B. Everett Combs, Transportation Director

Overview

- "The students of Freeman are the heart of our community and the reason we serve. The Freeman School District Transportation Department is dedicated to

providing safe, reliable, and respectful transportation for all TK–12 students. We are committed to connecting home, school, and community, ensuring every student arrives ready to learn and thrive."

Areas of Focus

- We just sold our bus #20 through GovDeals.com for \$7,250. We have sold 6 buses for a total of over \$42,000 in the last few years. We will be posting one more bus to be sold on GovDeals. This will be the last one we will be able to sell for a couple years now that the depreciation years from the state have increased. After this sale we will have 18 buses until the new one arrives in August or September.
- Our three new gates are installed, and we have worked out the timing issues.
- We are currently testing whether we should switch our radio systems to digital or stay with analog. More to come on this.

- Thank you to our anonymous donor for the \$5,000 donation over 2 years. We are using the funds to purchase equipment and supplies for our transition-to-adulthood SPED program with Mrs. Warr at the High School. Helps with vocational training.

- Working toward completion of all SPED end-of-year reports with OSPI. 2 already completed thanks to Mrs. Warr and Mrs. Kazmi's support!

- Alan and I attended a regional McKinney Vento finance meeting on 5-18. Consensus building around communication between districts. Very little will change for us.

- Title 1 allocation preliminary information shows a \$6,000 drop in Title funding from \$36,000 to \$30,000, so needing to get creative

- The MTSS team is excited to attend the summer WA MTS conference again this year! This helps support our students who need academic and behavioral intervention
- Summer Intervention for Title/ LAP students entering 1st-6th grade (anticipate around 40 students using these tools to stay updated this summer)

E. Todd Reed, Technology Director

Overview

Provide the highest quality technology-based services, in the most cost-effective manner, to help facilitate the FSD mission.

Areas of Focus

- We have been test piloting the Verkada Guest visitor management system to strengthen campus safety, modernize visitor check-in procedures, as well as student sign in and sign out procedures. The system provides features such as instant badge printing, photo ID verification, customizable alerts, and streamlines front office workflows as we continue evaluating long-term implementation options.
- Testing and assessments are currently being conducted district-wide and are progressing smoothly with no major technology issues impacting the process.
- Engaging in comprehensive collaboration with principals to strategically plan and coordinate the scheduling of the student Chromebook check-in process for both FMS and FHS, ensuring a seamless and efficient execution as well as preparing for the 2026 graduation.

F. Alan Steinolfson, Finance Director

Enrollment Update

- Trending about 14 FTE over budget, gained 2 FTE in K-12 and 1 FTE in TK and 2 headcount in SPED in May from April. CTE enrollment this year is down from the previous year.

Cash Flow - General Fund

- Payroll was up this month - PD Day and payout of lump sum spring coaching contracts.
- Half of the year we bring in more revenue than expenditures.
- Planning to end the year at a deficit - but still around 4%.

Budget Extension - General Fund

- Still determining how much we need to do. We did a conservative budget based off of 14 less FTE.

Cash Flow - Capital Projects

- No real changes from prior months - same projects for this summer and the tech plan.

Budget Extension - Capital Projects

- Looking at around \$110,000 extension. We increased the tech plan by \$50,000 after last year's budget was adopted and have spent more of Facilities than planned.

Budget for next year

- Have completed the Salary & Benefits part of the budget and the revenues. Have MSOC's left and the 4 year budget. HR budget is only increasing approximately \$75,000 due to attrition.

IX. Superintendent's Report

A. Curriculum, Instruction and Assessment

FSD 2027-2028 School Calendar Update (Draft/Information)

- Balanced Calendar Committee has been involved in the creation of this draft, with the biggest influence being the survey that went out to staff (response rate has dropped each year)
- Staff survey did not show interest in the full mid-winter break (week of President's Day) - instead the preference is to spread the dates out in the spring to have longer weekends
- Danielle asked if the 3-day and 4-day weeks have impact on learning for students as she has noticed as a mom of kids in all 3 schools that they tend to not have as much work those weeks and their schedules seem less rigorous; suggestion was made to emphasize this with teachers that expectations should remain the same regardless of the number of days in the school week - some teachers are better at this than others
- The board also asked the reasoning for not ending the school year on a Friday - it was explained that if the two snow days are used and we go over, it gives us room to add the days needed without having to push to a Monday to end the school year
- This 2027-2028 draft schedule aligns our spring break with area schools, unlike the 2026-2027 school year spring break
- Dave asked if a 4-day school week is on the table in the future; Mr. Straw thought there were schools in the area piloting this, but it has not been discussed for Freeman

B. School Safety, Culture and Environment

Lisa mentioned Kirk's update regarding safety.

C. Partnering with Parents and School/Community

Freeman is hosting GSI's InSchools Dinner event on 5/28 at the PRTC from 5-7pm.

David Funk is presenting regarding Freeman's solar project, with the intention of a tour of our completed panels that will be going live soon. We'll have two MS students there to

speaking about what they learned regarding solar, and then there will be a five student Q&A panel (MS and HS students).

