D. Opening Comments from Chief Academic Officer

James Dent welcomed attendees and provided an overview of the agenda and presenters.

II. Academic Topics

A. Unit 1 STAR Assessment Results

James Dent shared Unit 1 interim assessment results, highlighting positive growth across all schools in reading and math. He provided analysis and disaggregated data for key student groups, including English learners, economically disadvantaged students, and special education students. The committee discussed essential levers for student success, including the impact of student centers and interventions.

B.

Adoptions for Next Year

Crystal O'Rourke outlined processes for reviewing and approving curriculum pilots for 2024-2025. She shared a chart listing current curricula in English Language Arts, math, science, and social studies. She provided a timeline for next steps, and board members asked clarifying questions.

C. Edulastic and Assessment Update

Neena Goswamy presented information regarding a pilot of the Edulastic platform, including sample data visualizations and dynamic tables. She shared the guiding motivation behind the piloting effort and led a discussion of the pros and cons of Edulastic. Attendees discussed alternative approaches and implications of each, including issues of cost and longevity. The group considered additional sources of guidance on the matter. The committee reviewed a timeline for next steps.

James Dent shared that he would communicate with the committee chair in the near future to determine a date for a meeting occurring in January, 2024.

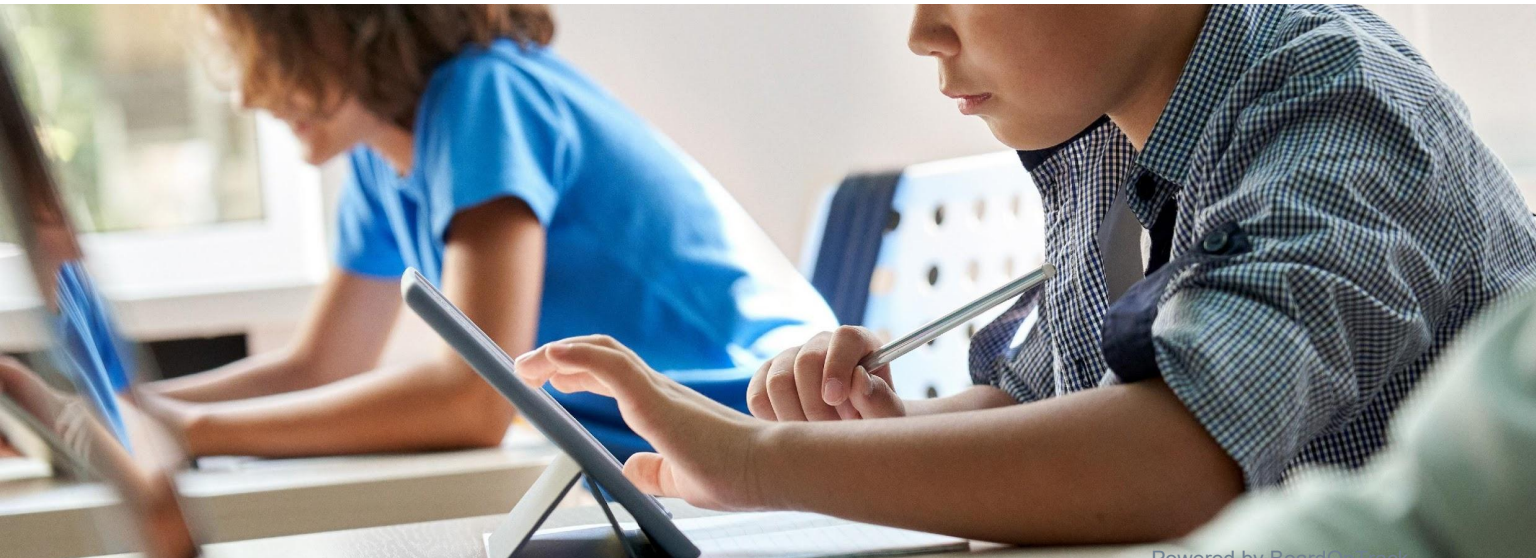


Executive Summary – JD

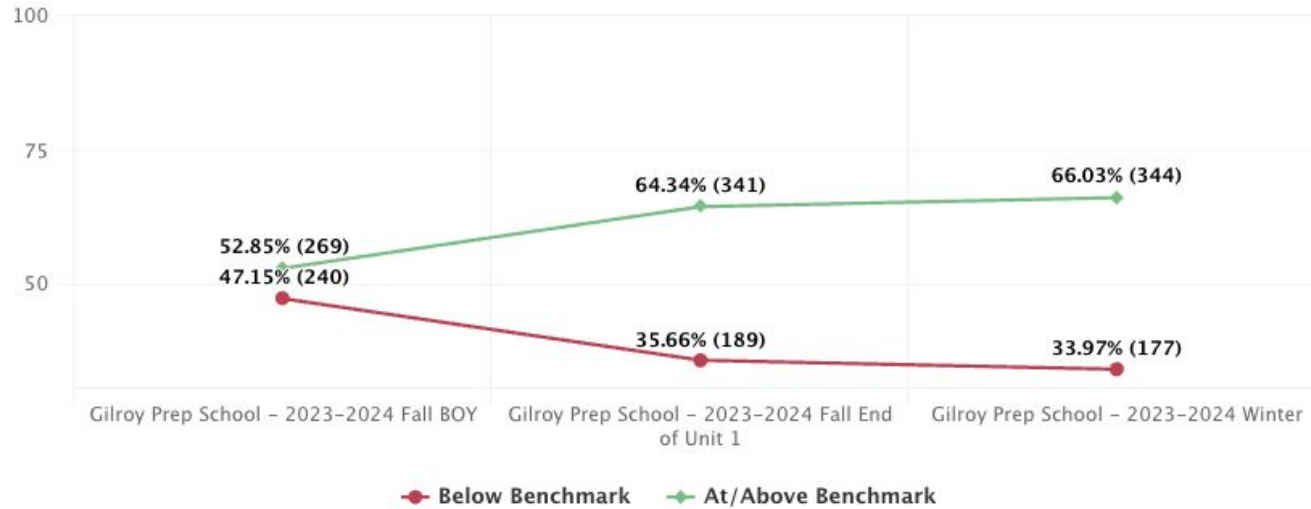

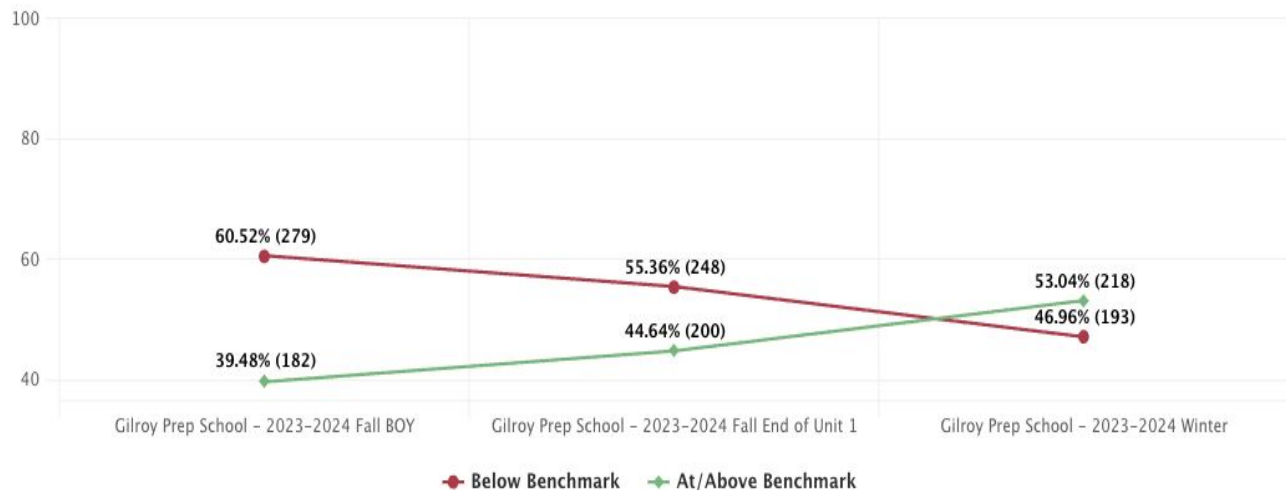

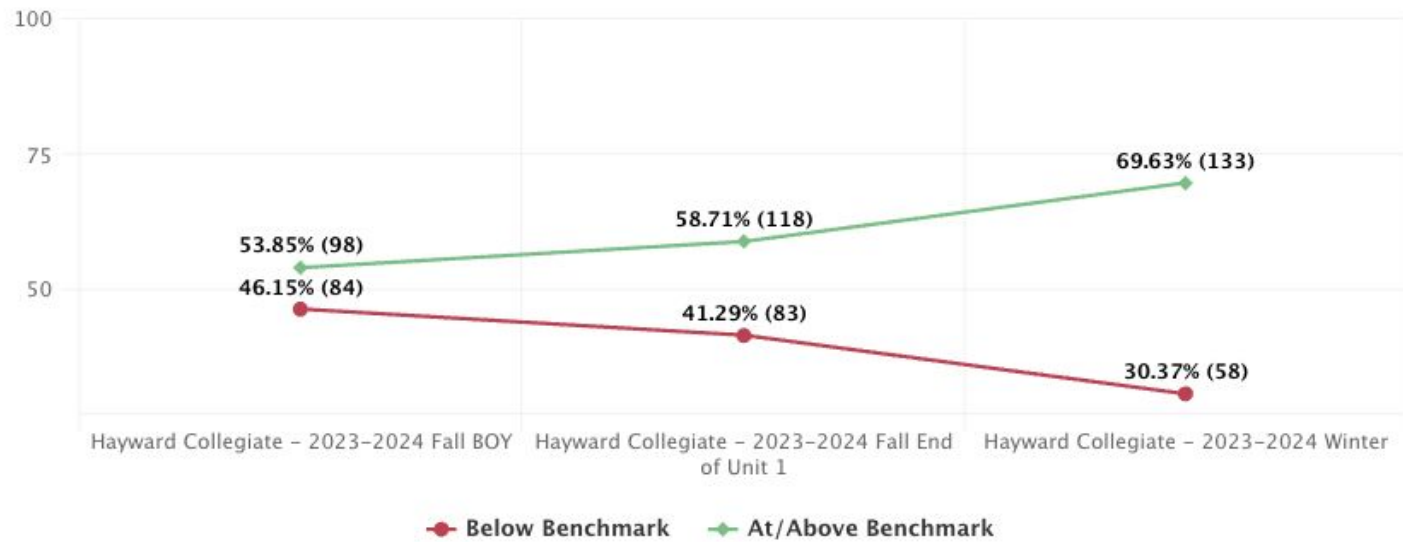

80%+ of scholars achieve a 3 or 4 on ELA and Math SBAC	N/A at this time	We will not have information until May 2024.
85% of scholars making growth goals on benchmark assessments for the year	53% met the growth goal in STAR ELA 60% met the growth goal on STAR Math	We're heartened to see that many scholars have already met their growth goals, and we spent the January 8th staff day focusing in on the data to address the needs of scholars who have not yet met their growth goals.
75% of scholars on grade level on benchmark assessments	74% of scholars are on grade level on STAR Math 51% on grade level on STAR ELA	We are so excited to be approaching our goal in math, thanks to a very targeted Unit 2 effort to strengthen math instruction (which included goal setting, targeted coaching, and professional development). We will now be doing the same