principal shall provide the information received to every teacher of the student and to any other personnel who, in the judgment of the principal, supervises the student or for security purposes should be aware of the student's record.

If the student is classified as a risk level I, the principal shall provide the information received only to personnel who, in the judgment of the principal, for security purposes should be aware of the student's record.

c. Convicted Juvenile Sex Offenders Attendance at Victims School. Convicted juvenile sex offenders are prohibited from attending the elementary, middle, or high school attended by their victims or their victims' siblings. The parents or legal guardians of the convicted juvenile sex offender shall be responsible for providing transportation or covering other costs associated with or required by the sex offender's change in school.

The Department of Social and Health Services (DSHS) Sex Offender School Attendance Program assists with ensuring that juvenile sex offenders, committed to Juvenile Rehabilitation Administration (JRA), do not enroll in the same school as their victim or their victims' siblings. If there is a conflict in schools, DSHS program staff will work with JRA to have the offender moved to another school.

- **d. Collaboration.** The principal or designee will consult and collaborate with department of corrections, juvenile justice staff, treatment providers, victim support groups, and families, as applicable, when working with students required to register as a sex or kidnapping offender.
- e. Inquiries by the Public. Law enforcement agencies receive relevant information about the release of sex and kidnapping offenders into communities and decide when such information needs to be released to the public. Therefore, district and school staff will refer all inquiries by the public at large (including parents and students) regarding students required to register as a sex or kidnapping offender directly to law enforcement.
- 2. Violent Offenses, Firearms and Dangerous Weapons Crimes, Unlawful Possession or Delivery of Controlled Substances, or School Disciplinary Actions.
 - a. Superintendent or Designee. Upon receipt of information about a violent offense as defined in RCW 9.94A.030, any crime under chapter 9.41 RCW, unlawful possession or delivery, or both, of a controlled substance in violation of chapter 69.50 RCW, or a school disciplinary action, the superintendent or designee will provide the information to the principal of the school where the student is enrolled or will enrolled—or, if not known, where the student was most recently enrolled.
 - **b. Principals.** When the principal, receives the information described above, he or she, has discretion to share the information with a district staff member if, in the principal's judgment, the information is necessary for:
 - The staff member to supervise the student;

- The staff member to provide or refer the student to therapeutic or behavioral health services; or
- Security purposes.

School principals and staff should use care not to allow a student's demographic or personal characteristics to bias the decision of whether to share information received.

Upon receipt of information about an adjudication in juvenile court for an unlawful possession of a controlled substance in violation of chapter 69.50 RCW, the principal must notify the student and the parent or legal guardian at least five days before sharing the information with a district staff member.

If either the student or the student's parent or legal guardian objects to the proposed sharing of the information, the student, the student's parent or legal guardian, or both, may, within five business days of receiving notice from the principal, appeal the decision to share the information with staff to the superintendent of the district in accordance with procedures developed by the district

The superintendent shall have five business days after receiving an appeal under the above to make a written determination on the matter. Determinations by the superintendent under this subsection are final and not subject to further appeal.

A principal may not share adjudication information under this subsection with a district staff member while an appeal is pending.

3. Public Records Act.

Any information received by district staff under this section is exempt from disclosure under the public records act (chapter 42.56 RCW) and may not be further disseminated except as provided in RCW 28A.225.330, other statutes or case law, and the family and educational and privacy rights act of 1994 (20 U.S.C. Sec. 1232g et seq.).

4. Assignment of Student Offenders to Certain Classrooms.

A student committing an offense under chapter 9A.36 (assault), 9A.40 (kidnapping, unlawful imprisonment, custodial interference, luring, trafficking, and coercion of involuntary servitude), 9A.46 (harassment), or 9A.48 RCW (arson, reckless burning, and malicious mischief) when the activity is directed toward the teacher, shall not be assigned to that teacher's classroom for the duration of the student's attendance at that school or any other school where the teacher is assigned.

A student who commits an offense under chapter 9A.36 (assault), 9A.40 (kidnapping, unlawful imprisonment, custodial interference, luring, trafficking, and coercion of involuntary servitude), 9A.46 (harassment), or 9A.48 RCW (arson,

reckless burning, and malicious mischief), when directed toward another student, may be removed from the classroom of the victim for the duration of the student's attendance at that school or any other school where the victim is enrolled.

B. Notification of Threats of Violence or Harm.

Students and school employees who are subjects of threats of violence or harm will be notified of the threats in a timely manner. "Threats of violence or harm" means direct or indirect communications by any means of the intent to inflict physical harm upon a specific individual or individuals or that place a person in fear of the imminent likelihood of serious harm.

The district will assess and address potential threats of violence or harm in a manner consistent with Policy and Procedure 3225 – School-Based Threat Assessment, other safety policies, and comprehensive safe school plans. In instances where the threat is deemed moderate risk or high risk, or requires further intervention to prevent violence or serious harm, the school administrator shall notify the parent and/or guardian of any student who is the target/recipient of a threat as well as the parent and/or guardian of any student who made the threat. The district will ensure that the notice is in a language the parent and/or guardian understands, which may require language assistance for parents or guardians with limited-English proficiency under Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964.

If there is a specific and significant threat to the health or safety of a student or other individuals, the district may disclose information from education records to appropriate parties whose knowledge of the information is necessary. Timing and details of the notice will be as extensive as permitted by the federal Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act, other legal limitations, and the circumstances.

The district may use information about a threat of harm or violence in connection with student discipline consistent with Policy and Procedure 3241 – Student Discipline.

The district, board, school officials, and school employees providing notice in good faith as required and consistent with the board's policies are immune from any liability arising out of such notification. A person who intentionally and in bad faith or maliciously, knowingly makes a false notification of a threat under this section is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable under RCW 9A.20.021.

C. Immunity.

Any school district or district employee who releases the information in compliance with federal and state law is immune from civil liability for damages unless it is shown that the school district or district employee acted with gross negligence or in bad faith.

D. Notification of Criminal Action

<u>Upon receiving a report that a criminal action is alleged to have been committed</u> against a student on school property during the school day or during a school-sponsored activity, including if there has been a shooting on school property, or that a

student has been detained based on probable cause that they were involved in criminal activity on school property during the school day, the district will immediately notify the student's parents or legal guardians.

POLICY ADOPTION, MANUALS AND ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURES

Policy Adoption

Proposed new policies and proposed changes in existing policies shall be presented in writing for reading and discussion. Unless it is deemed by the board that immediate action would be in the best interests of the district, the final vote for adoption shall take place not earlier than the next succeeding regular or special board meeting. Any written statement by any person relative to a proposed policy or amendment should be directed to the board secretary prior to the second reading. The board may invite oral statements from staff members or patrons as an order of business.

When the board of directors is considering a district policy or amendment to policy that is not expressly or by implication authorized by state or federal law, but which will promote the education of kindergarten through twelfth grade students in public schools or will promote the effective, efficient or safe management and operation of the district, the proposed policy shall be described in any notice of the meetings at which the policy will be considered, if the notice is issued pursuant to the Open Public Meetings Act, Ch. 42.30 RCW. The board of directors will provide an opportunity for public written and oral comment on such policies before adoption or amendment.

In the event that immediate action on a proposed policy is necessary, the motion for its adoption shall provide that immediate adoption is in the best interest of the district. No further action is required. All new or amended policies shall become effective upon adoption, unless a specific effective date is provided in the motion for adoption.

Policies as adopted or amended shall be made a part of the minutes of the meeting at which action was taken and shall also be included in the district's policy manual.

Non-substantive editorial revisions and changes in administrative, legal and/or cross references need not be approved by the board.

Policy Interpretation

It is the policy of the state of Washington that policies and procedures adopted by school districts under Title 28A RCW must prioritize the protection of every student's safety, access to the state's statutory program of basic education as defined in RCW 28A.150.203, and privacy, to the fullest extent possible, except as required by state or federal law.

Policy Manuals

The superintendent shall develop and maintain a current policy manual which contains the policies of the district.

The Board of Directors

The manual is intended both as a tool for district management as well as a source of information to patrons, staff and others about how the district operates. To that end each administrator shall have ready access to the manual. In addition, a manual shall be available in each school library and such other places as the superintendent may determine for the use of staff, students and community members.

All policy manuals distributed to anyone shall remain the property of the district. They shall be subject to recall at any time.

Administrative Procedures

The superintendent shall develop such administrative procedures as are necessary to ensure consistent implementation of policies adopted by the board.

When a written procedure is developed, the superintendent shall submit it to the board as an information item. Such procedures need not be approved by the board, though it may revise them when it appears that they are not consistent with the board's intentions as expressed in its policies. Procedures need not be reviewed by the board prior to their issuance; though on controversial topics, the superintendent may request prior board consultation.

GRADING AND PROGRESS REPORTS

The board believes that the cooperation of school and home is a vital ingredient in the growth and education of the student and recognizes the responsibility to keep parents informed of student welfare and progress in school.

The district will inform parents or legal guardians about their students' academic progress, including the right to receive periodic reports on their students' educational growth and development in accordance with RCW 28A.150.240 and to receive notice of their students' performance on state learning standard tests and assessments in accordance with RCW 28A.230.195. The district will also inform the parents or legal guardians whether their students' performance could threaten their ability to be promoted to the next grade level. Parents or legal guardians have the right to request an in-person meeting with their students' classroom teachers and principals to discuss any resources or strategies available to support and encourage their students' academic improvement.

The district will issue grades and written or electronic progress reports, and provide opportunities for parent to serve as a basis for continuous evaluation of the student's performance and to help in determining changes that should be made to effect improvement. These written and verbal reports shall be designed to provide information that will be helpful to the student, teacher, counselor and parent.

The district will comply with the marking/grading system incorporated into the statewide standardized high school transcript. Secondary students' grade points shall be reported for each term; individually and cumulatively.

The superintendent or designee will establish a system of reporting student progress and shall require all staff members to comply with such a system as part of their teaching responsibility.

At the beginning of each term, each teacher shall specify in writing the student learning goals or standards for his/her respective courses. If participation is used as the basis of mastery of a goal or standard, a student's grades may be adversely affected for failure to attend or participate, provided on that day there was a graded participation activity. If the teacher does not so advise students in writing, the teacher may not use attendance and participation in the grading process. Students, who feel that attendance or tardiness factors has been unfairly applied, may appeal to the principal to determine a resolution.

USE OF SCHOOL FACILITIES

The board subscribes to the belief that public schools are owned and operated by and for its patrons. The public is encouraged to use school facilities but shall be expected to reimburse the district for such use to insure that funds intended for education are not used for other purposes. On recommendation of the superintendent, the board shall set the rental rates schedule as needed.

The superintendent is authorized to establish procedures for use of school facilities, including rental rates, supervisory requirements, restrictions, and security. Those using school facilities shall maintain insurance for accident and liability covering persons using the district's facilities under the sponsorship of the organization.

The district does not discriminate based on race, ethnicity, creed, religion, color, national origin, age, honorably-discharged veteran or military status, sex, sexual orientation, gender expression, gender identity, homelessness, immigration or citizenship status, marital status, the presence of any sensory, mental or physical disability, neurodivergence, or the use of a trained dog guide or service animal by a person with a disability and provides equal access to Boy Scouts of America and other designated youth groups.

Community athletics programs that use district facilities will not discriminate against any person on the basis of sex in the operation, conduct or administration of their programs. The district will provide copies of the district's nondiscrimination policy to all third parties using district facilities.

For rental rate purposes, organizations seeking the use of school facilities have been divided into three categories:

School or Child-related Groups or Other Government Agencies

School or Child-related Groups or Other Government Agencies include those organizations whose main purpose is to promote the welfare of boys and girls or to provide members of the community access to government programs or opportunities for civic participation. Examples are: Scouts, Campfire, PTA, 4-H, city or county sponsored recreation groups, polling places, political caucuses and governmental groups. The district will provide official recruiting representatives of the state and United States military forces, Job Corps, Peace Corps and AmeriCorps with access to school facilities (including number of days and type of presentation space) equal to and no less than the access provided to other post-secondary occupational or educational representatives.

When facilities are used outside of regular school hours, or when the district incurs extra utility, cleaning or supervision costs, a fee, to be established by the superintendent, shall be charged to recoup those costs. Additionally, youth

organizations engaged in sports activities and using school facilities must provide a statement of compliance with the policies for the management of concussion and head injury in youth sports as required by RCW 28A.600.

Nonprofit Groups

Nonprofit groups and organizations may use school facilities for lectures, promotional activities, rallies, entertainment, college courses, or other activities for which public halls or commercial facilities generally are rented or owned. The district shall charge a rental rate in excess of costs incurred. Excess charges may be waived when a service club or other nonprofit group is raising funds for charitable purposes.

Professional fund raisers representing charities must provide evidence that they are registered and bonded by the state of Washington. Such fund-raisers must provide evidence that the charity will receive at least sixty (60) percent of the gross revenues received from the public prior to approval to use the facilities.

Similar treatment may be granted public universities and colleges when offering college courses within the community or when any university/college is offering a course for staff at the request of the district. Nonprofit groups of the kind that in most communities have their own facilities (churches, lodges, veterans groups, granges, etc.) who wish to use district facilities on a regular, but temporary, basis may do so under this rental rate.

Commercial Enterprises

Commercial Enterprises include profit-making organizations and business-related enterprises. While the district would prefer these organizations use commercial or private facilities, facilities may be rented for nonregular use at the prevailing rate charged by commercial facilities in the area.

District-sponsored activities, including curricular and co-curricular functions, retain first priority in use of facilities. Authorization for use of school facilities shall not be considered as endorsement of or approval of the activity group or organization nor for the purposes it represents.

NONDISCRIMINATION

The district is committed to complying with anti-discrimination laws.

Definition

"Protected status" is short for the phrase "sex, race, ethnicity, creed, religion, color, national origin, honorably discharged veteran or military status, sexual orientation, gender expression, gender identity, homelessness, immigration or citizenship status, the presence of any sensory, mental, or physical disability, neurodivergence, or the use of a trained dog guide or service animal by a person with a disability."

Nondiscrimination Statement

The district will adopt a nondiscrimination statement that must include the following:

- Notice that the district may not discriminate in any programs or activities based on sex, race, ethnicity, creed, religion, color, national origin, honorably discharged veteran or military status, sexual orientation, gender expression, gender identity, homelessness immigration or citizenship status, the presence of any sensory, mental, or physical disability, neurodivergence, or the use of a trained dog guide or service animal.
- The name or title, office address, and telephone number of the employee designated as the compliance officer under this policy, the Section 504 Coordinator, and the Title IX Coordinator.
- Notice that the district provides equal access to the Boy Scouts of America and any other youth group listed in Title 36 of the United States Code as a patriotic society.

The district will include this statement in written announcements, notices, recruitment materials, employment application forms, and other publications made available to all students, parents, or employees.

The district may combine the statement described above with the notice described in Policy 3205.

Model Student Handbook Language

The district will adopt the model student handbook language described in RCW 28A.300.286 and include the language in any student, parent, employee, and volunteer handbook it or its schools publish and on its and its schools' websites.

Discriminatory Harassment

Students have a right to be free from discriminatory harassment. The district violates that right if the following conditions are met:

- 1. The alleged conduct is based on a student's protected status.
- 2. The alleged conduct creates a hostile environment. A hostile environment is created if the alleged conduct is sufficiently severe, persistent, or pervasive that it limits or denies a student's ability to participate in or benefit from the district's course offerings, including any educational program or activity. A hostile environment could impact a student's life in many ways. Physical illness, anxiety about going to school, or a decline in grades or attendance could signal a hostile environment.
- 3. After receiving notice of the alleged conduct, the district fails to take prompt and appropriate action to investigate it or fails to take prompt and effective steps reasonably calculated to end the harassment, eliminate the hostile environment, prevent its recurrence, and remedy its effects as appropriate. The district has notice of discriminatory harassment if a reasonable employee knew or, in the exercise of reasonable care, should have known about the harassment. Employees may have notice of discriminatory harassment if they receive an oral report from a student, parent, or other individual; receive a written complaint; witness harassing conduct; or become aware of harassment by members of the community or the media.

Harassing conduct may include verbal acts and name-calling, graphic and written statements, or other conduct that may be physically threatening, harmful, or humiliating.

When the district receives notice of potential discriminatory harassment, it will take prompt and appropriate action to investigate and, as applicable, take prompt and effective steps reasonably calculated to end the harassment, eliminate the hostile environment, prevent its recurrence, and remedy its effects. Examples of the steps the district might take include imposing discipline, separating individuals, developing a safety plan, offering counseling, and providing additional training and instruction. These steps will not penalize the student who was harassed.

Complaint Procedure

The district will adopt a complaint procedure in accordance with chapter 392-190 WAC.

Annually, the district will publish a notice of the complaint procedure in a way that is reasonably calculated to inform all students, parents, and employees of it. The district will provide the notice in a language each parent can understand, which may require language assistance in accordance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 for those with limited English proficiency.

The district will not adopt any policy, procedure, or practice that would limit a person's right to file a complaint under the complaint procedure.

Policy No. 3210 Students

Compliance Officer

The superintendent will designate an employee who is responsible for monitoring and coordinating the district's compliance with chapter 392-190 WAC and the guidelines the Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction has adopted under WAC 392-190-005.

The compliance officer is responsible for ensuring that all complaints filed under the complaint procedure are promptly investigated and resolved.

Training

The district will train all administrators, certificated personnel, and classroom personnel regarding their responsibilities under this policy and chapter 392-190 WAC. The training will aim to raise awareness of and eliminate bias based on sex, race, creed, religion, color, national origin, honorably discharged veteran or military status, sexual orientation, gender expression, gender identity, the presence of any sensory, mental or physical disability, or the use of a trained dog guide or service animal.

Retaliation Prohibited

The district will not intimidate, threaten, coerce, or discriminate against any individual who seeks to secure their rights under this policy or chapter 392-190 WAC or because the individual has filed a complaint under the complaint procedure. Further, the district will not tolerate someone else retaliating against another because they sought to secure their rights under this policy or chapter 392-190 WAC or because they have filed a complaint under the complaint procedure.

Any person who retaliates will be subject to appropriate discipline.

Policy No. 5010 Personnel

NONDISCRIMINATION AND AFFIRMATIVE ACTION

Definition

"Protected status" is short for the phrase "age, sex, race, ethnicity, creed, religion, color, national origin, honorably discharged veteran or military status, sexual orientation, gender expression, gender identity, homelessness, immigration or citizenship status, marital status, the presence of any sensory, mental, or physical disability, neurodivergence, or the use of a trained dog guide or service animal by a person with a disability."

Nondiscrimination

The district is committed to an educational and working environment free from discrimination and harassment bases on a person's protected status.

The district will not deny any person the benefit of, or subject any person to discrimination in employment, recruitment, promotion, advancement, consideration, or selection in connection with employment based on their protected status.

The district will make all employment decisions in a non-discriminatory manner and will not limit, segregate, or classify any person in a way that could adversely affect their employment opportunities or status based on their protected status.

The district will not enter into any contractual or other relationship that directly or indirectly results in the discrimination of any person in connection with employment based on their protected status.

The district will not grant preferential treatment to applications for employment based on an applicant's enrollment at any education institution or entity that only predominantly admits students based on sex, race, color, or national origin if the giving of such preferences has the effect of discriminating based on sex, race, color, or national origin.

Equal Employment Opportunity

The district will provide equal employment opportunity and treatment for all applicants and staff in recruitment, hiring, retention, assignment, transfer, promotion and training.

Examples of Employment Discrimination

Employment discrimination may include the following:

- Unfair treatment based on an employee's protected status, including unfair or separate treatment in pay scale, assignment of duties, opportunities for advancement, conditions of employment, hiring practices, leaves of absence, hours of employment, and assignment of instructional and non-instructional duties.
- 2. Harassment based on an employee's protected status by supervisors, coworkers, or others in the workplace that is so severe or persistent that it creates a hostile environment.

- 3. Denial of a reasonable workplace accommodation that an employee needs because of religious beliefs or a disability.
- 4. Retaliation because an employee complained about employment discrimination or assisted with an employment discrimination investigation or lawsuit.
- 5. Making employment or placement decisions based on stereotypes or assumptions about one's protected status.
- 6. Discriminating against individuals married to or otherwise associated with people of a certain group.
- 7. Prohibiting an employee from using the restroom consistent with his or her gender identity.

These are examples of employment discrimination and are not an exhaustive list.

Discriminatory Harassment

The district prohibits discriminatory harassment in the workplace. Discriminatory harassment is unwelcome or offensive conduct directed toward a person based on their protected status that is sufficiently severe or pervasive to create an environment that a reasonable person would consider intimidating, hostile, or offensive. Petty slights, annoyances, or isolated incidents, unless extremely serious, will not rise to the leave of discriminatory harassment.

Harassing conduct may include, but is not limited to, offensive jokes, slurs, epithets, name-calling, physical assaults, threats, intimidation, ridicule, mockery, insults, putdowns, offensive objects or pictures, and interference with work performance.

When the district becomes aware of potential discriminatory harassment, it will promptly investigate the conduct and, as appropriate, take reasonable steps to prevent and promptly correct the harassing conduct.

Employment of Persons With Disabilities

To fulfill its commitment of nondiscrimination to those with disabilities, the following conditions shall prevail:

- 1. The district will not discriminate against a qualified individual based on their disability, nor will the district limit, segregate or classify any applicants for employment or any staff member in any way that adversely affects their opportunities or status because of a disability. This prohibition applies to all aspects of employment from recruitment to promotions and includes fringe benefits and other elements of compensation.
- 2. The district will reasonably accommodate the known physical or mental limitations of an otherwise qualified disabled applicant or staff member unless it is clear that an accommodation would impose an undue hardship.

Reasonable accommodations may include:

making facilities used by staff readily accessible and usable by persons with disabilities; job restructuring; part-time or modified work schedules; acquisition or

modification of equipment or devices; the provision of readers or interpreters; and other similar actions.

An undue hardship means an accommodation would be unduly costly, extensive, substantial or disruptive or would fundamentally alter the nature or operation of the district. In determining whether an accommodation would impose an undue hardship on the district, the district may consider, among other things, the cost of the accommodation, the district's size, the district's financial resources, and the nature and structure of its operations.

- 3. The district will not use any employment tests or criteria that screens out persons with disabilities unless the test or criteria is clearly and specifically job-related, and the district will not use such tests or criteria if alternative tests or criteria that do not screen out persons with disabilities are available.
- 4. While the district may not make pre-employment inquiries as to whether an applicant has a disability or as to the nature and severity of any such disability, it may inquire into an applicant's ability to perform job-related functions.

Nondiscrimination for Military Service

The district will not discriminate against any person who is a member of, applies to be a member or, performs, has performed, applies to perform, or has an obligation to perform service in a uniformed service, on the basis of their participation in a uniformed service. This includes in initial employment, retention in employment, promotion, or any benefit of employment. The district will also not discriminate against any person who has participated in the enforcement of these rights under state or federal law.

Affirmative Action Program

The district will develop an affirmative action employment plan or program that includes appropriate provisions designed to eliminate discrimination based on protected status.

Regarding sex discrimination, the district's affirmative action employment plan or program must include the requirements to maintain credential requirements for all personnel without regard to sex; make no differentiation in pay scale based on sex; make no differentiation in the assignment of school duties based on sex except where an assignment would involve duty areas or situations such as, but not limited to, a shower room, where persons might be disrobed; provide the same opportunities for advancement for males and females; and make no differentiation in conditions of employment based on sex, including, but not limited to, hiring practices, leaves of absence, hours of employment, and assignment of or payment for instructional or noninstructional duties.

Complaint Procedure

The district will adopt a complaint procedure in accordance with chapter 392-190 WAC.

Annually, the district will publish a notice of the complaint procedure in a way that is reasonably calculated to inform all employees of it. The district will provide the notice in

a language each employee can understand, which may require language assistance in accordance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 for those with limited English proficiency.

The district will not adopt any policy, procedure, or practice that would limit a person's right to file a complaint under the complaint procedure.

Compliance Officer

The superintendent will designate an employee who is responsible for monitoring and coordinating the district's compliance with chapter 392-190 WAC and the guidelines the Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction has adopted under WAC 392-190-005.

The compliance officer is responsible for ensuring that all complaints filed under the complaint procedure are promptly investigated and resolved.

Retaliation Prohibited

The district will not intimidate, threaten, coerce, or discriminate against any individual who seeks to secure their rights under this policy or chapter 392-190 WAC or because the individual has filed a complaint under the complaint procedure. Further, the district will not tolerate someone else retaliating against another because they sought to secure their rights under this policy or chapter 392-190 WAC or because they have filed a complaint under the complaint procedure.

Any person who retaliates will be subject to appropriate discipline.

Policy No. 3226 Students

Interviews and Interrogations of Students on School Premises

Although the district values its relationships with law enforcement, the Department of Children, Youth, and Families (DCYF,) and the county health department, to minimize interruption of the instructional program, The district endiscourages interviews and interrogations of students on school premises. As a general rule, interviews and interrogations by any agency, including law enforcement, the Department of Social and Health Services (DSHS) DSHS and the county health department(s) should to take place at the agency or the student's home, rather than off school premises in order to minimize interruption to the instructional program.

However, there are limited circumstances when an interview of students at school is warranted, for example school-initiated investigations, child abuse investigations, and /or serious crime investigations. When an onsite interview or interrogation is warranted by the circumstances of a case, the district will utilize the procedures and protocols associated with this policy, which were developed in cooperation with these agencies entities, and To ensure that investigations are not impeded and that students and parent(s)/guardian(s) are afforded all rights under required by law, the superintendent will establish protocols for interviews and interrogations of students on school premises. The protocols will interviews of students as witnesses, victims, and suspects are treated differently, address child abuse and neglect investigations, criminal investigations, and health department investigations.

In contrast to the limited circumstances noted above, the work of immigration agents does not overlap with the work or duties of the district. This is because the district's obligation to educate the children residing within its borders is not diminished by the children or parents' immigration status. The district supports the federal immigration enforcement policy that directs immigration agents to avoid questioning and arrests at sensitive locations, including schools. Therefore, staff shall not grant information or access to immigration agents unless / until the district Superintendent and /or General Counsel determine the request complies with *Plyler v. Doe* and other applicable laws according to the criteria in the associated procedure.

INTERVIEWS AND INTERROGATIONS OF STUDENTS ON SCHOOL PREMISES

To minimize interruption to the instructional program, the district will conduct interviews and interrogations of students on school premises whenever possible. When the circumstances warrant an onsite interview/interrogation, staff will follow the protocols in this procedure.

1. Entry to a School

- a. A law enforcement officer (e.g., police officer, sheriff deputy, and immigration agent), child protective services worker, or health department official shall contact the principal or designee upon entering a school building and present proper identification.
- b. School building administrative personnel will cooperate as specified below, treating interviews of students as witnesses, victims, and suspects differently.

2. Interview of Student Witness/Victim of Criminal Activity

- a. Students of any age who are witnesses to a crime or victims of a crime may be interviewed without parent/guardian consent.
- b. Should it become apparent during a witness/victim interview that the student under the age of 12 years of age is the suspect of a crime, law enforcement shall immediately stop questioning until parent/guardian consent is obtained.
- c. The principal or designee will make a reasonable effort to notify the parent/guardian of the interview if, in the opinion of the law enforcement officer(s), the notification will not hinder the investigation. By law, the principal or designee may not prevent the interview and will so inform the parent/guardian.
- d. When prior notice has been given to the parent/guardian, the principal or designee will convey any expression of objection by the parent/guardian about the interview to the law enforcement officer(s).
- e. If the parent/guardian is not present for the interview, the principal or <a href="https://example.com/orlaw-entorcement-entor-en

3. Interview of Student Witness/Victim, Child Abuse or Neglect Investigation:

- a. Students of any age who are witnesses to, or victims of, abuse or neglect may be interviewed so long as the interviewer obtains the student's consent in the presence of the principal or designee. A student may not be interviewed without his or her consent unless the interviewer has a warrant or determines that exigent circumstances exist.
- b. Should it become apparent during a witness/victim interview that the student under 12 years of age is the suspect of a crime, law enforcement shall immediately stop questioning until parent/guardian consent is obtained.

- c. The principal or designee will make a reasonable effort to notify the parent/guardian about the interview if, in the opinion of the law enforcement officer(s), the notification will not hinder the investigation.
- d. When the parent/guardian has been given prior notice, the principal or designee will convey any expression of objection by the parent/guardian about the interview to the law enforcement officer(s).
- e. If the parent/guardian is not present for the interview, the principal or other school employeedesignee will be present if the student, and law enforcement, or the Department of Children, Youth, and Families (DCYF) requests.
- f. If the principal or designee believes the student is being intimidated, threatened, or coerced; that the student is unaware that he or she is free to leave the interview at any time; or that the student is in physical or emotional distress, the principal or designee may request to take a break and make those concerns known to the interviewer. The principal or designee may then request to continue, temporarily suspend, or terminate the interview.
- g. The school will document the date, time, place, interview length, student name, consent to be interviewed, the interviewer, and any additional parties present.

4. Interview of Student Suspect of Criminal Activity:

- a. Student suspects under the age of 12 may be interviewed only with parent/guardian consent.
- b. Washington State law permits students 12 years and older, who are suspects of a crime, to be interviewed without parent/guardian consent.
- c. The principal or designee will make a reasonable effort to notify the parent/guardian of the interview if, in the opinion of the law enforcement officer(s), the notification will not hinder the investigation. By law, the principal or designee may not prevent the interview from taking place and will so inform the parent/guardian.
- d. When prior notice has been given to the parent/guardian, the principal or designee will convey any expression of objection about the interview made by the parent/guardian to the law enforcement officer(s).
- e. Law enforcement must provide students under the age of 18 with access to an attorney for consultation before the student waives any constitutional rights.

5. Interview of Student Sought by Health Department Officials:

a. The principal or designee will permit a health department official to conduct a confidential interview with a student suspected of being in contact with an individual infected with a communicable disease when the interview is during school hours, and the principal will not release the student to travel to the health department.

6. Interview of Student Sought by Immigration Agents:

a. If an immigration agent requests access to a student or a school site, staff shall deny immediate access, alert the principal, and forward the request to the Superintendent and/or General Counsel for review.

- b. The Superintendent and/or General Counsel shall ask for the immigration agent's credentials, ask the agent why the agent is requesting access, and ask to see a warrant
- c. To be valid, the warrant must state the purpose of the interview, identify the search location, references a specific person, include an accurate date, and be signed by a federal or state judge.
- d. Immigration agents must also provide written authority, instructing them to enter district property, and stating the purpose of the entry from one of the following Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE), the Assistant Director of Operations, Homeland Security Investigations (HISI), the Executive Associate Director (EAD) of HISI, the Assistant Director for Field Operations, Enforcement and Removal Operations (ERO), or the EAD of ERO.
- e. Upon receipt and examination of the required information, the Superintendent and/or General Counsel will determine whether immigration agents will be allowed to contact or question the individual named on the warrant and will communicate that decision to the principal or designee.
- f. The Superintendent, General Counsel, principal, or designee will make a reasonable effort to notify the parent/guardian of the interview.
- g. The Superintendent, and/or General Counsel, principal, or designee will ask to be present during the interview and ensure the agents are not given access to information, records, or areas beyond that specified in the warrant.

7. Access to Student Records

- a. If the parent/guardian or student over 18 years of age has not filed a written objection to the release of directory information, anyone may request and be granted the directory information about students as designated in the district's student records policy and procedure (see Model Policy and Procedure 3231). The actual residential addresses of participants in Washington State's Address Confidentiality Program are not to be available for release as directory information. Social Security numbers, student identification numbers (with authentication factors such as a secret password or personal identification number) and other personally identifiable information are not considered directory information.
- b. Student records protected by the federal Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) may only be examined or released following written permission from a minor student's parent/guardian or an adult-student over 18, pursuant to a court order or subpoena, or in response to a health or safety emergency. Student records may also be examined by or released to DCYF or law enforcement of DCYF or law enforcement is conducting an investigation of family assessment of alleged abuse or neglect of a student, and the records are relevant to the alleged abuse or neglect.

8. Taking a Student into Custody

a. In a criminal matter, a law enforcement officer is not required to have a warrant in order for the school to release the student into law enforcement custody. The principal or designee will make immediate reasonable effort to notify the

- parent/guardian unless directed not to by the law enforcement officer because child abuse or neglect is alleged against the parent/guardian, or some other similar, specified reason exists for prohibiting notification.
- b. School authorities may request that the law enforcement officer put his or her reasoning for the-denial of parent/guardian notification into writing.
- c. A student may not be taken into custody at school on a truancy petition.
- d. Immigration agents are required to have a subpoena or warrant signed by a judge in order for the district to release a student into their custody.