The InSchools Dinners are an opportunity for business leaders to engage directly with regional K-12 school superintendents. This unique gathering offers a space for open dialogue, where you can ask candid questions, gain insights into the challenges and opportunities within our education system, and explore ways to strengthen the connection between business and education.

D. Fiscal & Legal Accountability

Our TK enrollment is dropping to 20 spots for next year due to state funding decisions. We also have a higher graduating class than our incoming Kindergarten class. Overall we are projected to be down 50 FTE students, which will have a tremendous impact on our budget. There is a TK meeting next week to find out if we can get additional slots based on other schools usage of their allotment. This declining enrollment is a trend around our area in most every district, and several districts are going through layoffs.

Bill Morphy moved the Board approve the Anticipated Co-curricular Staff 2026-2027, as presented. Danielle Santman seconded the motion and it passed 4-1. Dave Teague opposed. There was no discussion.

E. Approval of FHS Booster Club Policy Change Proposal

Rachael Schwartz introduced herself as the Booster Club Membership Chair and mentioned the Booster Club's interest in changing their policy regarding advertisement.

Clayton Panzeri then introduced himself as the President of the Booster Club and said they have been gaining momentum with business memberships. This is great news, but the Booster Club is wanting to be able to put names of sponsors around the facilities in signage.

Year-End Report (2025–2026)

Summary

During the 2025–2026 school year, the Freeman School District successfully launched **Freeman ConnectEd (FCE)**, a pilot Alternative Learning Experience (ALE) program. Designed to provide a flexible and personalized online learning environment, FCE was engineered to replace and build upon our previous ALE model, SOARS.

This report provides the School Board with an analysis of student performance, course enrollment, and retention metrics from our inaugural pilot year. The data demonstrates exceptionally strong academic completion rates and validates our rural consortium framework.

Program Enrollment & Course Outcomes

The pilot year tracked **125 total course registrations**. Course outcomes for FCE are divided into three primary administrative designations: **Completed** (passed), **Dropped**, and **Still Enrolled / In Progress** (re-engaging in August 2026 for the 2026–2027 school year).

High-Level Metrics

- **Total Course Enrollments:** 125
- **Course Completion Rate:** 93% (6/8/26). “Still Enrolled” courses will be rolled over to the 2026-2027 School year, which is reflected in the percentage given.
- **Course Drop Rate:** 5% (Only 7 courses dropped out of 125 for a multitude of reasons. This does not reflect the failure of a class.)

Quick Observations

- **High-Volume Success in ELA:** English/Language Arts represented our largest enrollment sector.
- **Elective Engagement:** Art and Electives showed the highest overall completion rate, proving to be excellent pathways for building student confidence and maintaining program engagement.
- **Credit Retrieval Stability:** Across departments, math and science courses designated for "Credit Retrieval" saw strong finalization, successfully getting non-traditional students back on track for graduation.

Enrollment Retention & Regional Consortium Insights

- An element of the FCE model is our **Rural Consortium framework**, which opens access to outlying rural school districts, maximizing regional resource efficiency.
- A deep-dive into students FCE during the 2025–2026 academic year yields highly encouraging data regarding retention of our local Freeman student body.

Key Demographics of Unenrollment (7 Total Students)

- **Local Resident Stability:** Only **1 out of the 7** students who dropped a course was a primary Freeman School District student.
- **Consortium Utilization:** **6 out of the 7** course drops belonged to students from outlying partner rural districts, indicating that possible logistical barriers may exist for out-of-district learners.
- **Legacy Program Transition:** **4 out of the 7** dropped courses were associated with students transitioning from the previous **SOARS ALE** program. This indicates students accustomed to the older format faced unique adaptation challenges adjusting to the modernized FCE platform.

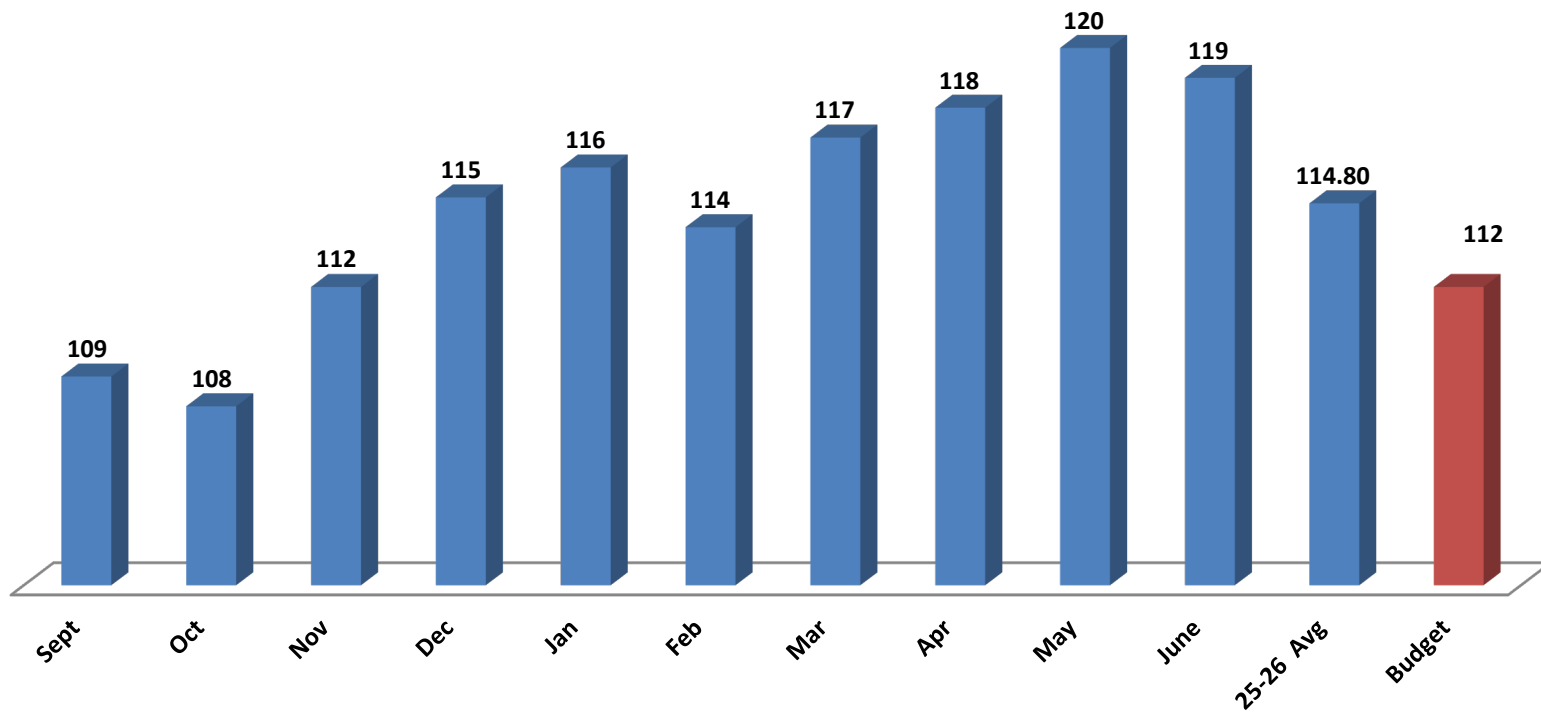

SICK LEAVE

Compliance with RCW 28A.400.300

The district will grant each certificated and classified employee of the district sick leave in accordance with RCW 28A.400.300 and applicable collective bargaining agreements.

Attendance Incentive Program

Eligible employees may cash out accumulated sick leave in accordance with WAC 392-136-015 and WAC 392-136-020.

Employees Covered by RCW 49.46.210

For employees covered by RCW 49.46.210, the district will comply with that statute and the regulations that implement it. The superintendent or designee may adopt a procedure that addresses sick leave use by employees covered by RCW 49.46.210.

Verification

For employees not covered by RCW 49.46.210, the district may require those employees to provide verification for the need to take sick leave when they take more than three consecutive days of sick leave.

Unpaid Leave

Employees who exhaust their paid sick leave may request unpaid leave. At its discretion, the district will determine whether to grant unpaid leave. If an employee does not receive approval for unpaid leave, but, nonetheless, does not attend work, they will be considered absent without leave and may be subject to discipline.

SICK LEAVE

This procedure applies only to employees covered by RCW 49.46.210.

Frontloaded Paid Sick Leave

The district will provide employees with a notification of front-loaded sick leave. The notification will provide details of the amount of paid sick leave that will be placed into the employee's sick leave bank at the start of the school year or at the start of their employment. It will include the calculations used to determine the front-loaded hours, the paid sick leave accrual year, and an employee's eligibility details. Unused front-loaded paid sick leave balances of forty hours or less will carry over to the following year.

The district will provide written or electronic notice for each paid sick leave frontloading period, providing the amount of paid sick leave frontloaded, the calculation used to determine the amount of paid sick leave, and any adjustments based on additional accrued hours.

If an employee's frontloaded paid sick leave is less than the amount they are entitled to accrue, the district will make any additional amounts of paid sick leave available for the employee's use no later than thirty days after the discrepancy is identified.

If an employee uses more paid sick leave than they would have otherwise accrued absent frontloading, the district will not seek reimbursement from the employee for such paid sick leave during ongoing employment. Any deductions from wages must be made in compliance with WAC 296-128-730(5).

Reasonable Notice for the Use of Paid Sick Leave

Employees must provide reasonable written notice of an absence from work for the use of paid sick leave. If an employee's absence is foreseeable, the employee must notify their supervisor at least ten days, or as early as practicable, before the first day of paid sick leave is used. If possible, the notification must include the expected duration of the absence.

