1. PURPOSE
This amendment is theamendment to the Original Contract. The purpose of this
amendment is to <u>add additional services (spring break field trips)</u> .

2. AMENDED PROVISIONS

This Original Agreement is amended and supplemented as follows:

5 Intersessional Program Field Trips:

- WR will host five off-site field trips programming for four Camino Nuevo Charter Schools during the intersessional program week, from April 14 to April 18, 2025.
- 5 Fields Trips will be offered for up to 150 students per school.
- The final schedule will be provided upon confirmation.
- Scheduling is subject to venue availability and transportation arrangements for each school.
- Each site will be supervised by one dedicated full-time site coordinator and an assistant site coordinator at all times. A year-round program manager and quality assurance specialist will oversee all WR programs at Camino Nuevo Charter Academy along with other neighboring schools.
- Programs will average 10:1 student staff ratio on all field trips.
- Meals will be provided for all participants on each field trip.
- Bus costs are included in the total but are subject to change due to availability.
- WR will track all relevant data and ensure compliance for the ELO-P programs in partnership with CNCA and School Site Leaders.
- CNCA shall receive separate invoices, by program location, for total NTE contract amount in equal monthly
 installments, with invoices due within 30 days from issuance.
- All other details are the same as after school.

In 1922, when Woodcraft Rangers first opened its doors to Los Angeles youth it welcomed all interested participants. They were embraced with the belief that every child is innately good, deserves the opportunity to realize their full potential, and that youth should be active participants in defining their own paths.

Through the Woodcraft Way, a young person develops a holistic sense of self through the cultivation of body, body, spirit, and service. Believing that maturity, not scholarship, is the first aim of education, the Woodcraft Way builds character and equips youth with new skills and knowledge, strength and resiliency, a deeper understanding of their place in the world, and a greater commitment to their community.

Our Programs | Body, Mind, Spirit and Service

Experience matters. For 100 years, Woodcraft Rangers has been at the forefront of expanded learning opportunities exclusively in the Greater Los Angeles area. Believing that communities themselves are best equipped to determine their own needs, in the 1950s Woodcraft Rangers identified the need for parent participation and created neighborhood advisory boards to complement its city-wide neighborhood programs. In the 1960s, we developed pre-delinquent youth development and work training programs in response to President Johnson's "War on Poverty". In the 1980s, our reach expanded with the creation of our Youth Employment Education program. Since 1991, Woodcraft Rangers has successfully managed ASES, supplemental, 21 CCLC and ASSETs grants, and now ELO-P grants.

Woodcraft is a leader by all standards. Our long-standing service has enabled us to impact the lives of 5 generations of young Angelenos, ranging in age from 4 to 18 years. Our longevity is evidence that we have always been responsive to the changing needs of our communities, and we continue to build and adapt to the evolving issues facing our youth.

Finally, we have always believed that youth development mentors should reflect the communities we serve and have always actively recruited staff, now totaling over 800, from within those communities. This creates a more meaningful sense of belonging for students as well as a more authentic relationship with parents and community leaders.

Expanded Learning Programs

Each site is uniquely curated through a needs assessment that includes consultation with school leadership and student interest surveys. Woodcraft Rangers Club Leaders and Site Coordinators curate activities to meet the specific needs of the students at each site and dovetail with the unique dynamics of each neighborhood and community.

Elementary and Middle School clubs are implemented in 6-week cycles and meet 5 days a week. For a program of 80 students, students will be able to choose two different clubs, from a total of eight each cycle (a MWF, and a TTh club) to engage them in diverse experiences and broaden their horizons. Students work on specific skills or techniques each time the club meets and may work toward skill mastery by continuing clubs in multiple cycles. Clubs hold events at the end of each cycle to celebrate their accomplishments and share them publicly.

Elementary school youth are given multiple opportunities to choose from a wide range of program offerings. Each 6-weeks youth are surveyed on club preferences and their input informs subsequent 6-week session offerings. Youth are empowered to create their club rules and agreements and hold each other accountable with guidance from staff members.



Our Expanded Learning Programs include Dual Language Enrichment, Arts & Media, Sports, STEM, Youth Leadership, and Health & Wellness.