thing for ELA in Unit 3. In Science, only 86% of 3rd-5th graders have taken the assessment; we're excited to see their progress now that we have some data to drive our instruction especially as 13% of scholars are within 10 percentile points of the goal.

Topic 2: Transitional Kindergarten



Navi TK Vision

Navigator Transitional Kindergarten is a developmentally appropriate program designed to be the first half of a two-year kindergarten sequence. Recognizing the diverse needs of the four year-old, TK students find a nurturing “second home” in their classroom. TK students have substantial periods for play and exploration, with an emphasis on thematic learning opportunities that promote self-regulation, social-emotional growth and language development. At the same time, Navigator teachers working with TKs bring our expected level of focus and intentionality, promoting students’ early literacy and numeracy development and preparing them for kindergarten at Navigator. Individualized curriculum is a central part of our instructional program at Navigator and we expect this would continue in our TK class. Our TK teachers continually reflect on the development of each individual as a whole child and refine their support and instruction.

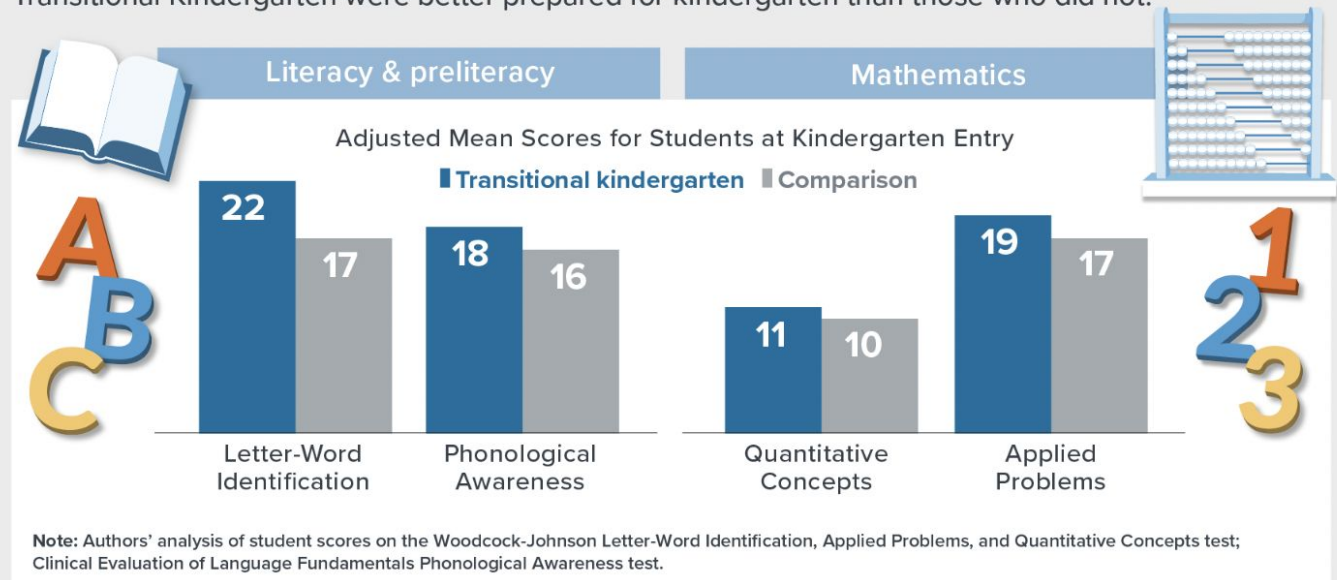
Why TK at Navigator?