If an employee's absence is unforeseeable, the employee must contact their supervisor as soon as possible before the required start of their shift. If circumstances allow, employees should provide notice as soon as the employee learns of the need for paid sick leave. If possible, the notification should include the expected duration of the absence.

Notice to Take Leave under the Domestic Violence Leave Act

Employees must give advance oral or written notice as soon as possible for the foreseeable use of paid sick leave under the Domestic Violence Leave Act.

If an employee is unable to give advance notice because of an emergent or unforeseen circumstance related to taking leave under the Domestic Violence Leave Act, the employee or their designee must give oral or written notice to their supervisor no later than the end of the first day that the employee takes leave.

Verification

If an employee has used paid sick leave for more than three consecutive days, the employee must provide verification that establishes or confirms that the use of paid sick leave is for an authorized purpose.

Verification for Taking Leave to Care for Yourself or a Family Member

When taking leave for reasons under RCW 49.46.210(1)(b)(i) or (ii), employees must provide a doctor’s note or a signed statement from a health care provider indicating that the use of paid sick leave is to care for themselves or a family member for an authorized purpose.

Verification must be provided to the district within ten calendar days of the first day employees used paid sick leave to care for themselves or a family member.

Employees are not required to provide details concerning the specific nature of the health condition to use paid sick leave—unless otherwise required by law. Any information employees provide will be kept confidential.

Verification for Taking Leave because of Schools or Places of Child Care Closing

When taking leave for reasons under RCW 49.46.210(1)(b)(iii), the employee must provide the notice of closure from the public official.

Verification must be provided to the district within ten calendar days of the first day an employee used paid sick leave for this purpose.

Verification for Taking Leave to Participate in a Qualifying Immigration Proceeding

When taking leave for reasons under RCW 49.46.210(1)(b)(iv), the employee must provide at least one of the types of documentation described in WAC 296-128-660(6)(a)-(b).

Verification must be provided to the district within ten calendar days of the first day an employee used paid sick leave for this purpose.

Verification for Taking Leave under the Domestic Violence Leave Act

When taking leave under the Domestic Violence Leave Act, the employee must provide any one or more of the forms of verification described in WAC 296-135-070 depending on the specific reason for the leave.

Verification must be provided within a reasonable period during or after the leave.

Unreasonable Burden

FREEMAN SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 358

If an employee believes that obtaining verification for use of paid sick leave would result in an unreasonable burden or expense on the employee, the employee must explain to their supervisor that the absence is for an authorized purpose and explain why verification would result in an unreasonable burden or expense on the employee.

Within ten calendar days of receiving the employee's explanation, the employee's supervisor will make a reasonable effort to identify alternatives for the employee to meet the verification requirement in a way that does not result in an unreasonable burden or expense. This might include accepting the employee's written explanation as a form of verification or mitigating the employee's out-of-pocket expenses associated with obtaining medical verification.

The district may choose not to pay an employee paid sick leave taken in excess of three consecutive days until verification is provided.

If agreement cannot be reached after the employee's supervisor considers the employee's explanation and attempts to identify alternatives to meet the verification requirement, the employee may consult with the Washington State Department of Labor and Industries.

CONSTRUCTION DESIGN

Facilities will be designed to accommodate the educational and instructional needs of the district. The professional experience and judgment of staff will be used in developing such educational specifications. The law requires that special attention be given to the accessibility of the education program by students of both sexes and those with disabilities. The superintendent or designee will see that all construction projects comply with the requirements for accessibility to individuals with disabilities and comparability between the sexes.

After determining that a need for new or improved facilities exists, the board, with the guidance of its staff, may engage in the following processes:

- A. Engage construction management services;
- B. Select an architect;
- C. Review a site evaluation including an assessment of existing facilities, if any, on the site;
- D. Develop educational specifications recognizing instructional needs and available financial resources;
- E. Review and approve schematic design prepared by architect, assuring that the new or remodeled facility or part of a facility is readily accessible to and usable by individuals with disabilities;
- F. Review a value engineering study and constructability review, and approve construction design including construction estimates;
- G. Call for bids; and
- H. Review and approve final construction contract.

CONSTRUCTION DESIGN

Educational Specifications

Educational specifications are written after consultation with appropriate staff, consultants, and community members. The content of a set of educational specifications may include all or part of the following items:

- A. A statement of the educational philosophy as it pertains to the specific construction project.
- B. Community and School Characteristics:
 1. The plan of organization and expected enrollments of the school:
 - a. Grade levels; and
 - b. Maximum expected enrollments with trends and projections, if necessary.
 2. The construction plan for the facility whether it is to be a new facility, an addition, or a phased program leading to a complete facility.
 3. Special services to be provided:
 - a. Guidance programs;
 - b. Social work programs;
 - c. Provisions for exceptional children; and
 - d. Other services.
 4. The special provisions needed for community use:
 - a. Cooperative park/school arrangement;
 - b. Parent-teacher associations;
 - c. Community athletic programs; and
 - d. Other provisions.
 5. The extent to which adults will use this facility.
 6. The extent to which students will be transported and the facilities that must be included to handle this service adequately.
 7. The cafeteria services to be provided and the maximum number of individuals likely to be served.
 8. The policy regarding multiple use of spaces; and
 9. Other pertinent data relating to the project.
- C. Site Characteristics - site considerations necessary for this project, including:

1. Site size and location defined; and
2. Recommended building orientation; service drives; parking requirements for staff, students, and public; sidewalk and other approaches; outside lighting.

