Martin demonstrated data dashboards related to coaching and proficiency growth. C. Wright asked clarifying questions concerning strategies for online coaching and connections between coaching and student achievement.

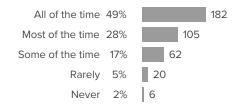

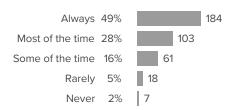

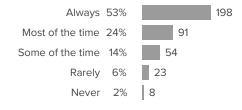
Q.1: How often do you feel proud of your school?

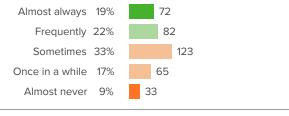

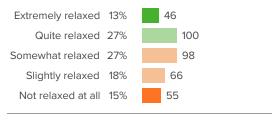
Q.1: How often are you able to pull yourself out of a bad mood?

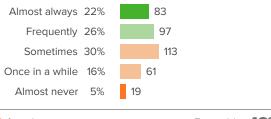
Q.2: When everybody around you gets angry, how relaxed can you stay?

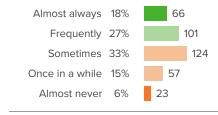
Q.3: How often are you able to control your emotions when you need to?

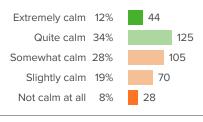
Q.4: Once you get upset, how often can you get yourself to relax?

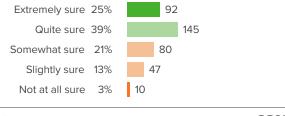

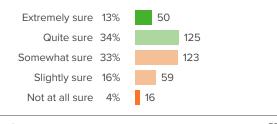
Q.1: How sure are you that you can complete all the work that is assigned in your class?

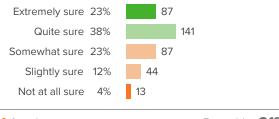
Q.2: When complicated ideas are discussed in class, how sure are you that you can understand them?

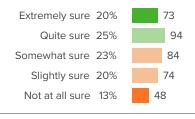
Q.3: How sure are you that you can learn all the topics taught in your class?

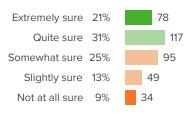

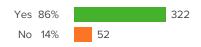

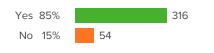

Q.1: Do you have a teacher or other adult from school who you can count on to help you, no matter what?



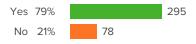

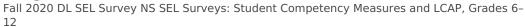

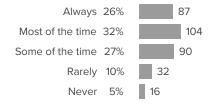
Q.1: How often do you feel proud of your school?



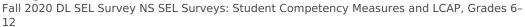
Q.2: How often do you feel safe at school?



Q.3: How often do you feel that adults care about you at school?







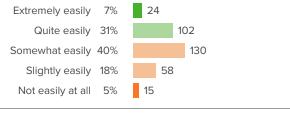

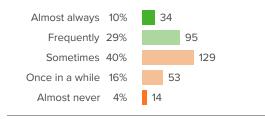
Q.1: When you are feeling pressured, how easily can you stay in control?

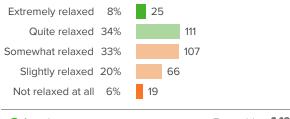
Q.2: How often are you able to pull yourself out of a bad mood?

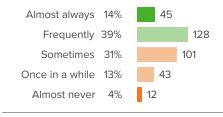
Q.3: When everybody around you gets angry, how relaxed can you stay?

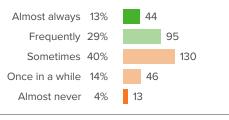
Q.4: How often are you able to control your emotions when you need to?

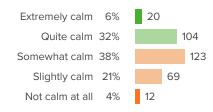
Q.5: Once you get upset, how often can you get yourself to relax?

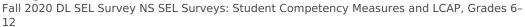
Q.6: When things go wrong for you, how calm are you able to remain?

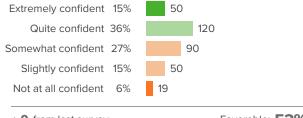

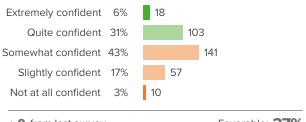

Q.1: How confident are you that you can complete all the work that is assigned in your classes?



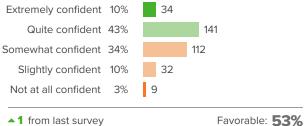

Q.2: When complicated ideas are presented in class, how confident are you that you can understand them?

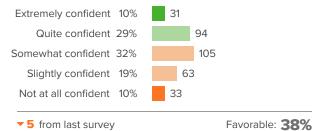

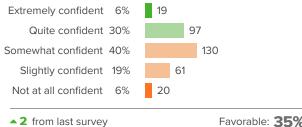
Q.3: How confident are you that you can learn all the material presented in your classes?

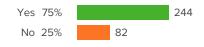

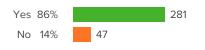

Q.1: Do you have a teacher or other adult from school who you can count on to help you, no matter what?



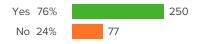

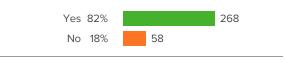