Arts & Media

We recognize the importance of art in all forms as an expression of culture, identity and individuality. Performing arts offerings include modern dance, classical dance and baile folklórico, mariachi, drum line, guitar, keyboard, drama, color guard, cheer and drill. We extend to the arts to vocational options which include cosmetology, graphic design, and arts management. Again, Woodcraft Club Leaders craft programs specific to the students at each site to ensure that opportunities remain relevant and students stay engaged.

STEM

From robotics to gardening - regardless of subject – all opportunities integrate lessons in science, technology, engineering and mathematics. In this way, students intuitively learn that STEM concepts influence everything they do and experience in the world. This unique approach distinguishes Woodcraft from other afterschool programs. We actively integrate arts and STEM in a wide array of activities and intentionally create programs that are environmentally responsible, including the strategic use and re-use of materials. In alignment with our naturalist roots, many Woodcraft Rangers science activities teach students about the environmentally and responsible application of science and technology. For example, in lessons that focus on alternative energy, students build solar cars, hydro cars, and hover crafts, integrating earth sciences, physics and engineering. Other popular STEM programs include VR, 3D printing, coding cyber security and robotics.

Sports and Play

We believe that when properly implemented, structured sports and guided play programs have positive impact on a child's physical, social and emotional wellness, and when every child is included and encouraged, the tide of equity and inclusiveness rises for all. We also believe children should be given the opportunity to explore many options, so our sports programs include a wide range of popular and non-traditional offerings, including basketball, bicycling, lacrosse, martial arts, rugby, soccer, swimming, tennis, volleyball, and yoga, and are targeted to all abilities and genders.

Youth Leadership

Woodcraft's Youth Leadership Program focuses on guiding and empowering young leaders with a belief that youth should shape the world they will inherit. Youth Leadership at Woodcraft Rangers is a program in itself and is also reflected in our youth-choice, youth-driven, youth-led philosophy.

Dual Language Enrichment

Our Dual Language Enrichment programs make English, Spanish, Armenian, and Mandarin Chinese an everyday part of learning and play. Our full immersion Armenian Language Club is just one example - where academic support and all activities are conducted in Armenian and English. This program has empowered first generation American Armenian speakers with the ability to learn English and has exposed older youth to their native tongue. Similar clubs exist for Spanish and Mandarin Chinese languages, and are led by experienced, bilingual staff.

Summer Learning and Intercessional Program (Supplemental and ELO-P)

Summer Learning programs are enriching to students and mitigate summer learning loss. Woodcraft's commitment to accessibility also means parents gain the ability to continue employment without disruption, leading to economic stability. Within a 7-week period in the summer months, for up to 12 hours a day, participants receive academic reinforcement in addition to participation in sports, STEM, field trips, and arts experiences that are culturally relevant.



Residential Summer Camp

Our residential summer camp is comprised of week-long stays at Camp Woodcraft near Idyllwild. We believe that children learn through play and should have the opportunity to take developmentally appropriate risks that build resiliency and independence. This sense of autonomy is nurtured through mentoring by trained instructors and counselors who are equipped to support the social, emotional, and physical development of every child. 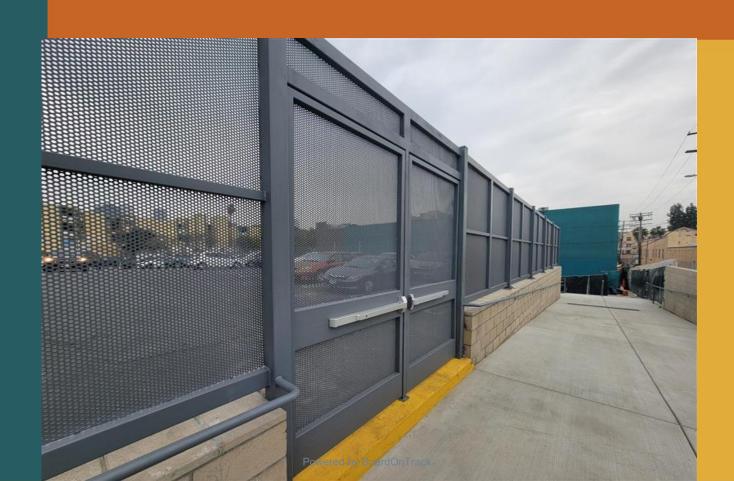

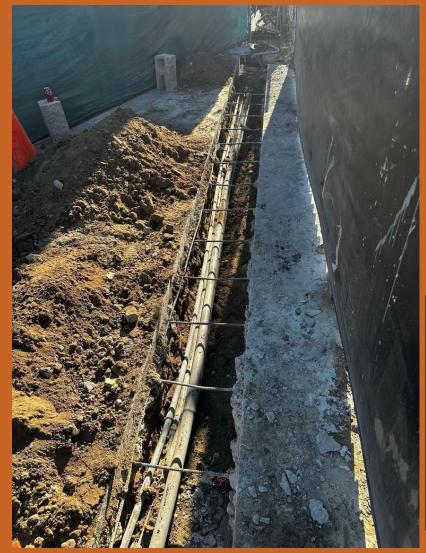

Budget Challenges

- Akerman Legal Fees of \$130,868.74 exceeded the budget of \$60,000.00 due to City Case
 Management Submittals, City Planning, City Council Clearance, parking lot reduction, project
 across five property parcels, and walkway covenants that required additional legal support in
 the amount of \$63,056.68 to resolve. Other legal fees were required for demo permits,
 building permits, ESSER Grant, project review and City submittals.
- Permit fees exceeded budget as LADBS segmented the Project, rather than permit as one large project plus City Planning Fees cost \$42,805.85. Budget was \$23,000.00 for permits and City Planning.
- LADBS required plan review, soil testing, grading and engineering totaling \$48,992.00 due to the METRO being under the Playground. LADBS corrections included increased block thickness, increased concrete strength and rebar totaling an additional \$42,984.00 in construction costs.
- An additional \$18,500.00 was spent for Parking Lot Restoration, three drains in the walkway at \$9,500.00 and a PIV Fire enclosure at \$3,600.00.
- An estimated \$50,500.00 is required for 669 Lot Line Adjustment, legal, City Planning fees. This property will be tied into the Parking Lot.

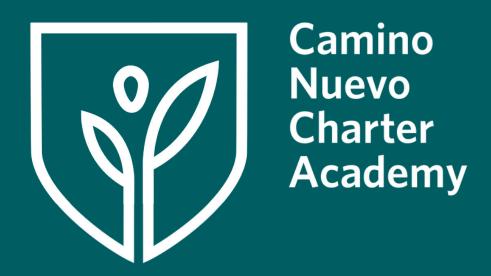

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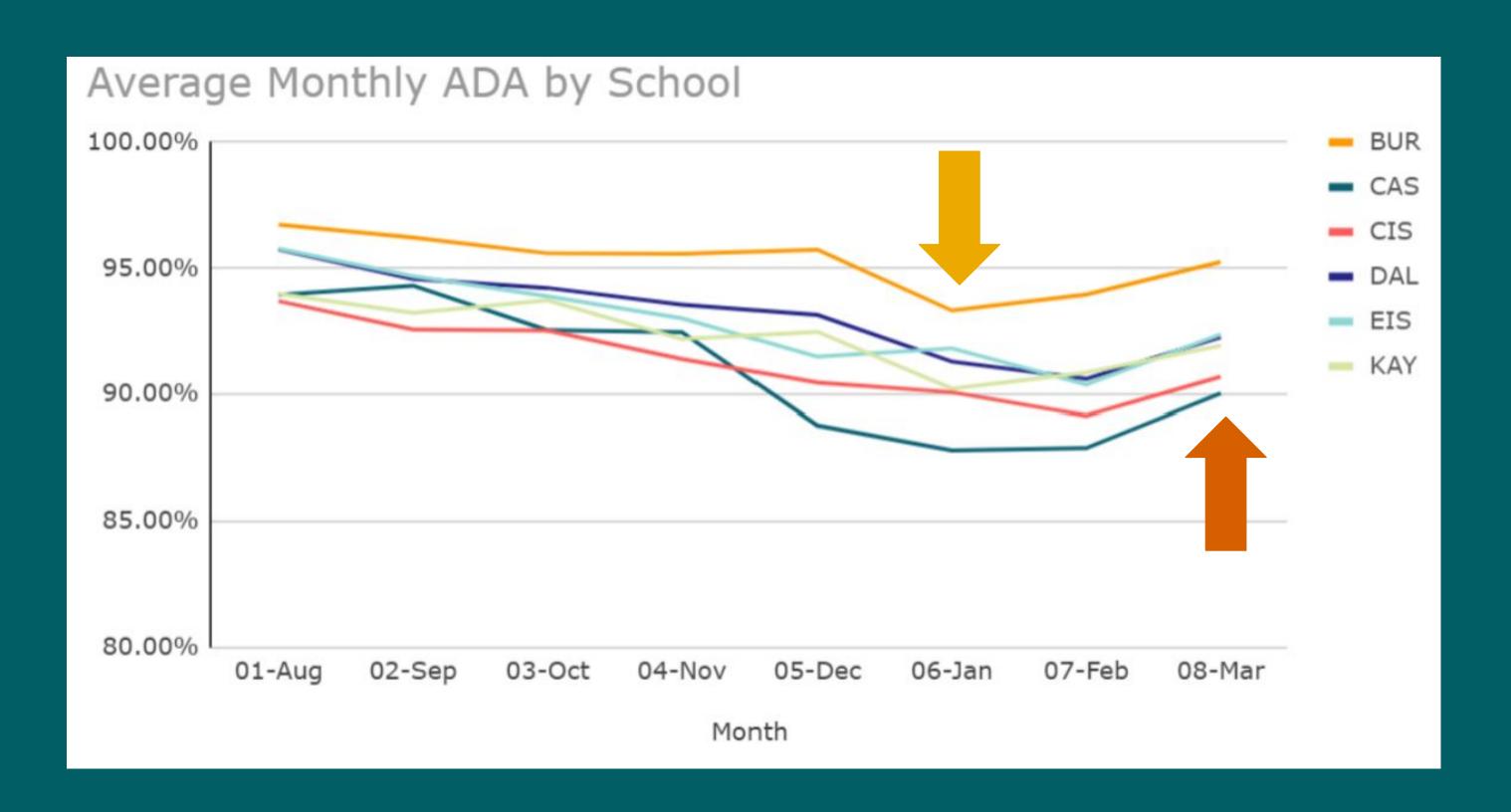

Overall – CNCA is serving 11 students more than last year, but 33 less than the budget target.

BUR – Steady enrollment and interest. The demographics, like birthrate, housing and job market are slightly impacting BUR.

KAY – Current enrollment is -7 students below original target, but KAY is 29 students higher than last year. KAY is on average serving more students than they have in past years.

CAS – Enrollment is higher than budget and last year, and interest is higher overall. CAS enrollment is stronger than it has been in past years.

EIS – Steady enrollment overall with some attrition. Interest is waning given that we haven't been extending many offers on the waitlist.

DAL – Enrollment and interest is consistent. There is a lot of mobility within high school, but DAL is serving more students this year.

CIS – Enrollment is 49 less than budget and 39 less than last year. It has been a mix of students exiting and demographic trends impacting the neighborhood.

- BUR has 1 fewer returning student compared to last year while KAY, CAS, and DAL all have more returning students.
 Retaining and increasing returning students is critical to sustainable enrollment in this declining market. The growth in KAY (+17), CAS (+35), and DAL (+11) is a positive trend for these schools.
- **EIS** has 15 less returning students than last year. While attrition from CAS's 5th grade class is relatively low, lower returning student numbers mean we need to recruit more in the spring to close the gap for the 25/26 school year.
- **CIS** has 24 fewer returning students compared to last year, but also has 39 less students enrolled. We will have to recruit more students for this year and 25/26 school year to close the gap.

BUR, KAY, CAS, and DAL are projected to exceed their enrollment targets.

