  - iv. Signature acknowledgment form and Spanish version to be added.

    - iii. Purpose: Fundraising and strengthening School-Community ties.

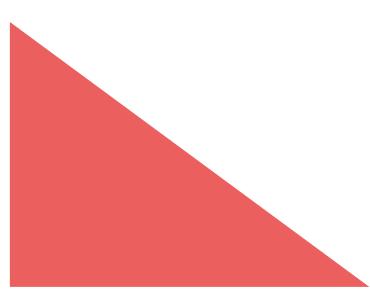

# Forecasting to end the year with strong cash, current balance = 182 Days Cash On Hand

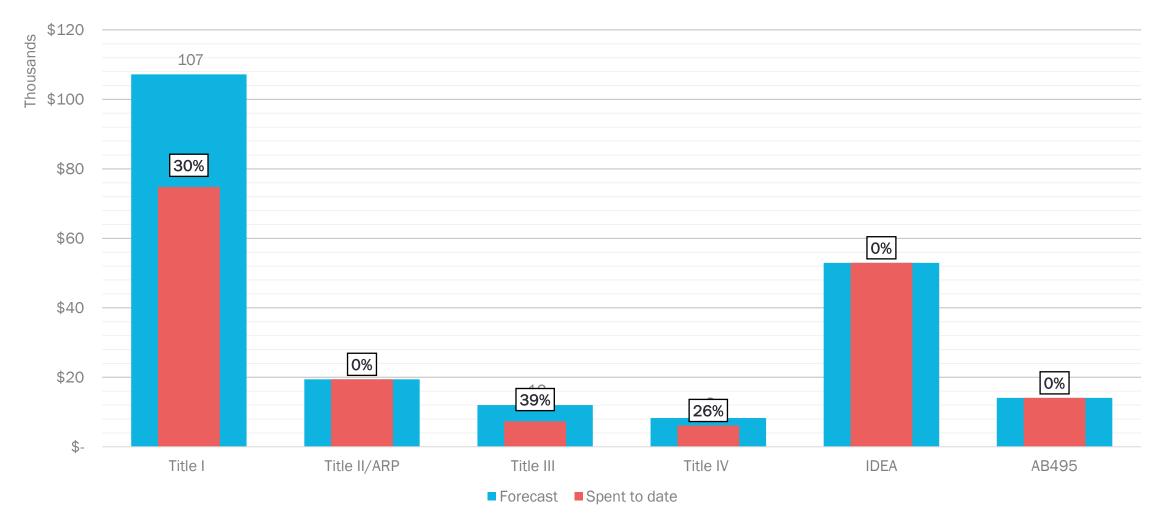

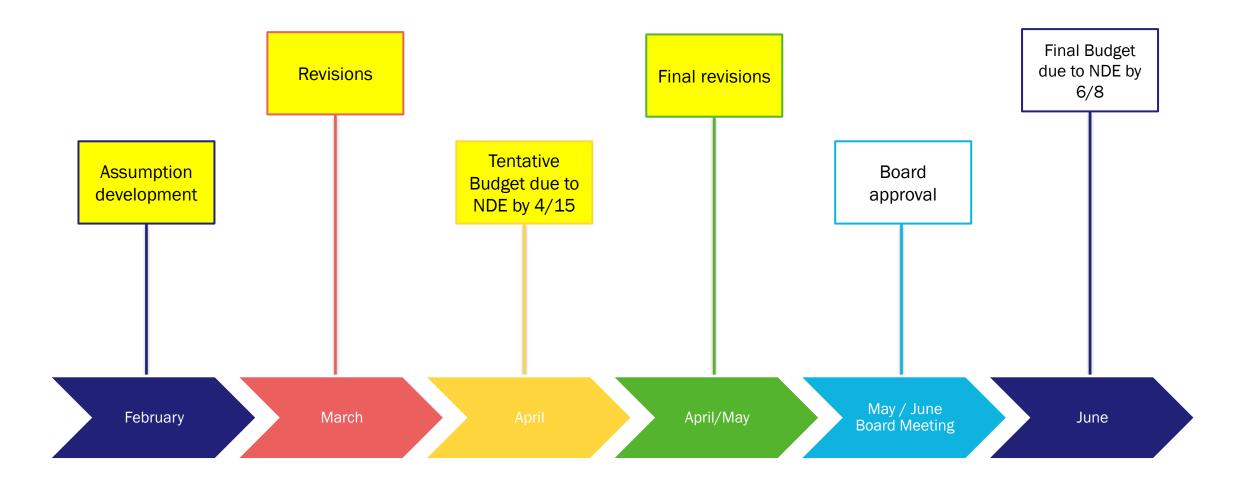

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# **2025–26 Final Budget: Revenue Assumptions**



### \$4.79 million in Total Revenue – sources outlined below

PCFP: \$2.86 million – 280 students (+70 over FY25), mostly Base Funding (\$9,416/ADE), also SPED, ELL, At-Risk Majority is unrestricted; Flat rates, pending State approvals

State SPED: \$107,000 - per PY SPED student, Flat rate

Federal Grants: \$105,000 – Title funding and Federal SPED

Only allowable expenditures, highly restricted

NSLP: \$266,000 – Federal food reimbursement

Helps offset cost of student food

**CLV Grant: \$1.45M** – per schedule confirmed with CLV

Reviewing expense reports helps the board monitor spending patterns, identify cost-saving opportunities, and assess financial efficiency.
- **6. Accounts Payable and Receivable Reports:** These reports provide insights into the organization's outstanding debts (accounts payable) and amounts owed to the organization (accounts receivable). Monitoring these reports helps ensure timely payments and proper management of cash flow.
- 7. **Grant and Fund Reports:** If the organization receives grants or donations, board members should review reports detailing the status of these funds. It includes the allocation, utilization, and compliance with any grant-specific requirements.
- **8. Audit Reports:** Annual financial audit reports conducted by independent auditors are essential for assessing the organization's financial accuracy and compliance. The board should thoroughly review these reports to ensure financial integrity and transparency.
- 9. Long-term Financial Plans: In addition to regular financial reports, board members should also review long-term financial plans that outline the organization's financial goals, strategies for growth, and contingencies for potential financial challenges.

1. Believe in and be an active advocate and ambassador for the values, mission, and vision of SSAES.

- 2. Provide my personal and professional resources to help SSAES realize its mission.
- Work with fellow board members to fulfill the obligations of board members.
- 4. Behave in ways that clearly contribute to the effective operations of the Board of Directors:
  - Focus on the good of the organization and group, not on a personal agenda;
  - Support board decisions once they are made;
  - Participate in an honest appraisal of one's own performance and that of the board;
  - Build awareness of vigilance towards governance matters rather than management.
- 5. Regularly attend board and committee meetings in accordance with the absenteeism policy. Prepare for these meetings by reviewing materials and bringing the materials to meetings. If unable to attend, notify the board or committee chair.
- 6. Be prepared to contribute approximately 6-8 hours per month toward board service which includes:
