II. Finance

A. Financial Report and A/R update

Shawn Jahn reported that the audit would be done remotely and would take a few days longer than usual for that reason. The dates have not been set.

He reported that he would be closing out the June books by the week of 7/20. As of May, the boys' budget was \$230,000 to the good, and the girls' budget \$280,000. Accounts receivable for the boys' side totalled \$107,000, with \$61,000 of the total owed by Schenectady. The total for the girls' side is \$226,000, with \$100,000 owed by Troy and \$50,000 by Schenectady.
