I. Opening Items

A. Call the Meeting to Order

Brad Wright called a meeting of the board of directors of El Camino Real Charter High School to order on Thursday Mar 24, 2022 at 4:33 PM.

B. Record Attendance and Guests

C. Pledge of Allegiance

Dr. Lowry led Board members, invited guests, and meeting attendees in the Pledge of Allegiance to the United States of America.

D. Public Comments

Dr. Lowry read the following public comments received via email:

Parent Vanessa Cox - Is in favor of ending mask mandate with no more delay since the State, City, and the LAUSD have ended the indoor mask mandate.

Teacher Melissa Gregorio - Expressed concern about lifting mask mandate, given that she has seen headlines regarding warnings of additional COVID-19 waves/surges. Implored Board to follow LAUSD's lead and maintain weekly COVID-19 testing program until the end of the school year if the the Board lifts the indoor mask mandate.

Parent Lisa Doerr - Appealed to the Board to do the "right thing" and lift the mask mandate.

Parent Neta Markusfeld - Appealed to the Board to lift the indoor mask mandate to give students and parents the choice themselves of removing or wearing their masks and live a normal life without "ridiculous mandates."

Parent Rachel Ramirez - Requests the Board to end the Mask Mandate at ECR to "allow our students to get back to a normal high school experience." Also asks that "teachers and staff be instructed to NOT make students feel like immoral people for unmasking. Parent shared that her daughter had been made to feel uncomfortable when an alleged "very outspoken, pro-mask teacher had students raise their hands" so she could learn which students were planning to "take their masks off." Parent noted that her daughter did not raise her hand because she was afraid of repercussions for "thinking differently than her teacher."

Dean of Students Barbara Stanoff - Shared concerns about daily need to remind students to wear their face masks, noting that the past few days have been especially difficult. Also shared concerns about coming to school daily with students who are not vaccinated, meet with parents who are not vaccinated, while the board refuses to have inperson meetings.

Meeting Attendees verbally shared the following public comments during the meeting:

Student Aidan I. - Expressed desire that Board vote to end the mask mandate; noted that masks are no longer necessary; cited Ed. Code 66252 to note people's right to participate in school "free from discrimination and harassment."

Parent C. Velasco - Expressed her desire for the Board vote to end the mask mandate; cited LAUSD Superintendent's explanation for ending LAUSD's mask mandate, and noted that the COVID vaccination did not prevent COVID.

E. Farley - Agree with previous speaker(s) to allow mask choice and asked board to end the mask mandate and COVID-19 vaccine mandate. Noted concerns about discrimination and infringement against "medical freedom." Noted "where there is risk, there must be choice."

Elyana Nadres - spoke in favor of Board ending mask mandate, stating it "should be a choice" and that there is no reason why it should continue."

Michael Aronis - Stated his agreement with previous speakers, noting that COVID enhanced anxiety.

Student N. Velasco - Spoke against mask mandate.

Parent S. Cohen - Spoke against mask mandate, and expressed a desire that ECR align with State, County to unmask. Cited a traumatic experience as a child with a game wherein children were afraid to participate while at the same time they were afraid not to participate/conform to the rules. She drew that analogy to how kids might feel in response to the potential removal of the mask mandate.

Teacher Eleanor Green - Spoke in favor of continuing of mask mandate indoors. Cited her views in that "choice is inadequate" in that individuals' choices impact other people. Cited her view that "privileged" will benefit more favorably from ending the mask mandate than the "oppressed." Urges weekly testing be continued.

Student Leia Frederick - spoke in favor of continuing the mask mandate. Omicron variant is present; now isn't the time to end the indoor mask mandate and kids aren't complaining about wearing masks.

Parent Holly Allen - spoke against the mask mandate, stating that she is "so against it." Noted that people who still wish to wear a mask have the choice to continue to do so.

E. AB 361 Vote on Virtual Board Meetings

Brad Wright made a motion to continue to convene Board Meetings in virtual format as outlined in AB 361. Linda Ibach seconded the motion.

