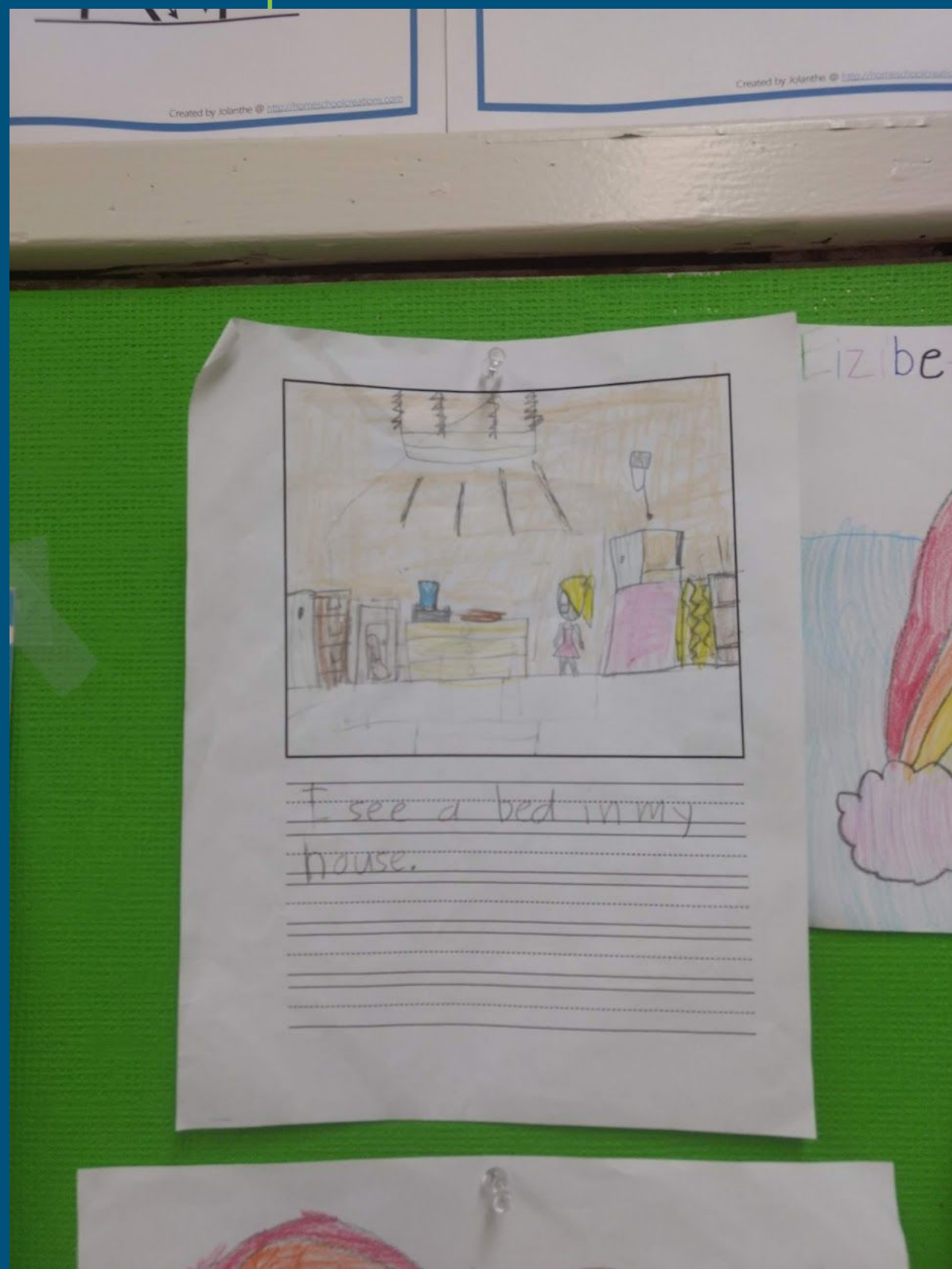

February Updates

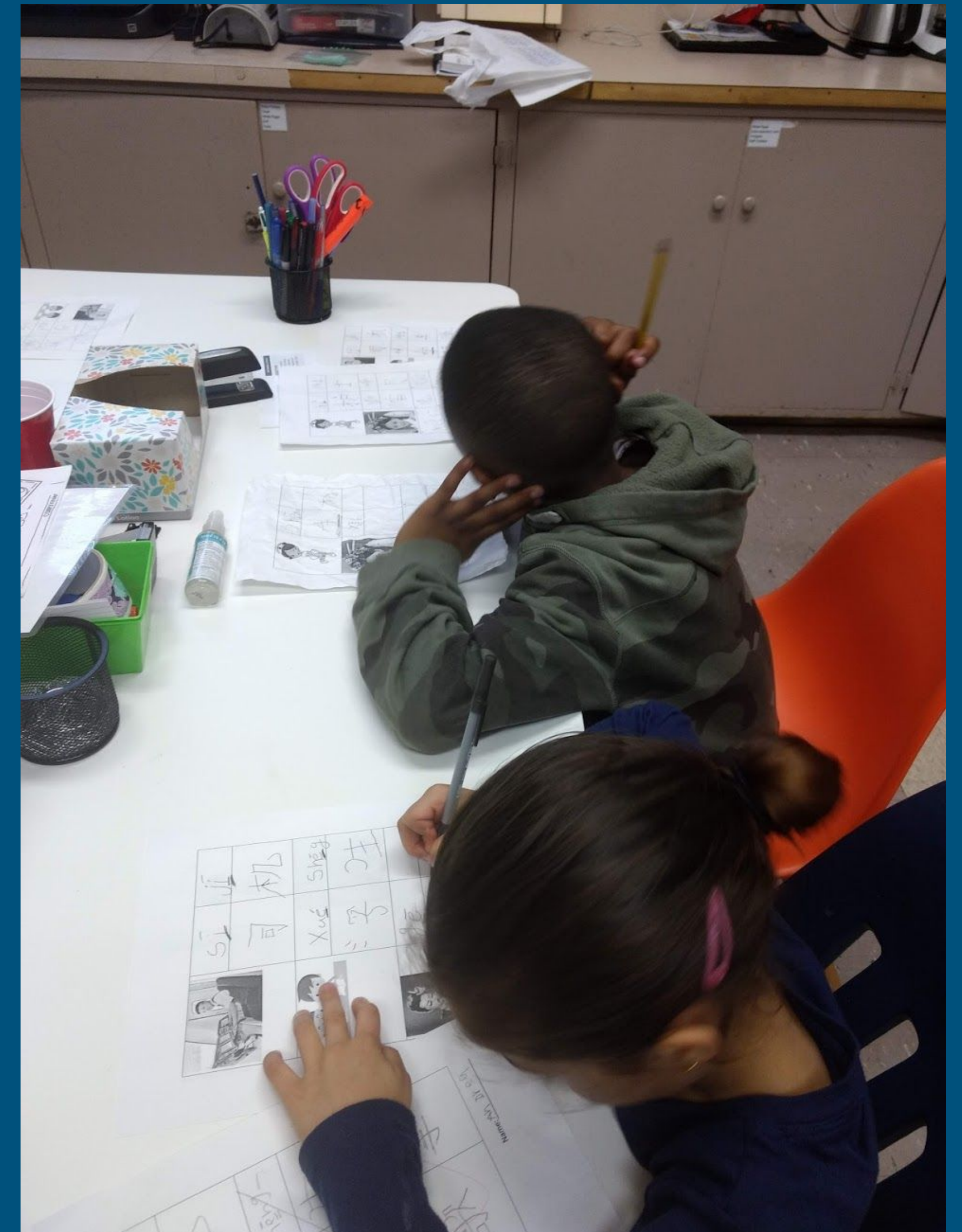
1. **Celebration:** African-American read-in, Lunar New Year Celebration, Spirit Days.

4. **Behavioral Therapy:** MOU with La Clinica signed and we are moving forward with AIMS students as clients.