D. Requirements of the Physical Plant:

1. Instructional functions and spaces required. A statement of instructional purposes is to precede the description of each area:
 - a. Number of spaces required by function; and
 - b. The relationships of these spaces.
2. The non-instructional spaces required. Each space is to be described by function and space requirements.
3. Relationships of spaces required:
 - a. Inter-relationship between instructional areas;
 - b. Relationship between instructional and non-instructional spaces; and
 - c. Relationship of spaces to site.
4. Environmental factors should be described in terms of educational relationships or concerns; and

Additional information or comments as necessary to further interpret and clarify the educational program.

MAINTENANCE OF FACILITIES RECORDS

The maintenance of adequate records is vitally important to the future facilities' operation and maintenance program within the district and to the resolution of any disputes that may arise regarding a construction project.

The superintendent or designee will keep relevant reports, documents and plans as they relate to an existing or proposed project. The records shall include copies of relevant correspondence relating to the project. The superintendent or designee will require from the architect, engineer, contractor, or other parties at least the following, as they become available:

- A. Inspection, progress, and compliance reports;
- B. Results from tests of material quality and composition;
- C. Drawings, plans, specifications, estimates, as-built documents, and maintenance manuals for buildings and sites;
- D. Conveyance records, title searches, bond issuance records and permits, licenses and legal documents issued or executed pursuant to the project;
- E. Guarantees and warranties; and
- F. Other documents relevant to the project, such as board resolutions and change orders.

EMERGENCY AND DISCRETIONARY LEAVES

Emergency Leave

Emergency leave may be granted for no more than one day per year and may be taken in the case of emergencies ~~as defined in the following:~~

An emergency arises out of unforeseen and unexpected circumstances which create an air of crisis or extreme need. The circumstances must present a grave and clear danger that imminently threatens physical or mental health or would result in irremediable harm or ~~in~~ immediate disaster to life or property unless some action is taken. Employees may not use emergency leave for situations when sick leave or personal leave are more appropriate.

A written application for emergency leave must be returned to the district office on the day of return to school.

~~The board recognizes that the demands of the workplace and of families need to be balanced to promote family stability and economic security for school district employees. Conditions for the authorized use of accumulated sick leave for family leaves are to be fairly construed in a manner consistent with this policy, and other relevant district policies.~~

~~Unless otherwise stated, any leave used under terms of this policy shall be deducted from the staff member's accumulated sick leave. In the event the staff member's sick leave has been exhausted, the leave may be granted without pay. Except as otherwise provided, this policy is subject to all of the provisions of Policy 5320. Unless a situation is governed by an applicable collective bargaining agreement, the following shall apply:~~

~~Family Illness. District staff members may use accrued sick leave to care for a child of the employee under the age of eighteen (18) with a health condition that requires treatment or supervision. The district may require a signed statement from a licensed medical practitioner to verify the need for treatment or supervision for any absence which exceeds five (5) consecutive days.~~

~~The district shall also allow each full-time staff member 12 days of sick leave per year in the event of a serious illness within the employee's immediate family, which shall include the employee's parents or spouse.~~

Death in the Family/Bereavement Leave

The district shall allow each full-time staff member a maximum of 5 days leave upon the death of an employee's spouse, mother, father, son, daughter, sister, brother, mother-in-law, or father-in-law. Leave also shall be allowed upon the death of a son-in-law, daughter-in-law, brother-in-law, sister-in-law, grandmother, grandfather, granddaughter or grandson. The deaths of more than one family member resulting from a common

occurrence shall be treated as a single death with respect to the length of leave granted.

~~Birth or Adoption of a Child. The district shall grant leave upon the same terms to male employees as is available to female employees upon the birth or adoption of the employee's child. Leave shall be granted upon the same terms to employees who become adoptive parents or stepparents, at the time of birth or initial placement for adoption of a child under the age of six, as is available to employees who become biological parents. Such leave is available only when the child lives in the employee's household at the time of birth or initial placement.~~

~~Employee requests for leave of absence due to birth or initial placement for adoption of a child shall be submitted in writing to the superintendent not less than 30 days prior to the beginning date of the leave. The notice shall include the approximate beginning and ending dates for the leave requested.~~

~~An extended unpaid leave of absence for a period up to the beginning of the next school term or school year may be approved at the discretion of the superintendent based upon consideration of educational program needs and the desires of the staff member, together with any recommendation of professionals such as medical practitioners or counselors regarding the leave request.~~

~~Nothing in this section shall preclude the use of accumulated sick leave to care for a child under age eighteen (18) with a health condition that requires treatment or supervision, as provided in the Family Illness section of this policy.~~

