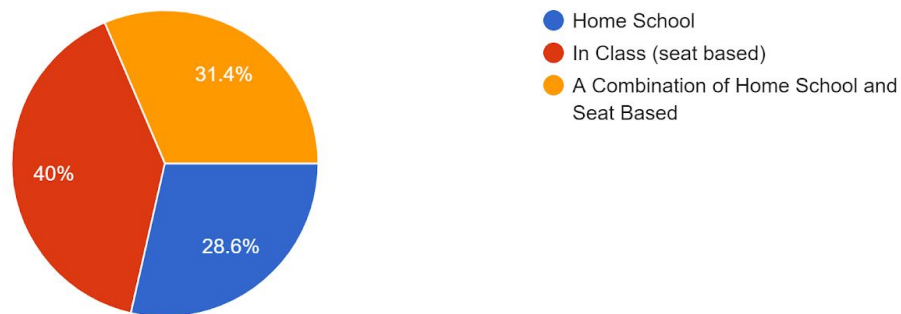


Parent Survey and School Plan 20-21

Based upon about 50% input from parents, our responses were as follows:

Given there is no vaccine for COVID 19 for the 20-21 school year; how would you like school to operate for you and your children next year?

Parent Comments:

- The vaccine is a terrifying thought in itself.
- Our teachers have been AMAZING and so helpful.
- Prefer remote learning with option to go back in class when things look optimistic.
- I am not opposed to some days distance learning, but it would have to make sense and not impact the children's education.
- Right now, we are not distance learning, we are crisis teaching. It isn't fun for them, they are only doing this to get by. That is not school. There is more to learning than just logging into a computer. At least for my children, due to their ages.
- Classes should be broken down into two groups so each class can have less kids. One group should have class in the morning from 8-12 and the other from 12-4. If some families prefer mornings or afternoons, maybe rotate each group after six months or week on and week off. If school is short, kids can have only one short break in between with no lunch. And maybe have regular homework if school has short days. That's an idea that I've been thinking about.
- As long as you just go on as normal
- In class is best - needs to be as safe as possible - but is so important for the kids
- "My child" [SIC] stops doing homework when she is home schooled. She also becomes unhappy and lonely at times.
- Parents who work will need careful consideration of how school should function.

- Please let "us" [SIC] come back lol miss you all
- The social distancing was to "flatten the curve" of how quickly we all get the virus. If we'd all gotten it at once, our hospital would have been overwhelmed. The goal was never to prevent us from getting it at all. The curve has flattened, our hospitals have had time to prepare, it's time we get this thing and get back to our lives.
- From comments that I have seen on social media, some parents hate having their children at home and having to help teach their children. Other parents love having their children home and comment on the child's feeling of well being and better behavior. So a combination of Home School and Seat Based teaching seems a logical decision. This would also aid in social distancing when it comes to seating arrangements in the classroom.
- I believe as more parents go back to work home school will become more complicated for the students. I know my daughter needs a lot of support to make the homeschool process successful. I am not able to stay home all of the time with her once I am allowed to go back to work. I believe that a couple days a week of seat-based school would help to keep her feeling connected and thriving. Some in person support from teachers is very valuable. I have noticed it is very easy for The students to say they are understanding the curriculum from behind a computer screen whether they are or not. I believe the shyer kids will end up falling behind. I may change my mind if covid-19 becomes more prevalent in this area.
- Things are so up in the air. At this point I am still hoping to work full time with two school-aged kids.

School Plan for 20-21 School Year

After receiving input from the teachers and parents, I would recommend the following for the 20-21 school year:

Given:

1. Follow local laws and directives and state directives.
2. Practice safe-distancing practices and social bubble protocol, in and out of the classroom.
3. Provide disinfecting and cleaning procedures as appropriate.

- Provide an experience as close to normal as possible for students.

- Provide 4 classrooms for a seat-based program. Student groups of no more than 12. (Total - 48 students). Grade groupings will be changed to accommodate families wanting seat-based. If there are more than 48 students wanting seat based, then decisions will be made to admit students based upon family interviews by the Director. If a decision cannot be reached, then a lottery system will be used.
- Provide an online or paper based home-school program for all other students not in seat based programs. All work to be completed and graded. One teacher to oversee home school programs under the jurisdiction of the classroom teacher. Classroom teacher will provide work assignments, but will receive assistance from the home school coordinator to grade, take attendance as needed, do administration etc. Additional duties will be assigned as needed.
- Provide an after school program, based on groups of 12, with playground sectioned off for groupings of 12
- Remove swings and block bars until clearance from County Health
- Provide lunches and arrange tables to allow for 12 students to eat lunch at tables while maintaining safe distancing. Lunches to be provided by FBUSD.
- Purchase Plexi-glass protective shields and PPE (masks for students and staff, and gloves for staff) to be used by teachers and students as necessary.
- Music program to be cancelled unless an adequate program is created following safe distancing protocol.
- Provide one-on-one support following county protocols. i.e. SPED, Reading, EL, remedial and tutoring.
- Teachers may provide a Homework Club program at their own discretion.
- Overall programs will be modified as government directives are issued.