K-1 Satellite: Upcoming Priorities

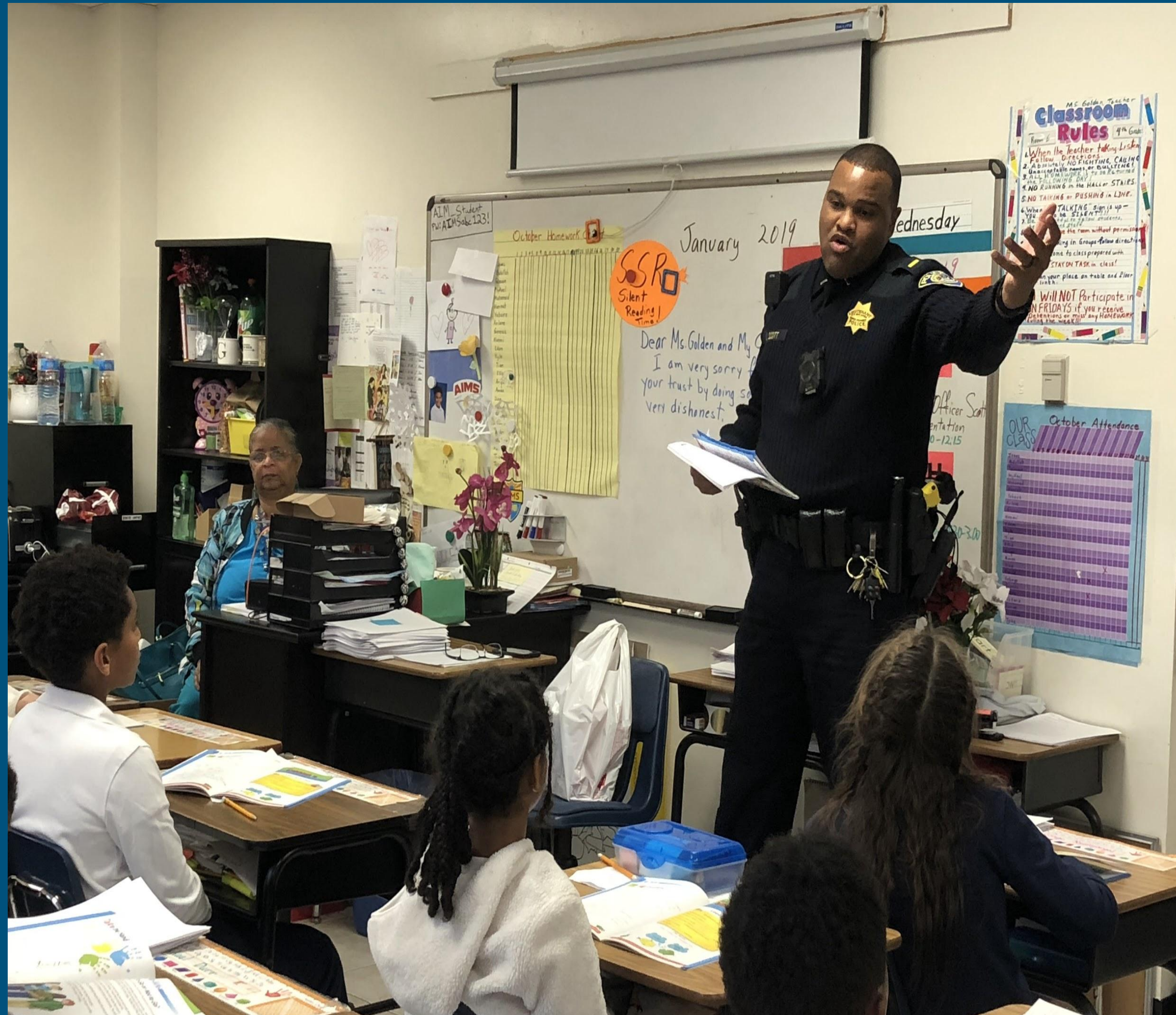

- On Wednesday, March 13, approximately 100 middle school students, parents, and teachers joined AIPHS and attended the CA Stand for All Charter School Rally, in Sacramento. Specially designed “We Are Oakland Too” T-Shirts to honor of the special occasion.

As mentioned in the WASC visit report last month, there remain issues with the AIPHS landlord/authorizer, especially around space.

The main questions areas from the visitation group were in “rigor,” “culture,” and “AP for all.”

This group identified that AIPHS strengths were in the consistent AIMS model, relationships between teachers and students, and high expectations.

High School

Secondly, in order to fill the pool of potential teachers, administrators have been attending recruitment fairs at:

- **CSU East Bay (Hayward)**
- **Holy Names (Oakland) and**
- **CSU Sacramento**

Each of these events have produced one to three real candidates for the high school. On that basis, we feel the hours away from school are worth the time investment.

High School

Swipeclock training to help keep track of employees and their sick and vacation time took place. Two High School staff were trained.

We continue to serve lunch daily to around 160 students. Since the last Board meeting we have served around 640 lunches!

PSAT was offered to 9th and 10th graders on April 10 and 11. About 220 students took this college preparatory exam on those days.

Certificated Evaluations

Much of February and March was dedicated to going over lesson plans, spending longer periods of time observing in classrooms, and post observation meetings.

Financial Literacy for young women was an event at the YMCA in Berkeley. Several of our students attended.