Leave of Absence

~~At the discretion of the superintendent or designee, the district may grant leaves of absence for specific periods of time for up to one school year. A leave of absence will be without pay or benefits. During the leave the staff member may pay the district's share of any insurance benefits program to maintain those benefits. In considering whether to grant a leave of absence, the needs of students and the district program warrant primary consideration. A leave of absence will be granted only when it will not have an undesirable impact upon the educational program or business operations.~~

~~A staff member will be entitled to return to a position in the district at the end of the leave of absence subject to the availability of a position for which the staff member is qualified. The staff member granted a leave of absence will inform the board by April 1 as to his/her intentions to assume a position in the district for the ensuing school year. If said notification is not received, the individual's employment rights with the district may be terminated.~~

~~A staff member on a leave of absence will not earn any salary schedule experience credit, any sick leave credit, or benefits during the leave of absence.~~

Leave to Attend Meetings/Conferences

At the discretion of the superintendent or designee, the district may grant staff members leave to attend meetings or conferences that are likely to be of value to the staff member's performance. Meetings and conferences wherein bargaining unit activities are conducted are excluded. Such leaves will be granted without pay.

FAMILY, ~~AND~~ MEDICAL, ~~AND~~ MATERNITY LEAVE

I. State Paid Family and Medical Leave

Paid family and medical leave are benefits administered by the Washington State Employment Security Department (the “ESD”). Employees interested in applying for these benefits must follow the process described in Chapter 192-610 WAC.

Employees who have questions regarding the application process may contact the Employment Security Department ESD or visit its website at paidleave.wa.gov. The district will post notices made available by the Employment Security Department ESD that provide pertinent information regarding paid family and medical leave benefits and will comply with applicable provisions of the Paid Family and Medical Leave Act (PFMLA).

~~A brief description of the paid family and medical leave benefits program is provided below. The description is not meant to capture every aspect of the program; rather, it is meant to give a general overview.~~

Eligibility

~~Employees who have worked 820 hours during the first four of the last five completed calendar quarters or the last four completed calendar quarters are eligible for paid family and medical leave.~~

Reasons for Leave

~~Family leave means leave taken by an employee from work for the following reasons:~~

- ~~A. To participate in providing care, including physical or psychological care, for a family member made necessary by a serious health condition of the family member;~~
- ~~B. To bond with the employee’s child during the first 12 months after the child’s birth, or the first 12 months after the placement of a child under the age of eighteen within the employee; or~~
- ~~C. Because of any qualifying exigency as permitted under the federal family and medical leave act for family members as defined by RCW 50A.05.010(10).~~

~~Medical leave means any leave taken by an employee from work made necessary by the employee’s own serious health condition as defined by RCW 50A.05.010(20).~~

Amount of Leave

~~Employees may take up to 12 weeks of paid family leave during a period of 52 consecutive calendar weeks.~~

~~Employees may take up to 12 weeks of paid medical leave during a period of 52 consecutive calendar weeks. Paid medical leave may be extended by two weeks if the employee experiences a serious health condition with a pregnancy that results in incapacity.~~

~~Employees may take a combined 16 weeks of paid family and paid medical leave during a period of 52 consecutive calendar weeks. The combined total may be extended to 18 weeks if the employee experiences a serious health condition with a pregnancy that results in incapacity.~~

~~Employee Notice to District~~

~~An employee must provide the district at least 30 days' written notice before paid family or medical leave is to begin if the need for the leave is foreseeable based on an expected birth, placement of a child, or planned medical treatment for a serious health condition.~~

~~An employee must provide the district written notice as soon as practicable when 30 days' notice is not possible because of a lack of knowledge of approximately when leave will be required to begin, because of a change in circumstances, or because of a medical emergency.~~

~~An employee must provide the district written notice as soon as is practicable for foreseeable leave due to a qualifying military exigency, regardless of how far in advance such leave is foreseeable.~~

~~The notice must be in writing and contain at least the anticipated timing and duration of the leave.~~

~~District Notice to Employee~~

~~Whenever the district becomes aware that an employee is absent from work for more than seven consecutive days to take family or medical leave, the district must will provide the employee with a written statement provided by the Employment Security Department of the employee's rights.~~

~~The notice will be sent by the fifth business day after the employee's seventh consecutive missed day of work due to family or medical leave or by the fifth business day after the employer becomes aware that the employee's absence is due to family or medical leave, whichever is later.~~

~~Employment Restoration~~

~~Upon return from paid family or medical leave, an employee is entitled to be restored to the position of employment held by the employee when the leave commenced or to be restored to an equivalent position with equivalent employment benefits, pay, and other terms and conditions of employment.~~

~~As a condition of restoration for employees who have taken medical leave, the district may require those employees to receive certification from their health care provider that they are able to resume work.~~

~~The district may deny restoration to any salaried employee who is among the highest paid ten percent of its employees if the following apply:~~

