E. Unused Sick Days for Service Credit Calculation Policy

The retention bonus will be paid out in equal installments of \$1000 during October 2022, March 2023, and June 2023 payroll cycles on the condition that the employee remains employed at Literacy First Charter Schools during each of these payroll cycles. If an employee leaves Literacy First before the end of the 2022-23 school year and has received one or more of these installments, Literacy First Charter Schools reserves the right to recoup the bonus payments from the employee.

FIRST AMENDMENT TO FACILITIES USE AGREEMENT BETWEEN ALPINE SCHOOL DISTRICT AND LITERACY FIRST CHARTER SCHOOLS

This First Amendment to Facilities Use Agreement ("First Amendment"), dated May 18, 2022, is made by and between Alpine School District, a school district organized and existing under the laws of the State of California ("District"), and Literacy First Charter Schools, a California nonprofit corporation operating the Liberty Charter High School. Literacy First Charter Schools and Liberty Charter High School are collectively referred to as the "Charter School." The District and the Charter School are individually referred to as a "Party" and collectively referred to as the "Parties."

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the Charter School has a current, active charter and operates under the authorization of the San Diego County Board of Education ("County Board").

WHEREAS, the District is the owner of certain real property located at 1850 Alpine Boulevard in Alpine, California 91901, which is more commonly known as the former Alpine Elementary School (the "Site").

WHEREAS, the Parties entered into that certain Facilities Use Agreement, executed on January 14, 2022 and approved by the District's Board of Trustees on February 17, 2022, authorizing the Charter School to use the Site and to share use of other District facilities ("Shared Use Facilities") to operate its high school program for students who are enrolled in ninth through twelfth grade only.

WHEREAS, Section 1.a.ii. of the Facilities Use Agreement requires the Charter School, as a condition of its occupation and use of the Site and Shared Use Facilities, to obtain formal approval from the County Board to materially revise its charter to change the location for its operation of Liberty Charter High School to the Site.

WHEREAS, in consultation with the San Diego County Superintendent of Schools, the Charter School and the District were informed and received confirmation, that the Charter School is authorized to change the location for the operation of Liberty Charter High School to the Site without the need for a material revision to its charter.

WHEREAS, the Parties now desire, through this First Amendment, to amend the Facilities Use Agreement to remove the requirement for the Charter School to materially revise its charter to change the location of its operation of Liberty Charter High School as a condition of its occupation and use of the Site and Shared Use Facilities.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the promises and mutual covenants and agreements described in this First Amendment, the Parties agree as follows:

- 1. Section 2.a.ii. (County Board Action on Material Revision) is hereby deleted and removed from the Facilities Use Agreement in its entirety.
- 2. Except as otherwise stated herein, the terms of the Facilities Use Agreement shall remain the same.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the Parties have executed this First Amendment to the Facilities Use Agreement between the District and Charter School as of the dates set forth below.

- --Wifi System Upgrade--
- -Provide and install (14) Ruckus R750, Wi-Fi 6 Wireless Access Points. The WAP's will be installed at or near the existing WAP locations. Three new WAP locations will be added to the existing infrastructure.
- -Provide and install (1) Ruckus R850, Wi-Fi 6 Wireless Access Point. This WAP will be installed in the Sanctuary below the audio room.
- -Provide and install (1) Ruckus ZoneDirector 1200 with AP Licenses and one year of WatchDog Support. The new device will be installed in place of the existing ZoneDirector.
- -Provide and install (2) Ruckus ICX7150 24 port PoE switches with Essential Remote Support. The switches will be installed in the server room or IDF. Each WAP will be connected to the PoE switches unless there isn't a local data cable going to those rooms. In the case that there isn't a data cable going to the server room or IDF the new WAP will be plugged into the existing PoE injector and data cable at the existing location. Switches do not have SFP modules for fiber connectivity, if needed they can be provided on a change order.
- -Existing cable infrastructure to be used (including patch cords) with the exception of the three new WAP locations.
- -Provide and install (3) Cat6 cables for new WAP locations. The cables will be ran from the closest server room, IDF or switch.
- -Installation is to be done during normal business hours.
- -Some hardware may be on backorder.

WARRANTY-TELDATA warrants for the period of time stated on the schedule attached, that the equipment will be free from defects in material and workmanship. If any defects covered by this warranty appear within the stated period, TELDATA shall have the option of repairing or replacing the equipment at its expense. Such repair or replacement shall be Buyer's exclusive remedy for breach of warranty or for negligence. The warranty period begins on the day of Cutover. However, TELDATA is not obligated to provide warranty service until all terms of payment have been met. This warranty will be voided in its entirety if any of the equipment listed on the schedule(s) attached has been rewired, reworked, altered, serviced, redesigned or maintained by someone other than TELDATA, its subcontractors, assigns or affiliates.

TELDATA shall not be liable for any special or consequential damages or for loss, damage or expense directly or indirectly arising from use of the equipment sold or leased hereunder or arising from Buyer's inability to use the equipment either separately or in combination with any other equipment, loss of profits or revenue, cost of capital, cost of purchased or replacement equipment, or claims of customers of the Buyer.

DAMAGES UPON DEFAULT-Failure of the Buyer to perform any of its obligations under this agreement of any supplemental schedule, or insolvency, or any warranty or statement of Buyer proving to be materially incorrect shall constitute a default.
