The Chair is in charge of the meeting and will maintain order, set the time limits for the speakers and the subject matter, and will have the prerogative to remove any person who is disruptive of the Council meeting. The Scholar Leadership Council may place limitations on the total time to be devoted to each topic if it finds that the numbers of speakers would impede the Council's ability to conduct its business in a timely

manner. The Scholar Leadership Council may also allow for additional public comment and questions after reports and presentations if it deems necessary.

IV. Reports

A. Staff Report

Mr. Lewis led the Council in an overview of the Staff Report. He mentioned that Compass celebrated its 10th year anniversary last month from October 28th, 2011. Compass celebrates all month of October with a blog series every wed that focuses on scholars serving the community. Spirit Week and Red Ribbon Week were on the last week on Monday, October 25 through Friday, October 29. Compass also had a fundraiser at Panda Express on Thursday, October 28 (Compass's 10th-anniversary date) raising a total of \$259.81 to help support the two senior Compass scholarships: Loud and Proud and RisingFirbird Scholarship.

Compass will be promoting the scholarships in the Spring.

Mr. Lewis also mention a survey called Highlight to assess how scholars are experiencing conditions essential to achieving academic success for grades 3-12.

Mr. Lewis opened the floor for ideation to find ways on how to engage scholars on Highlight.

Mr. Lewis also mentioned Oscar De Jesus is the new Superintendent's Special Assistant. Mr. Oscar De Jesus is working on a special project called Jobs To Be Done Research Study.

Scholar contests and Spirit weeks will now be Co-facilitated by our SLC and the contests will be Co-facilitated by PAC.

Our current scholar count is 2,499 and we have room for 501 more scholars.
