INSTRUCTIONS FOR PRESENTATIONS TO THE BOARD BY PARENTS AND CITIZENS

El Camino Real Alliance ("ECRA") welcomes your participation at ECRA's Board meetings. The purpose of a public meeting of the Board of Directors ("Board") is to conduct the affairs of ECRA in public. Your participation assures us of continuing community interest in our charter school. To assist you in the ease of speaking/ participating in our meetings, the following guidelines are provided:

1. Agendas are available to all audience members at the door to the meeting. 2. "Request to Speak" forms are available to all audience members who wish to speak on any agenda items or under the general category of "Oral Communications." "Oral Communications" is set aside for members of the audience to raise issues that are not specifically on the agenda. However, due to public meeting laws, the Board can only listen to your issue, not respond or take action. These presentations are limited to three (3) minutes and total time allotted to non-agenda items will not exceed thirty (30) minutes. A member of the public who requires the use of a translator, in order to receive the same opportunity as others to directly address the Board, shall have twice the allotted time to speak. The Board may give direction to staff to respond to your concern or you may be offered the option of returning with a citizen-requested item. 3. You may also complete a "Request to Speak" form to address the Board on Agenda items. With regard to such agenda items, you may specify that agenda item on your "Request to Speak" form and you will be given an opportunity to speak for up to three (3) minutes before the item, and total time allocated to agenda items will not exceed six (6) minutes for a discussion item and nine (9) minutes per vote item. A member of the public who requires the use of a translator, in order to receive the same opportunity as others to directly address the Board, shall have twice the allotted time to speak, and the total allocated time shall be appropriately increased as well.

4. When addressing the Board, speakers are requested to state their name and adhere to the time limits set forth. In order to maintain allotted time limits, the Board Chair may modify speaker time allocations or the total amount of allotted time for an item.
5. Any public records relating to an agenda item for an open session of the Board which are distributed to all, or a majority of all, of the Board members shall be available for public inspection at 5440 Valley Circle Blvd., Woodland Hills, California, 91367.

Consent Agenda: All matters listed under the consent agenda are considered by the Board to be routine and will be approved/enacted by the Board in one motion in the form listed below. Unless specifically requested by a Board member for further discussion or removed from the agenda, there will be no discussion of these items prior to the Board votes on them. Welcome Week will take place July 30th through August 3rd. We are implementing the 1 to 1 initiative, students will be able to sign up for a class on how to use the laptop. We currently have 3,640 students in the computer; of this number, we may lose 40-50 students by the start of school. We have a wait list of about 50 students. It is recommended that we move on the tree trimming, as the trees have not been trimmed in decades and even today some branches fell. We should go through the district as they have been fully vetted and they know what they are doing.

Yes, a paper Expense Request Form is filled out by the staff; this paper form is also processed and is kept as a paper backup for purposes of an audit. The request and approval process is automated through Netsuite, the form is one additional requirement.

IV. School Business

A. Discuss and Possible Approval of Landscape Contract

The request for a 6 month contract was requested from LAUSD but has not yet been received. The Executive Director requested that we move on this for safety reasons, and that we use LAUSD's approved vendor. Mr. Silverstein asks if we could start with a contract that would allow for an immediate start for those trees that constitute the biggest safety concerns. Mr. Kofahl asks why we could not go with the lesser priced vendor, even if they are not LAUSD vetted.

The motion is tabled for the larger contract, but the staff should be allowed to take care of the more immediate safety concerns now.

Brian Archibald made a motion to have the CBO enter into a contract for up to \$10,000 to take care of immediate concerns.

B. Discuss and Possible Approval of 2018-19 Parent-Student Handbook

The changes to the Parent-Student Handbook were minor, primarily to change the calendar, and to include the Immigration and Citizenship Status Policy. Mr. Hussey also noted that the "double-fail" option (which allowed a student who was cheating to be given a zero for the project as well as removing additional points) was removed. Mr. Silverstein asks if there is something that could be included for parents and students who drive recklessly or park improperly. This could be added later as a further amendment to the Handbook.

Darin Ryburn made a motion to approve the 2018-19 Parent-Student Handbook. Steven Kofahl seconded the motion.

