## July-August 2019:

Enrollment Process: we currently have 125 students committed to the Independent Study Program (ISP) for the 2019-20 school year. This number is expected to grow over the summer and throughout the school year.

Students may enroll in the ISP through either an ECR counselor referral or self-select. Both processes include the following:

- Conference with coordinator or administrator:

The intake conference communicates in detail the student, family and school commitment to this non-traditional approach to education. All parties involved must agree that the ISP is the best approach to education for the student. The legal requirements are also covered.

- Master Agreement and guidelines for ISP-see attachment for example of Master Agreement and educational codes. This document is required for all students enrolling in ISP in the state of California.
- Skills assessment - MAP.
- Computer Tablet check out.
- Assignment of online curriculum - start date: first day of school.
- Introduction of College and Career Pathways offered.
- Canvas instruction if needed.

Materials and Resources:
Order: Instructional materials, curriculum, tablets, clerical supplies, science lab materials.
Hire: Staff to include 5 teachers to start (expand as enrollment increases), Campus Safety Officer (CSO) and custodial staff.

Move: Prepare and move all ISP compliance paperwork instructional materials at present location in Main Campus to North Campus.

Teaching Staff: Set up classrooms with all necessary paperwork and learning materials. Provide professional development as needed for Canvas.

Clerical: Set up admission process, resource room for staff, compliance room for required IS paperwork, MAP assessment.

## VOLUNTARY STATEMENT:

Independent Study is an optional educational alternative in which no pupil may be required to participate and that students voluntarily select, including expelled students (Educational Code 48915). In the case of a pupil who is referred, instruction may be provided through Independent Study only if the pupil is offered the alternative of classroom instruction. All students who choose Independent Study must have the continuing option of returning to the classroom.

## EQUITABLE PROVISIONS OF RESOURCES AND SERVICES:

El Camino Real Charter High School will provide appropriate instructional materials and personnel to enable the student to complete the assigned work. Resources must include those reasonably necessary to the achievement of the objectives and must include resources that are normally available to all students on the same terms on which they are available to all. Assignments and specific resources will be designated on the Assignment Sheet and Attendance Record incorporated herein.

REPORTING: Students are required to report to their teacher as follows for submitting work, reporting and assessing progress:

# EL CAMINO REAL CHARTER HIGH SCHOOL MASTER AGREEMENT FOR INDEPENDENT STUDY 

## BOARD POLICIES:

(A) For pupils in all grades offered by El Camino Real Charter, the maximum length of time that may elapse between the time an assignment is made and the date by which the pupil must complete the assigned work shall be 20 school days (Education Code 51747).
(B) When any pupil fails to complete ten assignments during any period of 20 days, the Principal or his or her designee shall conduct an evaluation to determine whether it is in the best interest of the pupil to remain in independent study. A written record of the findings of any evaluation conducted pursuant to this policy shall be treated as a mandatory interim pupil record. This record shall be maintained for a period of three years from the date of the evaluation and if the pupil transfers to another California public school, the record shall be forwarded to that school (Education Code 51747).
(C) If circumstances justify a longer period of time than 20 school days, the principal or designee may authorize an extension.

All course objectives will be consistent with El Camino Real Charter School's board policy and are consistent with El Camino Real's school standards, as outlined in the charter course description.
