This week at a glance:

Morning Circle: Character Traits: Manners, math concept review looks at adding & subtracting on the numberline. Vocabulary review has Grade 1 reading, speaking and writing sight words and sentences and Grade 2 reading, speaking and writing vocabulary words from Reading A-Z.

ELA Centers: Choral reading books include *At the Movies* (Level F), *Blackbeard The Pirate* (Level H), *I Collect That!* (Level K) and *Ellis Island* (Level T). Students are working through the meaning of words in their vocabulary lesson. At the writing center we are working through Grade 1 Writing Skills Workbook 2 and Grade 2 Wacky Writing Prompts.

Math: First Grade students direct instruction this week is Unit 4, Module 1 looking at adding and subtracting on the numberline. Second grade students will be working with a partner on workplaces 3D Ten Triple Spin and 3E Target Twenty

Social Studies: We are finishing the unit called Cultural Literacy and starting Economics.
