


## **Overall Headline**




## **Overall Headline**

## **9th Bio Highlights**

**Teacher Headline:** Progress Made, **But Not Smart or Fast Enough**: Closing the Achievement Gap Requires Urgent, Comprehensive Action

**Break down:** Scholars can effectively <u>cite</u> <u>evidence</u> but struggle to connect it to their <u>claims</u> or craft <u>reasoning statements</u> that explain the link.

### **Teacher Strategies:**

- Costa/Rodriguez utilizing intervention blocks to target evidence-based writing (CER) and reteach gap standards.
- Implémenting weekly celebrations, homework "at-bats", and conducting student conferences to build engagement and accountability.
- Collaborating with the ELL Team to reinforce essential vocabulary acquisition and reading complex text.



### **HEADLINE**:

We are now in the danger zone - despite intervention being implemented - we did not see the progress we needed to see on IA2.

We need to increase the amount of independence and look at student work much more frequently.