The board **VOTED** unanimously to approve the motion.

C. Tech Update

Messages were sent out to parents, students and staff regarding the 1 to 1 rollout. Each grade level will have their own days to come and get their device. Parents with students in different grades cannot register both students at the same time, because of the staggered receipt of the devices. There will be 2 make-up dates where students can pick up a device if they weren't able to do so on their schedule days. At this time, the sign up is not automated, as automating the forms has to be developed with the assistance of an outside vendor, Biztech.

Regarding Canvas integration, the vendors did promise us that Canvas would integrate with Aeries, but now the vendor has indicated this will not be possible at this time. As a result, we will not be able to roll out this functionality in the Fall. Mr. Delgado is asked to look into getting a refund or discount as a result. Mr. Ryburn stated that there should be open communication, and that teachers should be apprised that this is a vendor issue. Ms. Clark stated that Canvas may have oversold their capability, as Canvas advised that the Aeries integration was in the Beta phase but that they were certain that the integration

would be done. Ms. Clark is asked to look into what the cancellation provision is in the contract, given that they cannot deliver on their integration assurance.

D. Discuss and Possible Vote on Tech Refresh for Teachers

Three quotes were obtained; the best quote was from CDW for \$144,778.50 and services from STS for \$3,250.00. The Board expressed concern about spending this amount, when all staff should have laptops. Mr. Delgado notes that 40% of teachers use laptops and 60% of teachers still use desktops. However, we do have extra laptops here that are being unused. And some clerical staff will need upgrades on desktops since they do not have laptops. Also, we will need docking stations, about 150 of them at a cost of \$60,000.

Matter is tabled until the next meeting. Mr. Delgado is asked to look into more specific information as to the true cost of the docking stations, and the number of extra laptops we have.

Purpose and Scope

The purpose and scope of the Administrative Regulations is to provide a procedure and a framework for eligible students to enroll in the program utilizing Independent Study as the study mode of instruction.

General

- 1. Independent Study is available to all students in 9th grade through 12th grade.
- 2. Independent Study students must be enrolled in El Camino Real High Charter School. EC 51748
- 3. Independent Study is an optional educational alternative in which no student may be required to participate and a classroom option is continuously available at the student's district of residence. EC 51747 (c) (7)
- 4. All students enrolled in Independent study must sign a new Master Agreement each year. EC 51747
- 5. For 9th through 12th ADA purposes, total instructional FTE teacher to ADA ratio must not exceed the baseline ratio for all other instructional programs in the largest school district in the county or counties in which El Camino Real Charter High School operates, unless bargained through the school's union. UTLA and ECRA bargained for a teacher student ration for I. S. teachers at 1: 35. EC 51745.6
- 6. A student over age 19 years may generate attendance only if
 - a) The pupil was enrolled in a public school in pursuit of a high school diploma (or, if a student tin special education, an individualized education program (IEP) while 19 years of age and without a break in public school enrollment since that time, is enrolled in the charter school and is making satisfactory progress towards award of a high school diploma (or, if a student in special education, satisfactory progress in keeping with an (IEP) consistent with the definition of satisfactory progress set forth in subdivision (h) of section 11965
 - b) The pupil is not over the age of twenty-two (22) years. EC 47612 5 CCR 11960
- 7. A certified teacher of the school must generally supervise, coordinate, and evaluate the work of each student engaged in Independent Study. Apportionment credit for independent study may be claimed only to the extent of the time value of pupil of student work products, as personally judged in each instance by a certificated teacher. EC51747.5
- 8. The School shall not provide students and parents/guardians with funds or items of value that are not provided to regular classroom students. EC 51747.3 (a)

The Master Agreement

The Master Agreement must indicate the objectives or a statement that refers to the objectives being listed on the Assignment/Work Record or High School Course Description, method of study resources available, meeting time, frequency, place, method of evaluation and indicate if there are any subsidiary papers that are a part of the Master Agreement. EC 51747 (c) (3)

The Master Agreement must have a statement that instruction may be provided for a Section 48915 (expulsion) or 48917 (suspended expulsion) students through Independent Study only if the student is offered the alternative of classroom instruction. The suspended expelled student must have the classroom option always available during the time enrolled in Independent Study. EC 51747 (c) (7)

The goals and objectives specified in the written Independent Study Agreement and Subsidiary Agreements shall be consistent with the Board's Policies, Administrative Regulations, and Procedures for curriculum and instruction. EC 51746.5, 11703 (b) (4)

One or more subject/courses may be added to the Independent Study Agreement during the semester if the student completes all of the pre-determined subjects/courses before the ending date of the agreement.

The Master Agreement will include the following:

- a. Name of pupil/student EC 51748
- b. Home Address EC 51747.3 (b)
- c. Grade level EC 51748
- d. School name EC 51748
- e. Birthday EC 46300.1
- f. Subject(s) and course value/units/credits and other measures. EC 51747 (c) (6)
- g. Objectives will be listed on Assignment/Work Record forms and in High School Course Descriptions. EC 51747 (c) (2)
- h. The method of evaluation must be included in the Master Agreement. EC 51747 (c) (2)
- i. Duration with beginning and ending dates. EC 51747 (c) (5)
- j. Frequency of meetings between student and teacher must be indicated. EC 51747 (c) (1)
- k. The manner of reporting/meeting one-on-one, email, mail, or fax for extenuating circumstances. EC 51747 (c) (1)
- 1. Dated signatures for each student, parent/guardian/caregiver (a caregiver affidavit must be on file.)
- m. Supervising certificated teacher and other teachers who have direct responsibility for providing assistance. All signatures must be completed before ADA may be collected. The Independent Study Agreement can be started in the subjects under the control of the supervising teacher but if an "Other" teacher is involved, the school cannot take attendance/ADA for that course until the agreement is dated and signed by that "Other" assisting person. EC 51747 (c)
- n. Subsidiary contracts can be a part of the Master Agreement and will be indicated as such in the agreement.
- o. It is the policy of El Camino Real High School to continually verify adequate academic progress by students in our independent study program. Excessive missed assignments may be an indicator of an inadequate progress. The Master Agreement requires the meeting of a minimum assignment goal. A progress to determine if this program is in the

student's best interest has been developed and is outlined in the Missing Assignment Report Policy.

- p. The Master Agreement must have a statement giving the maximum length of time, 20 days, which a student has between the time the assignment is assigned and completed Learning periods will be 20 days or monthly. Attendance will be generated every 20 days. EC 51747 (a) (Although not required by education code, it is expected that the credentialed Supervising Teacher will meet with students every five days to verify progress of work assigned to that point).
- q. Master Agreement must have a statement that Independent Study is an optional educational alternative in which no student may be required to participate and a classroom option is continuously available at the student's district of residence. EC 51747 (c) (7)
- r. In the case of a suspended student pending expulsion pursuant to EC 48915 or 48917, a statement is needed that states instruction may be provided through Independent Study only if the student is offered the alternative of classroom instruction. EC 51747 (c)
- s. An updated Master Agreement must be submitted if changes are made in classes or coursework to be completed.
- t. Special education students (individuals with exceptional needs as defined in Ed. Code Section 56026) must have an IEP that specifically provides for Independent Study
- u. Credits earned in high school coursework will become part of the student's permanent record.

Attendance

- Independent Study attendance credit is determined using the time value method which is based on assignments given and evaluated by the certificated teacher and recorded on the Assignment Sheet and Attendance Record; and based upon the daily engagement of charter school pupils in educational activities required of them by El Camino Real Charter High School, on days when school is actually taught in El Camino Real Charter High School. EC 11703 (b) (3)
- Students must be responsible for the same amount of work as if they were in a regular classroom at their assigned level.
- Students whose work indicates to the Supervising teacher an acceptable amount of the work product has been completed will generate 1 day of attendance. A minimum days' worth of work will only count towards attendance not academic grade of a full day. Recorded attendance in days should not exceed more than 5 days in one school week. Attendance should be counted in days not hours.

Credits and Grades

- (i) Course work will be determined by the Master Agreement and Course Descriptions. The Supervising Teacher will be responsible for assigning the appropriate amount of work each learning period. After the teacher evaluates the assignment, an evaluation of the work will be reflected, and the appropriate attendance generated.
- (ii) Sample work being kept for the auditors must have the following 3 items on each sample of work.

- Teacher's name or initials indicating that he/she has personally evaluated the work or that he/she personally reviewed the evaluations made by another certificated teacher.
- Date of the evaluation.
- Teacher comment reflecting evaluation of the work.

Things that should be evident on the representative sample: subject, student's name, date student completed assignment and academic evaluation.

• High school students must complete the high school course description in order to earn 5 semester credits.

Graduation Requirements

- The students enrolled in Independent Study must complete the graduation requirements as prescribed in ECR's Charter Document.
- When the requirements for graduation are completed, the student will be awarded an ECR diploma.

Record Retention

- As required by school policy and state law, the student's monthly assignment paperwork will be maintained for three years. Transcripts will be kept on file indefinitely.
- One sample of student work in each subject area for each learning period will be collected. The first month's sample will be original documents.



EL CAMINO REAL CHARTER HIGH SCHOOL INDEPENDENT STUDY BOARD POLICY

El Camino Real Charter High School may offer independent study to meet the educational needs of pupils enrolled in the charter. Independent study is an alternative education designed to teach the knowledge and skills of the core curriculum and meet the graduation requirements as defined in the school's charter. El Camino Real Charter shall provide appropriate existing services and resources to enable pupils to complete their independent study successfully (Education Code 51746). The following written policies have been adopted by the Board for implementation at El Camino Real Charter High School:

- 1. Independent study through El Camino Real Charter is a continuously voluntary, educational alternative in which no student may be required to participate (Education Code 51747).
- 2. For pupils in all grades offered by El Camino Real Charter, the maximum length of time that may elapse between the time an assignment is made and the date by which the pupil must complete the assigned work shall be 20 school days (Education Code 51747).
- 3. If circumstances justify a longer period of time than 20 school days, the Superintendent or designee may authorize an extension.
- 4. When any pupil fails to complete ten assignments during any period of 20 days, the Principal or his or her designee shall conduct an evaluation to determine whether it is in the best interest of the pupil to remain in independent study. A written record of the findings of any evaluation conducted pursuant to this policy shall be treated as a mandatory interim pupil record. This record shall be maintained for a period of three years from the date of the evaluation and if the pupil transfers to another California public school, the record shall be forwarded to that school (Education Code 51747).
- 5. A current written master agreement shall be maintained on file for each independent study pupil, including but not limited to, all of the following (Education Code 51747):
 - The manner, time, frequency, and place for submitting a pupil's assignments and for reporting his or her progress.
 - The objectives and methods of study for the pupil's work, and the methods utilized to evaluate that work.
 - The specific resources, including materials and personnel, that will be made available to the pupil

EL CAMINO REAL CHARTER HIGH SCHOOL INDEPENDENT STUDY BOARD POLICY

- ✤ A statement of the policies adopted herein regarding the maximum length of time allowed between assignment and completion of a pupil's assigned work, and the number of missed assignments allowed prior to an evaluation of whether or not the pupil should be allowed to continue in independent study.
- The duration of the independent study agreement, including beginning and ending dates for the pupil's participation in independent study under the agreement. No independent study agreement shall be valid for any period longer than one year.
- ✤ A statement of the number of course credits to be earned by the pupil upon completion.
- The inclusion of a statement in each independent study agreement that independent study is an optional educational alternative in which no pupil may be required to participate.
- Each written agreement shall be assigned, prior to the commencement of independent study, by the pupil, the pupil's parent, legal guardian, or caregiver, if the pupil is less than 18 years of age, the certificated employee who has been designated as having responsibility for the general supervision of independent study, and all persons who have direct responsibility for providing assistance to the pupil. For purposes of this paragraph, "caregiver" means person who has met the requirements of Part 1.5 (commencing with Section 6550) of the Family Code.
- 6. El Camino Real Charter High School shall comply with the Education Code Sections 51757 through 51749.3 and the provisions of the Charter School's Act and the State Board of Education regulations adopted there under.
- 7. The principal shall establish regulations to implement these policies in accordance with the law.