- BUR and KAY: Both schools are projected to be over-enrolled (-12 and -22 open seats, respectively). Despite lower applications, strong retention and steady demand are keeping enrollment stable.
- **CAS:** Currently projected to exceed its target by 12 students, showing strong interest, likely due to its dual-language program and wraparound services.
- DAL: Seeing the highest surplus in projected enrollment (-54 open seats).
 This reflects strong word-of-mouth and growing appreciation for the academic program and school culture.

EIS and CIS have open seats remaining.

- EIS: Still has 3 open seats in 6th grade, suggesting that some recruitment efforts may be needed to meet the target. Lower application numbers may be due to families not perceiving EIS as an available option due to frustrations with last year's waitlist.
- **CIS:** Still has 10 open seats remaining, with applications trending lower. Recruitment will be necessary to close the gap, especially in early grades.

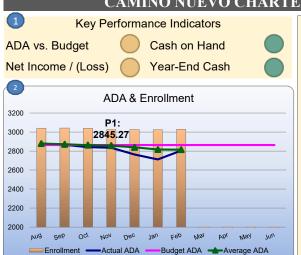

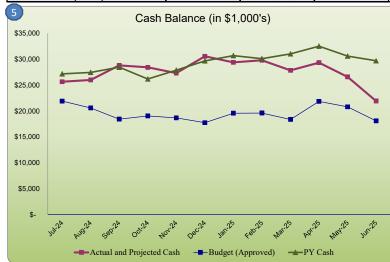

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CAMINO NUEVO CHARTER ACADEMY Financial Analysis February 2025

Net Income

Camino Nuevo Charter Academy is projected to achieve a net income of \$1.26M in FY24-25 compared to \$614K in the board approved budget. Reasons for this positive \$646K variance are explained below in the Income Statement section of this analysis.

Balance Sheet

As of February 28, 2025, the school's cash balance was \$28.70M. By June 30, 2025, the school's cash balance is projected to be \$15.08M, which represents a 23% reserve. In addition to this, CNCA is projected to have \$6.8M of restricted cash.

As of February 28, 2025, the Accounts Receivable balance was \$1.20M, down from \$1.21M in the previous month, due to the receipt of revenue earned in FY23-24.

As of February 28, 2025, the Accounts Payable balance, including payroll liabilities, totaled \$2.27M, compared to \$2.43M in the prior month.

As of February 28, 2025, CNCA had a debt balance of \$9.23M. An additional \$207K will be paid this fiscal year. This debt is related to Prop 55/Kayne Siart construction loan.

Income Statement

Revenue

Total revenue for FY24-25 is projected to be \$67.52M, which is \$2.28M or 3.5% over budgeted revenue of \$65.24M.

All Other Federal Revenue (8299) \$1.54M increase due to the following:

- Additional ESSER funds spent in the current year. ESSER funds released in FY23-24 were spent by the grant deadline of September 30, 2024.
- 21st Century afterschool grant passing through CNCA. With the vendor change in afterschool service provider during FY24-25, CNCA will now reflect the revenue as well as the cost of the 21st Century afterschool program. This is offset by increased costs in consultants (5849).

State Revenue - Other (8599) \$550K increase mainly due to California Community Schools Partnership Program (CCSPP) grant awarded to Camino Nuevo. This grant is offset by additional supplemental expenses across the schools, but mainly at the Burlington site who has pass-through expenses to partners. Furthermore, this is netting a reduction in one-time funds that will now be spent in out-years.

Interest & Dividend Income (8660) \$180K increase in interest revenue upon the receipt of LACOE's first quarter interest disbursement.



Grants (8692) \$323K increase largely due to the following:

- \$250K PNEDG Grant awarded to the Cisneros site.
- CalShape grants received by Cisneros and CNCA#3 for HVAC repairs
- Reduced grant projections for reimbursable grants
- Coding of the CCSPP Mental Health grant to **Object 8599.**

SELPA Grants (8698) \$85K increase based on round one special education assistance awarded to each charter.

Other Prior Year Adjustment (8999) \$123K increase in Prior Year Revenues largely due to final FY23-24 Lottery rates and SMAA funds received.