The motion passed 3-2 with 2 members being absent.

NOTE:

This vote was a re-vote in response to Mr. Wright's desire to change his vote of "Abstain" that had been recorded during an original roll call vote.

Accordingly, Mr. Wright made a motion for the Board to cast votes again on the motion to continue to convene Board Meetings in virtual format as outlines in AB361.

Ms. Ibach seconded Mr. Wright's motion. The board **VOTED** to approve the motion.

* UTLA appreciates the benefits of virtual board meetings, but wants ECRA Board to meet in person to look at the faces of its stakeholders. Thanked Mr. Kofahl and Mrs. Malconian for voting to return to in-person board meetings. Noted that if teachers can turn on a camera in their classrooms, Board can do the same while meeting in person. Noted that while Board members are volunteers, they chose to serve.

* ECR UTLA Survey conducted Wednesday, March 2nd, 2022, regarding input in anticipation of indoor mask mandate vote. Roughly 42% not in favor of mask mandate; 33% in favor of mask mandate; 25% doesn't matter.

* Expressed support for Board Agenda Item 5.D., to support LBGTQ+ resolution to recognize the month of June as Pride Month. Referenced annual Conference in October 28-30, and recognized contributions by H. Maury 9Safe Space Classrooms) and J. Wasser (Working with GSA student leadership) at the site level.

* UTLA will resume bargaining toward the end of May (2022) on teacher performance evaluations.

* Argued that UTLA should be engaged by ECRA with regard to capitalization projects "Ad Hoc" Committee meeting. Stated that by now there should be a master plan in place and more broad sharing of information about projects from LAUSD, the committee, and ECR Business Office. Wants to know plans, priorities, timetables, and to be able to provide input on these items. Expressed pleasure with cash position, but concerned about PPP loan forgiveness funds being moved into an unrestricted account. Wants UTLA to have a say in how funds are spent beyond monthly, public board meetings, which she claims are "not enough." Stated UTLA needs fewer elusive updates and more direct engagement at the site level. * Cited a big concern with how ECRA intends to retain educators and education support professionals. Stated educators are working harder than ever and cited a February 2022 NEA poll wherein 55% of educators polled for the survey indicated that they are thinking of leaving the profession earlier than they had planned. Stated in August 2021, that number was 37%. Stated there are growing concerns about keeping our educators. Cited staff shortages across the country and noted that fewer people are entering the profession. Asked rhetorically "What are we doing now to be proactive?" Board President Wright thanked Ms. Collins for her report, congratulated her on her reselection as UTLA chair, and informed her and others that the ECRA Board will determine when and how it will convene its monthly board meetings.

He subsequently asked Dr. Lowry to revisit the AB 361 Vote so Mr. Wright could change his earlier vote from "abstain" to "Yes."

Dr. Lowry noted that to do so requires a Board Motion, which subsequently was provided.

H. Executive Director Update

Mr. Hussey provided his Executive Director Update, with highlights as follows:

* We had our School's Special Education District Validation Review (DVR), wherein the LAUSD reviews special education protocols and compliance issues. Thanks to Mrs. Larew, Mr. Kingery, Mr. Wasser, our special ed. and general ed. teachers, and our staff for their work in preparing for the DVR and more importantly for their work on a day in and day out basis.

* Charter Schools Division (CSD) will be conducting their annual visit on April 4-5.

* We are working on our WASC accreditation report. Thanked all teachers and stakeholders who are working on the elements of the report and noted that our classified staff are involved, too. Next week we will obtain input from our parent stakeholders and we will soon involve Board once we have our foundation.

* I want to thank Mr. Wright for working with LAUSD for getting holes filled on our service road. It had taken eight months and he was able to not only get the holes filled but get the area repaved.

* Thanked all stakeholders, noting that the school only had three (3) detected cases of COVID-19 during the past four (4) weeks.

* We will be observing Cesar Chavez Day on Friday, April 1st.

* Spring Break will be April 11th-15th.

* Tonight at 6 p.m. is Transition to High School Night, wherein academic offerings, extracurricular activities, athletics and more will be discussed with incoming parents, as well as with those who are thinking about enrolling their students at El Camino.

* We will be visiting Hale M.S. April 4-5 to begin programming those students. Also going to James Jordan M.S., Chime Charter, and Woodland Hills Academy, where we will meet with those students one-on-one.

* We have school tours every Tuesday and Thursday at 4:15 p.m. to show what El Camino can offer.

* Drama performed the play 9-to-5 four nights to sold-out crowds and with "rave reviews."

* Student Council set up a "March Madness" tournament and we had a lot of spectators. The Final was yesterday in the Gym and generated 250 spectators after school, which was great, and our "Step," "K-Pop," and "hip-hop" student performers performed at half-time.

* Our Annual Powder Puff football game welcomed over 1000 students and family members in attendance who saw a thrilling 28-21 overtime win for our juniors. This effort shows that we are slowly getting back into the rhythm of things. I want to thank all of our students and staff for their efforts.

I. Chief Business Officer Update

Mr. Wood provided his Chief Business Officer Update, with highlights as follows:

* Five (5) staff members attended the CA Charter Schools Association (CCSA) conference in Long Beach, which was over three (3) days, and wherein a number of beneficial things were discussed and heard.

* Met with our current insurance provider, CharterSAFE, and looked at a number of other vendors out there, including food services providers, other charter members to hear their best practices.

* There was a regional meeting wherein there was a discussion about LAUSD and their relations with Charters.

* Met with representatives of CaIPERS to learn about employees' opportunities related to CaIPERS.

* Last week we held a mandatory tour of four (4) food services bidders for our food services program beginning next year, including Chartwells (incumbent provider), Sodexo, Fresh Start, and Huntington Culinary.

* Next Steps in RFP process, including food tastings, and more information, to be forthcoming.

* Shared that he had presented the 22-23 budget calendar and budgeting process at the March 10th, 2022, Instructional Leadership Team Meeting. Highlighted a bottoms-up and inclusive approach as relates to school budgeting, with emphasis on textbooks, instructional materials, and field trips-related department budgets. Those members presented provided positive feedback on the process.

B. 2021-2022 Second Interim Budget Report

* Profit and Loss Summary Slide:

* Includes January as the State wants to know how things look through the first seven (7) months.

* Reclassified PPP loan from 21-22 Federal Revenue to 20-21 Federal Revenue.

* 7 months into this fiscal year the normal range of percentages is within 59% (we're at 61.6%)

* Student supplies are generally purchased at the beginning of the year.

Projected Balance Sheet Slide:

* Investments from June 2021 were in transition between brokerage firms

* Year End Receivables are generally higher due to State Apportionment Funding Timelines

* Deferred Revenue is higher due to receipt of 20-21 LCFF funds at the end of June 2021 and again at August 2021 (Funds to be paid by end of the Fiscal Year).

The subsequent pages are detailed supporting pages for the Profit and Loss and Balance Sheet slides (in 2nd interim format - CDE SACS format that ECR certifies and sends/shares with LAUSD, LACOE, and CDE).

* Provided brief overview of the detailed version of the report that is provided to LAUSD.

* Provided brief overview of Fed. and State Special Education Revenue and Expenses for ECRCHS. Fed. revenues received must be fully spent or unspent portion will be returned.

* Our expenditures show that ECRCHS is spending more than the State revenue amount provided (over \$2.56M). This is called "encroachment" and for the purposes of this report, we as an organization are eligible for grants/funding because we have spent in excess of the amount of money provided for our students with disabilities (SWDs).

