Ms. Catina Hancock, the Vice President of Leadership and Learning at the Learner-Centered Collaborative, joined the Scholar Leadership Council meeting for a discussion on the scholar profile project and exercise. Mr. Lewis encouraged the council to reflect and discuss what scholars want to learn and add to their tool kit before they leave Compass.

Ms. Saurer mentioned she would like to add Community Service and "How respectful you are when communicating with others."

Ms. Effie mentioned: "I would love this! I think parents would appreciate this as well to see what type of learner their children are."

Ms. Effie mentioned: "I think one of the most important ones to influence is leadership - most of these all fall under that category. Leading with your own ideas, inspiring others, and setting an example. Including a slide like this during the ST homeroom meetings would be great! Sparking up a conversation for students to think about what type of learner they are."

Mr. Lewis mentioned Compass will be holding virtual information sessions and will also be attending marketing events next week on Saturday called San Diego County Home school Expo, The Great Homeschool Convention, and OC Imaginality recruiting additional perspective scholars. There was mention of the two Compass scholarships the Loud and Proud and Rising Firebird for graduating seniors that will be facilitated by PAC. The applications will be in the Monday Morning Update. Mr. Lewis shared the #ChooseCompass Google Form: https://forms.gle/Uwv18BHddLsRa2WT9 and encourages scholars to share their perspectives on why others should choose Compass as well.

Mr. Yee mentioned: "Some scholars don't check their google classroom where they joined for their club, so if there are 17 people in the classroom, only three shows up."

Ms. Saurer asked: "Would there be an option on the form to be contacted if you wish?"

Ms. Gordon mentioned: "I believe a email-wide update on what you have done based on the suggestion would be helpful with that, which would keep the anonymity."

Mr. Yee mentioned: "more time we have to discuss solutions, the better environment for scholars and LCS."

Mr. Yee mentioned: "The firebird report is only mentioned two times in the whole MMU."

Mr. Yee shared a concern on the Firebird Report and would like to see more relevance on it.

Mr. Yee. mentioned he would like to see confirmation for the suggestions given to the suggestions box.




How often do you attend Learning Labs?







How often do you attend your live Homeroom synchronous instructional sessions?








How likely are you and your chaperone to attend a virtual field trip on a weekend?

How likely are you and your chaperone to attend a virtual field trip on a weekday?








Field Trips






How often do you read the Monday Morning Update?








I believe that the Monday Morning Update is too long:








I believe the Monday Morning Update is valuable to me:








How often do you watch the Firebird Report (which started the week of November 15)?





I believe that the Firebird Report is valuable to me:








