# AIMS K-12 College Prep Breakfast Program

#### Universal Meals Program

Beginning in School Year (SY) 2022–23, California will become the first state to implement a statewide Universal Meals Program for all school children. California's Universal Meals Program is designed to build on the foundations of the federal National School Lunch Program (NSLP) and School Breakfast Program (SBP). There are three key pillars that have been established to ensure that the program is a success:


- 1. California's State Meal Mandate is expanded to include **both** a nutritiously adequate breakfast **and** lunch for **all** children each school day.
- 2. California's Universal Meals Program requires very high poverty schools to participate in a federal provision.
- 3. The California State Legislature will be allocating funds to provide additional state meal reimbursement to cover the cost of the Universal Meals Program.

California Universal Meals updates *Education Code (EC)*, Section 49501.5 that requires public school districts, county offices of education, and charter schools to provide a breakfast and lunch to students that request a meal, free of charge for each school day beginning in SY 2022–23.


In order to receive state reimbursement for the two meals, local educational agencies (LEA) must participate in both the NSLP and SBP.

### Breakfast Program Benefits: Why Should AIMS Participate?

- School Breakfast program (SBP) is a federally funded program that will provide free and reduced low-income families breakfast.
- Studies show benefits of students that eat breakfast and relation to academic performance.
- The School Breakfast program(SBP) is a federally assisted program that provides encourages schools to provide breakfast, lunch and snack to fulfill the hunger gap for students participating in public schools.




#### Survey Results: Grade Level of Students

Cost neutral program, AIMS will be reimbursed for 100% of all students that participate within the Breakfast program regardless of FRL status due to the Universal Breakfast program. SFAs must still claim each breakfast according to the number of breakfast meals served to free, reduced-price, and paid students.

#### Program Requirements

There are many similarities between the School Breakfast Program (SBP) and the National School Lunch Program (NSLP). Both programs must be open to all enrolled children. If a child already qualifies for free or reduced-price lunches, then the child would also qualify for free or reduced-price breakfasts. Also, records must be kept to document that the breakfast program follows all federal and state rules and regulations. Such records include:

- Meal production records and inventory records which document the amounts and types of food used.
- The number of breakfasts served each day, by site and by category (free, reduced-price, and full price).

The California Department of Education's review of each agency's breakfast program is generally done in conjunction with the review of the agency's National School Lunch Program. AIMS typically receives more than \$500,000 annually with the combination with AIMS lunch program in federal funds therefore AIMS will be audited each year.

#### How will AIMS K-12 College Prep be funded?

• The School Breakfast Program (SBP) is operated on a reimbursement basis, with agencies paid on the number of meals served. Agencies submit a monthly reimbursement claim through the Child Nutrition Information Payment System (CNIPS). After the Department reviews and approves the claim, it is processed by the State Controller's Office and a check is issued. Agencies typically receive reimbursement within four to six weeks after submitting the reimbursement claim.

• SFAs must still claim each breakfast according to the number of breakfast meals served to free, reduced-price, and paid students.