C. Discussion and Vote to Continue with Schwab as ECR Actuary through 21-22 and 22-23 with option years 23-24 and 24-25.

Beacon 'Pointe of View' April 2022

The Quick Facts

- A historically rough quarter for stock and bond investors
- U.S. stocks post the biggest quarterly decline in two years
- Bond market suffers worst quarter in more than 40 years
- Energy, metals, and commodities continue to rise at a historic pace
- Markets are now pricing in eight more 25bps rate hikes by the end of 2022 (a total of +200bps)

Stocks, sovereign bonds, and corporate credit all got hammered in the year's first quarter amid concerns about a growth slowdown as central banks move to tackle inflation by withdrawing stimulus.

Across equity and fixed-income markets broadly, the "least-bad" performance among U.S. assets were declines of 3.0% in U.S. TIPS (Treasury inflation-protected securities), 4.6% in the S&P 500 and 4.8% in High Yield credit. They were followed by a 5.9% fall in the U.S. Aggregate, a 6.2% drop in the Muni index, and a 7.7% slide in Investment Grade credit.

Numerous periods have been far worse for specific asset classes. This quarter's retreat in equities pales in comparison to the 30+% correction at the start of 2020. But viewed as a whole – and leaving out commodities, which soared – 1Q 2022 has been a rough one for investors, with nowhere to hide.

For the quarter, the S&P 500 fell 4.6% and the Nasdaq declined 8.9%. March was a bit of a bright spot, however, as the major averages enjoyed a solid two-week rally in the back half of the month. The S&P 500 and Nasdaq rose 3.7% and 3.5% in March, respectively.

Defensive sectors such as Consumer Staples and Utilities were among the best performing sectors; they are viewed as strong plays in a risk-off environment. Nine out of eleven sectors finished in the red in 1Q 2022. Energy (+39.0%) had its best quarter since its inception in 1989 on the back of soaring oil and gas prices, followed by Utilities (+4.7%). The defensive Consumer Staples (-1.1%) held up relatively well, as did the rate-sensitive Financials (-1.5%).

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With global economies still adjusting to Covid's impact on supply chains and the shift in consumer spending, Russia's invasion of Ukraine at the end of February added fuel to the inflation fire. Commodities and rates accelerated higher from existing uptrends as strict sanctions were imposed on Russia's economy and financial system. Ironically, most U.S. equity benchmarks bottomed within a day of the Russian invasion.

Soaring rates had the greatest negative impact on long-duration Growth stocks. In 1Q, the large-cap Russell 1000 Value index outperformed the Russell 1000 Growth index by 8.3%. This is Value's strongest outperformance over growth since the 2000-2002 era.

The ESG segment of the market as measured by the MSCI USA ESG Select Index was down 8.6% for 1Q 2022, approximately 4.0% worse than the S&P 500 for the period, with ~90% of the underperformance attributable to stock selection and the remainder to sector allocation. However, over the last 3 years, the ESG index is up 71.8% and approximately 3.7% ahead of the S&P 500 on a total return basis.

Outside of the U.S., the MSCI Emerging Markets Index posted a 7.0% loss in 1Q 2022. Russia was reclassified in March by MSCI from Emerging Markets (EM) status to Stand-alone Markets status. At the onset of the global financial crisis in 2008, Russia was the fourth-largest EM country, behind China, South Korea and Brazil. At the start of the year, Russia accounted for just under 4% of the index. Today, Chinese, Taiwanese and Indian firms account for close to 60% of the index. The MSCI EAFE (Europe, Australasia and the Far East) index was down 5.4% for the first quarter, underperforming the U.S. Large Cap equity benchmark by ~0.8% YTD.

On the Fixed Income side, 1Q 2022 was the worst quarter in more than 40 years as the Federal Reserve (the Fed) signaled that they were going to be more aggressive in removing policy accommodation. The benchmark high-grade U.S. Credit index fell 7.7% in the first quarter, equaling the slump of the global financial crisis. The first-quarter rout was widespread and focused on debt with higher duration, or sensitivity to interest rate moves.

