

EXPANDED LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES PLAN
CAMINO NUEVO CHARTER ACADEMY

The Expanded Learning Opportunities Program (ELO-P) provides funding for afterschool and summer school enrichment programs **for transitional kindergarten through sixth grade.**

“Expanded learning” means before school, after school, summer, or intersession learning programs that focus on developing the academic, social, emotional, and physical needs and interests of pupils through hands-on, engaging learning experiences. It is the intent of the Legislature that expanded learning programs are pupil-centered, results driven, include community partners, and complement, but do not replicate, learning activities in the regular school day and school year.

Allowable Uses of Funds:

The California Department of Education is not approving or denying individual LEA requests for allowable expenditures. All expenditures should be consistent with statute and the LEA’s program plan, which is approved by the governing board, in a public meeting and posted on the LEA’s website.

LEAs with an unduplicated pupil percentage (UPP) equal to or higher than 80%, will be required to offer the ELO Program to all TK/K-6 classroom-based pupils and provide program access to all TK/K-6 classroom-based pupils upon parent/guardian request.

The following are the total ELO-P amounts projected for each school for 21-22 school year. For the 22-23 school year the ELO-P funds may be doubled next year.