- Statewide initiative - TK required to be offered to all four year olds by 2025-26
- Current programs at WPS and HC
- Research on improving school readiness

*The program shows an advantage for all students, with particular benefits for English learners and low-income students

Does Transitional Kindergarten Improve School Readiness?

A study of California's Transitional Kindergarten program found that students who attended Transitional Kindergarten were better prepared for kindergarten than those who did not.

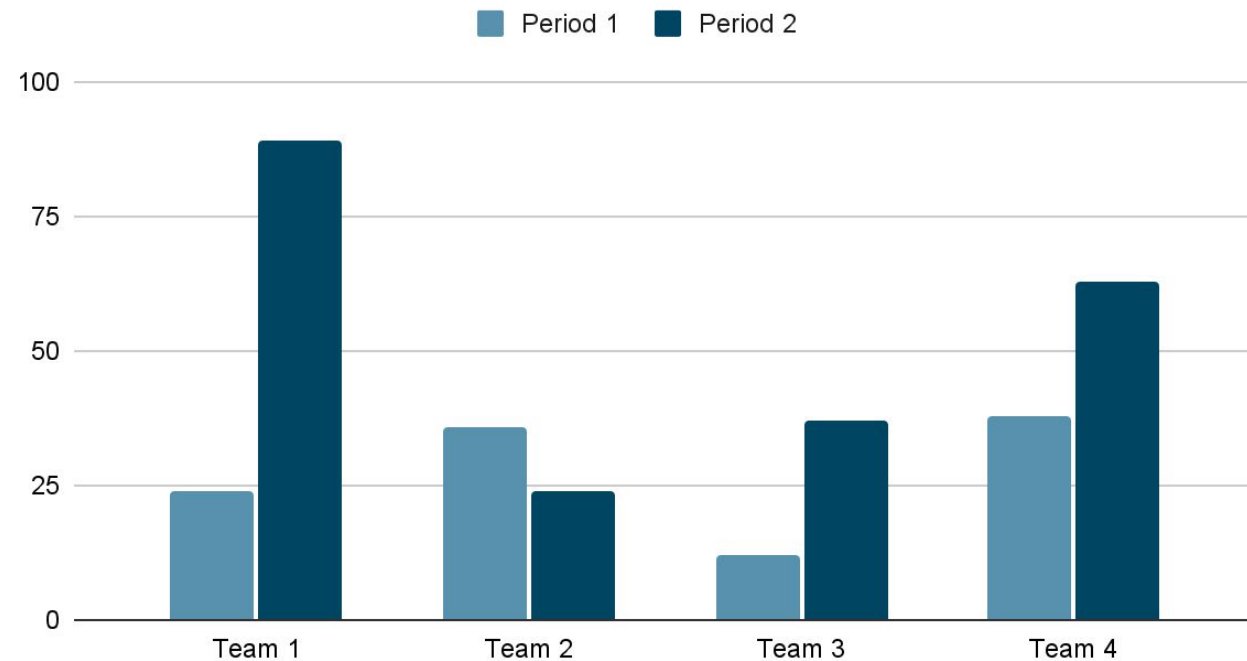

What: Navigator will be adopting a K-5 ELA curriculum to be piloted in Fall of 2024

Why:

- Better alignment to research-based best practices (we are implementing many of these best practices already and we have also identified some areas that need improvement)
- Ease of implementation: Amount of time it is currently taking many teachers to create/prepare materials
- Integrated supports for students who are English Learners

Curriculum Committee responsibilities:

1. Select a Pilot Option
2. Monitor Progress (Review implementation, gather feedback and data to assess effectiveness)
3. Address Challenges
4. Develop a Roll-Out Plan
5. Evaluate Impact