Rates have been trending higher since October 2021, when the 2-year U.S. Treasury Yield, a common market barometer of the Fed's rate policy, broke higher from a Covid-period range. In the final week of March, both the 2×10 yield (the difference between 10yr and 2yr Treasury yields) and the 5×30 yield spreads inverted. While inversion is often associated with a recession, it is not a good timing signal as there is often a lag between 12 and 24 months before market tops and the onset of a recession. With the 2×10 yield spread essentially a flat 0.01% at the end of March, credit investors are implying that the Fed is going to increase rates high and fast enough to push the U.S. economy into a recession. At the start of 1Q, markets were pricing in three 25bps rate hikes for all of 2022. Markets are now expecting eight rate hikes implying a ~2.5% Federal Funds Rate by the end of 2022.

Market volatility saw the biggest spike since the Covid shock of March 2020 with the Russian invasion of Ukraine and an intraday high of 37.8 on February 24. The CBOE Volatility Index or VIX was already back down to a mild 20.6 at the end of the quarter. Interest rate volatility remains elevated, highlighting the difference between the stock and the bond markets when it comes to inflation – the stock market is relatively unconcerned.

Following a 27.1% gain in 2021, its best annual performance in 42 years, the Bloomberg Commodity Index advanced 25.5% in 1Q 2022. Gold was up both in March (+1.5%) and YTD (+5.9%), more likely as a disaster hedge than an inflation hedge. Oil prices (West Texas Intermediate, or WTI) jumped 7.3% in March, settling at \$100/bbl and are up 82.3% year-on-year. Bitcoin gained 9.9% in March, while Ethereum gained 17.0%. The two most popular currencies remain down for the year with a 1.2% and 10.5% decline, respectively.

At Beacon Pointe, we remain confident that our long-term themes and theses of "Financial Repression" and "Inflation Rates and Rotation" remain intact. While current economic data shows the U.S. economy remains strong, the surge in inflation and rates over 1Q could weigh on economic growth and impact corporate earnings. Corporate guidance on wage increases and margins will be a key focus during the upcoming 1Q earnings season. While Fixed Income had its worst quarter in forty years and the war in Ukraine continues with little visibility on a peace settlement, credit spreads have pulled back to pre-crisis levels, which typically bodes well for equities.



Chart of the Month – U.S. Treasury Yield Curve Spread

Investors are worrying that the spread between the 10-year and 2-year Treasury yield is signaling an upcoming recession. The 2y x 10y yield spread (the difference between 10yr and 2yr Treasury yields) has narrowed sharply since the start of the year from about 80bps to nearly flat at the end of March. When it falls to zero or turns negative (i.e., "inverts") it is, at least historically, a warning sign that a recession could follow. On the other hand, the spread between the 10-year Treasury and the Federal Fund Rates (FF x 10y) has widened from below zero when Covid first hit in early 2020 to about 200bps in March 2022. The FF x 10y is one of the ten components of the Index of Leading Economic Indicators (LEI) and is signaling continued economic growth. The two yield curve spreads have rarely diverged the way they have this year, looking all the way back to the late 1970s. Why such a divergence? Because bond markets are pricing future rates hikes and implying that the Fed is "behind the curve" on raising interest rates.

AGENDA ITEM:

Discuss and vote to buy out the leased student laptops.

BRIEF SUMMARY OF THE ISSUE:

The technology and business departments have worked closely with Teqlease (our leasing partner) to obtain a competitive lease buyout quote with favorable terms, while assuring a cost-effective proposal. The FMV (fair market value) was negotiated to \$48 for all outstanding leased devices. Pre-negotiated FMV for the 2019-20 and 2020-21 were \$129 and \$112 respectively. This proposal also includes savings of \$4,902.21 on interest expense.

Based on our cost analysis, projections of our remaining lease payments, and factoring the audit cost (charges derived from lease returns averaging \$50,000 per/yr), ECRCHS will save approximately \$58,663.40 if early buyout is exercised. The funding source will **not** encumber the general fund budget as ECRCHS will be using categorical funding. (e.g. ESSER, CARES, etc. to cover the amount)

This will also allow ECRCHS to offer a student "buy-back" option. Which will allow students to purchase their devices for a marginal cost.