- ~~A. Denial is necessary to prevent substantial and grievous economic injury to the operations of the employer;~~
- ~~B. The district notifies the employee of its intent to deny restoration on such basis at the time the district determines the injury would occur; and~~
- ~~C. The leave has commenced and the employee elects not to return to employment after receiving the notice.~~

~~The district may also deny restoration if the employee would not otherwise have been employed at the time of reinstatement.~~

~~If the district chooses to deny restoration, it will provide written notice of such denial in person or by certified mail. The notice will include a statement that the district intends to deny employment restoration when the leave has ended, the reasons behind the decision to deny restoration, an explanation that health benefits will still be paid for the duration of the leave, and the date on which eligibility for employer-provided health benefits ends.~~

~~The rights described above only apply in the following circumstances: the district has 50 or more employees; the employee has been employed by the district for twelve months or more; and the employee has worked for the district for at least 1,250 hours during the 12 months immediately preceding the date on which leave will commence.~~

II. Federal Family and Medical Leave

The district will grant employees leave in accordance with the Family and Medical Leave Act (FMLA).

FMLA provides eligible employees who qualify the right to take up to twelve weeks of unpaid, job-protected leave in a twelve-month period for certain family and medical reasons. It also gives eligible employees who qualify the right to take up to twenty-six weeks of unpaid, job-protected leave in a twelve-month period to care for a covered servicemember with a serious injury or illness.

The twelve-month period for FMLA leave is measured from the date they first use FMLA.

The following are optional provisions that a district may choose to include.

Use of Paid Leave

When available to an employee, paid leave will run concurrently with the use of FMLA leave. Employees receiving benefits under PFMLA, a disability leave plan, or workers' compensation concurrently with FMLA leave will not be required to use paid leave while receiving those benefits.]

Limitation on Leave to Bond with a Newborn or Newly Placed Child

If both parents of a newborn or newly placed child are employed by the district, they will be limited to a combined total of twelve weeks of leave for the birth of the child, placement of the child for adoption or foster care, or to bond with the child after birth or placement. This limitation doesn't apply if there is a need to care for the child because of a serious health condition.]

tFitness-for-duty Certification

To be restored to work after taking FMLA leave, an employee who was out because of their own serious health condition must submit a fitness-for-duty certification stating that the employee is fit to resume work.]

General Provisions

~~Every employee of the district who has worked for the district at least one year and for at least 1,250 hours in the preceding year is entitled to twelve (12) workweeks of family leave during any twelve (12) month period to:~~

- ~~A. Care for a newborn child, an adopted child of the employee who is under the age of eighteen at the time of placement for adoption, or a newly placed foster child; or~~
- ~~B. Care for a spouse, parent or child of the employee who has a serious health condition, or the employee may obtain leave for his or her own serious health condition if it renders the employee unable to perform his or her job; or~~
- ~~C. Respond to a qualifying exigency occurring because the employee's spouse, son or daughter, or parent is on active duty or has been notified of pending active duty in support of a contingency operation.~~

~~An employee who is the spouse, son or daughter, parent or next of kin of a service member who is recovering from a serious illness or injury sustained while on active duty is entitled to twenty six (26) weeks of unpaid leave in a 12-month period to care for the service member.~~

~~Family leave authorized under this policy must be taken full-time and consecutively unless an alternative schedule is approved by the superintendent or designee or where intermittent or reduced leave is medically necessary. Instructional staff may not take reduced or intermittent leave when it would constitute 20% of the number of working days in the period during which the leave would extend without the approval of the superintendent or designee. An instructional employee may be transferred to an alternative equivalent position that would accommodate reduced or intermittent leave, if such a position is available.~~

~~A period of family leave is in addition to any sick leave taken due to the employee's temporary disability attributable to pregnancy or childbirth. The superintendent or designee may require written verification from the employee's health care provider when the employee is taking medical leave based on his or her own serious health condition.~~

~~The district may obtain the opinion of a second health care provider, at district expense, concerning any information pertinent to the employee's leave request. If the opinions of the health care providers differ on any matter determinative of the employee's eligibility for family leave, the two health care providers will select a third provider, whose opinion, obtained at the employer's expense, will be conclusive.~~

~~Birth or Adoption~~

~~Leave taken for newborn or adopted childcare will be completed within one year after the date of birth or placement for adoption.~~

~~The district will grant leave upon the same terms to male employees as is available to female employees upon the birth or adoption of the employee's child. Leave will be granted upon the same terms to employees who become adoptive parents or stepparents, at the time of birth or initial placement for adoption of a child under the age of six, as is available to employees who become biological parents. Such leave is available only when the child lives in the employee's household at the time of birth or initial placement.~~

~~Employee requests for leave of absence due to birth or initial placement for adoption of a child will be submitted in writing to the superintendent or designee not less than 30 days prior to the beginning date of the leave. The notice will include the approximate beginning and ending dates for the leave requested.~~

~~If both parents of a newborn or newly adopted child are employed by the school district, they shall be entitled to a total of twelve workweeks of family leave during any twelve-month period, and leave shall be granted to only one parent at a time. There is no pooling effect for spouses if the family leave is related to a serious health condition.~~