Expenses

Total expenses for FY24-25 are projected to be \$66.26M, which is \$1.64M or 2.5% over budgeted expenditures of \$64.62M.

Teachers' Hourly (1120) \$101K over budget largely due to classified intervention positions (2131) being filled by certificated intervention teachers.

Other Classified Salaries (2900) \$258K over budget due to additional Special Education positions filled across sites. This has resulted in cost savings (5842).

Workers' Compensation Insurance (3601) \$84K under budget based on planned payments to new vendor.

Other Benefits (3902) \$86K under budget based on STRS Refunds received from prior year.

Core Curricula Materials (4111) \$176K over budget due to additional supply purchases and a new TK curriculum implemented.

Student Materials (4311) \$76K over budget due to additional supply purchases.

Non Capitalized Equipment (4411) \$343K over budget partially due to a budgeted furniture purchase with ESSER funds at the Eisner site as well as increased spending across the network and the implementation of a higher capitalization threshold.

Nutrition Program Food & Supplies (4711) \$256K under budget based on meal credits received and efforts to reduce meal overages at sites.

Other Facility Rentals (5619) \$398K over budget due to property tax payments paid. CNCA is currently in the process of seeking a refund from the county based on property tax exemptions submitted.

Field Trips & Pupil Transportation (5812) \$160K over budget largely due to planned field trips and transportation costs in the ELO Program.

Object Code 5821: Legal expense is Legal (5821) \$91K over budget due to increased SpED-related legal costs.

Contracted Substitute Teachers (5841) \$517K over budget because of teacher vacancies and absenteeism.



Special Education Services (5842) \$1.07M under budget. This reduction is largely due to increased in-house staff as well as filling of open positions, resulting in decreased overall service requirements. However, savings from consultants are offset by the need to hire SPED substitute staff to fill vacancies or cover absences for school staff.

Other Student Instructional Services (5849) \$1.26M over budget largely due to a passthrough payment made as part of the CCSPP grant and 21st Century afterschool grant.

PD Consultants & Tuition (5852) \$363K over budget largely due to additional PD added with one-time funding.

All Other Consultants & Services (5859) \$325K over budget due to classified staff support being obtained from consultants to cover vacancies or staff being absent.

ADA

Budgeted P2 ADA is 2,864.50 based on enrollment of 3,056 and a 93.7% attendance rate.

Forecast P2 ADA is 2,816.77 based on enrollment of 3,024 and a 92.9% attendance rate.

Actual ADA through Month 7 is 2,815.22 with ending enrollment of 3,029 and a 92.8% attendance rate.

In Month 7, ADA was 2,804.74 with a 92.7% attendance rate.

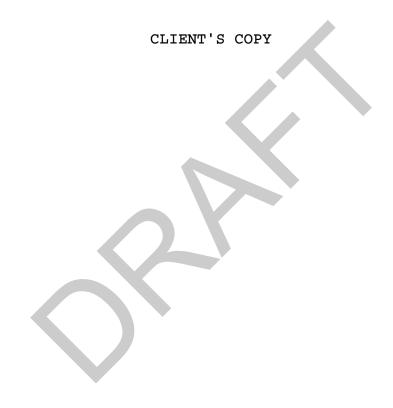

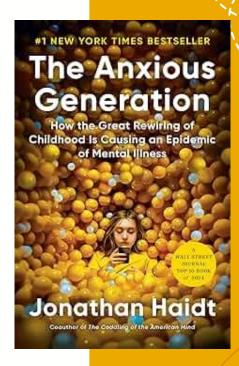

What is the Employee Retention Credit?

The Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act), enacted on March 27, 2020, provides for an employee retention tax credit (Employee Retention Credit) that is designed to encourage Eligible Employers to keep employees on their payroll despite impacts related to COVID-19. Eligible Employers can claim the Employee Retention Credit, equal to 50 percent of up to \$10,000 in qualified wages (including qualified health plan expenses), on wages paid after March 12, 2020 and before January 1, 2021. Eligible Employers are those businesses, including tax-exempt organizations, with operations that have been fully or partially suspended due to governmental orders due to COVID-19 OR that have a significant decline in gross receipts compared to 2019.