~~Employment Restoration~~

~~Any employee returning from an authorized family leave will be entitled to the same position held by the employee when the leave commenced, or to a position with equivalent benefits and pay.~~

~~An employee may be denied restoration under the following circumstances: a) the specific job is eliminated by a bona fide restructuring, or a reduction in force resulting from lack of funds or lack of work, b) an employee on family leave takes a position with another employer outside the home, or c) the employee fails to provide the required notice of intent to take family leave or fails to return on the established ending date of leave, d) or as otherwise allowed by law. If an employee fails to return from family leave, the district may recover the costs of the employee's health benefits paid during the leave.~~

~~Instructional staff may be required to delay their return from family leave to the beginning of the next semester under the following circumstances:~~

- ~~A. The employee began leave five or more weeks before the end of the semester, the leave is for more than three weeks, and the employee would otherwise return to work within three weeks of the end of the semester.~~
- ~~B. The employee began family leave (except for a personal health condition) less than five weeks before the end of the semester, the leave is for more than two weeks, and the employee would otherwise return to work within two weeks of the end of the semester.~~
- ~~C. The employee began family leave (except for a personal health condition) three or fewer weeks before the end of the semester and the period of leave is more than five working days.~~

III. Maternity-Pregnancy-Related Disability Leave

An employee with a pregnancy-related disability may take leave during the period of disability. The district may require documentation to verify the need for and length of leave related to the pregnancy-related disability.

An employee who is entitled to take leave because of a pregnancy-related disability may use accumulated sick leave during their period of disability. If an employee exhausts their sick leave before they can return to work, the employee may be granted unpaid leave for the remainder of their period of disability. During any period of unpaid leave, the employee will be required to pay their portion of the premium related to their health benefits.

Upon return from pregnancy-related disability leave, an employee will be allowed to return to the same job or similar job of at least the same pay, unless there is a business necessity (like a reduction in force) that justifies otherwise.

~~A staff member may use accumulated, paid sick leave for the period of actual disability attributable to pregnancy or childbirth. This period will extend from the date of birth for a period of not more than 60 days, unless an actual period of disability which begins prior to the date of birth or continues beyond 60 days is otherwise verified in writing by the employee's physician.~~

~~If the employee's accumulated sick leave is exhausted during the period of maternity, the district will grant a leave of absence without pay or fringe benefits, upon the staff member's request, for the remainder of the period of actual disability due to pregnancy or childbirth.~~

~~During any unpaid portion of such leave of absence, the staff member may pay the premiums for any district insurance plans to keep coverage in effect for the employee and her family.~~

Notice

~~A pregnant staff member is requested to notify her immediate supervisor and the superintendent or designee by the beginning of the fifth month of pregnancy.~~

~~At the time of such notice the staff member will submit a written request to her immediate supervisor and the superintendent or designee for one or more of the following:~~

- ~~A. Maternity leave for the period of her actual disability due to pregnancy or childbirth;~~
- ~~B. Family leave for a period of up to 12 weeks, in addition to any period of maternity disability leave, the district will extend the employee's health benefit during this period of unpaid leave;~~
- ~~C. Leave of absence for a period of up to the beginning of the next school term or school year. Such extended leave of absence may be approved at the discretion of the superintendent or designee based upon consideration of educational program needs and the desires of the staff member, together with the recommendation of her personal physician or licensed practitioner; or~~
- ~~D. Termination of employment by resignation.~~

~~The notice to the district will include the approximate beginning and ending dates for the leave.~~

Employment Conditions

~~A pregnant staff member may continue working as long as she is capable of performing her normal duties, with the written approval of her physician or licensed practitioner. The staff member may return to work when physically able to perform her duties. If the employee intends to return to work within 60 days of childbirth, her personal physician or licensed practitioner must certify that the staff member is in good health and ready to resume her duties.~~

~~No later than 30 days after the date of birth, the staff member is requested to notify the superintendent or designee of the specific date when she will return to work. Unless the superintendent or designee approves an earlier date of return, the employee will give at least 14 days advance notice of the actual date of return.~~

~~The staff member will return to her duties following an extended leave of absence on the date approved by the superintendent or designee. If the employee is still experiencing a disability due to pregnancy, miscarriage, abortion, childbirth or recovery which prevents the employee from performing her duties on the scheduled date of return, an additional period of unpaid leave of absence may be approved at the discretion of the superintendent or designee based upon consideration of educational program needs and the recommendation of the employee's personal physician or licensed practitioner.~~

Assignment Upon Return

~~An employee who has taken a leave of absence only for the actual period of disability relating to pregnancy or childbirth or up to twelve weeks of family leave will return to the same assignment, or a similar position for which she is qualified with at least the same pay and benefits, as she held prior to the maternity leave or family leave.~~

~~Upon return from an extended maternity leave, a staff member will be entitled to a position in the district subject to the availability of a position for which she is qualified. An effort will be made to place the staff member in her original position or in a comparable position.~~
